## Pan Am Buys Stolen Tickets

NEW YORK (AP) - Pan American World Airways says it paid organized crime figures \$50,000 for stolen blank airline tickets, and that it was smart business to do so. An airline spokesman confirmed the unusual deal and said illicit sale of the easily negotiable flight tickets to passengers could have cost Pan American more than \$1 million. The spokesman said Pan American was contacted by underworld representatives who offered to sell 2,000 tickets stolen in 1973 back to the airline. "This was done with the knowledge of the law enforcement authorities, with their approval, and in league with them," he said.

## City Votes Utility Out

MASSENA, N.Y. (AP) - Residents of this northern New York town, upset over rising electric bills, have voted overwhelmingly to thraw out the giant utility that has provided their power for 74 years. The voters of this town of 16,000 approved a muncipal takeover of the power system, with final, unofficial results showing 3,636 in favor and 2,178 against - a margin of 63 to 37 per cent. Supporters of the takeover of the Niagara Mohawk Power Corp. facility hailed the vote as a victory for consumers in the fight against rising utility bills. The utility argued that the takeover's true cost would be about \$8.3 million. almost double what the town estimated.

The flags had been taken down by the city earlier in the day because a black council member objected to their display on city property. Mrs. Rawls vowed to stand guard over the Confederate

flags until dusk, but she retreated from the monument about midafternoen after meeting with city officials. Her flags were removed. The group to which Mrs. Rawls belongs contends the

Crime in Seminole County rose a staggering 72.2 per cent in 1973 while the state-wide increase was a comparatively modest 17.3 per cent according to a report compiled by the Florida Department of

Law Enforcement. Seminole Sheriff John Polk said he did not know of any specfic reason for the rise, but, "the lack of a death penalty may be one reason for the increase in murders and rapes." Violent crimes or mur-

Rural areas showed a 20 per cent increase in crime and a 9.2 per cent population jump over 1972. "Until we reach a point where we can be a preventive tool instead of a reactionary tool I think we will contunue to fall further



## Satellite Due Tests

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) - Scientists will spend the next month testing a \$180 million satellite that roared into orbit to begin the task of helping to educate and heal the world's people from far out in space.

National Aeronautics and Space Administration of ficials said the Applications Technology Satellite 6 settled into a stationary orbit 23,300 miles above the Galapagos Islands in the eastern Pacific a few hours after launch Thursday morning.

It is expected to go into operation about the first of July, at first beaming televised health and training programs to rural or isolated areas of Appalachia, the Rocky Mountains and Alaska.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Sen. John Ware of St. Petersburg has been chosen by fellow Republican state senators to lead them in the next two years. Ware, 42, defeated Sen. Ken Plante of Winter Park by a 7-6 vote at a Thursday caucus of Senate GOP members.

## Sex Crimes Bill OK'd

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - The House has approved and amended a Senate bill that would combine rape, sodomy, and other sex crimes into a new offense of sexual battery and provide degrees of penalties.

The bill was returned to the Senate where it was expected to win final legislative approval today. The bill creates three classes of sexual battery, depending on the age of the victim and the amount of force or coercion involved.

Sexual battery is defined as forced oral, anal or vaginal sexual penetration of an unwilling person by any object. Committing sexual battery with a person 10 years old or younger would be punishable by life in prison. An act involving a victim over 10 would be a first-degree felony when the victim is helpless, mentally defective, forced to submit by threat of violence or violence.

## Officials Plead Innocent

TAVARES, Fla. (AP) - Councilmen Raymond Walker, John Stalnaker and Marvin Boykin of nearby Mineola have pleaded innocent to charges of violating the overnment-in-thesunshine law. They face trial July 2 The trio entered pleas Thursday after being indicted Tuesday by the Lake County Grand Jury. They are charged with holding a secret meeting in mid-January to discuss the hiring of a police chief.

The councilmen also are scheduled to be arraigned June 18 on a charge of perjury before the grand jury when asked about the meeting. Lawyers for Mineola Mayor Jean Thrower, charged with violating standards and conduct for public officials, filed motions to dismiss the case.

## Tito President For Life

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP) - The Yugoslav Communist party Congress has unanimously named President Tito the party's president for life. The action was taken Thursday, and resolutions also were adopted to ensure political continuity in case of his death. Two weeks ago, the 82-year-old leader was reelected for life as head of state.

## **New Thai Cabinet Picked**

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP) - Premier Sanya Thammasak today named an interim all-civilian cabinet composed of relatively young men to replace the older cabinet that resigned last week. Foreign Minister Charoonphan Issarangkul and his deputy, Chartichai Choonhavan, retained their posts, and government spokesmen said this meant Thai foreign policy would not change. Sanya and his former cabinet quit May 22 after labor, student and press criticism directed at some cabinet members, but five days later Sanya agreed to take his job back and to form a new government.

### Vietnamese Talks End

SAIGON, South Vietnam (AP) - South Vietnam today denounced as "senseless" a set of demands by the North Vietnamese and Viet Cong that resulted in their quitting the Joint Military Team that is supposed to be trying to find more than 1,000 missing Americans.
