#### Watch out for internet scam

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office Intelligence Unit and the Economic Crimes Unit warms Internet users of a new identity theft

Potential victims will receive an email, which indi-cates that the person's Earthlink small account has been suspended. At first giance, the memage appears to look official. The email provides a hyperlink, which the user is asked to respond to and complete the requested information to reactivate their

The link brings them to a site, which asks a number of personal questions, including credit card information.

Instead of providing the information, contact Earthlink by telephone, which will confirm suspicions that the message is fraudulent.

According to representa-tives of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, in order to avoid being victimized, take a lew extra moments to confirm information. Also, don't provide personal information, such as a social occurity number and/or credit card information to solicitors without first validating the authenticity of the caller and their inten-

# Students stranded at bus stop

Seminole County parents say their students are waiting for school buses - that never arrive - to transport their children to area achools.

According to Darlene Campbell of Oviedo, her 16-year-old daughter, Mariam, is to be picked up at her bus stop inside the Sanctuary Subdivision in Oviedo at 6:42 a.m. each school day. However, bus No. 360 didn't arrive on Monday or

Tuesday to transport the Oviedo High School student to class. Campbell, who works the graveyard shift at the Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center of Sanford, took Mariam to school when she arrived home from work. This delay resulted in Marlam being late to school, missing her first two classes.

"I know I'm not the only

mother dealing with this," said Campbell, Tuesday morning. "The school won't care, they will mark the kids absent or late when it's not their fault the buses didn't show up."

According to Campbell, when she contacted Seminole County Public Transportation Schools Services on Monday, she was told the problem would be resolved. However, Mariam was left at her bus stop again Tuesday morn-

We have 36,000 kids we pick up," said Richard Wells, director of community involvement and public information, as well as inter-im director of transportation of the Seminole County Public Schools Transportation Services. We think we are doing a pretty good job. Especially if you consider we got 36,000 students home before 6 p.m.

Tim Robles of the Sanlard Fire Department said the unstable sufface pulled Gibson down until he was stuck waist deep. "We just can't pull him out because of the pressure pulling on him the other way," Robies said. "If we tried to do that, it could seriously injury him." Vacuum trucks were called to the scene to remove water and mud to assist with removing Gibson. About three hours into the incident, Robles said Gibson was doing well, "but anxious to get out." Gibson was pulled from the hole just as The Herzid went to press.

## Iraqi Diary: Dealing with thugs and stray cats

Editor's note: Stuff Sergeant Charlie C. Carlson III, son of Sanford Historian Charlie C. Carlson II, is currently deployed in Baghdad, Iraq as part of the 549th Military Police Company.

Carlson has provided a continuing journal of his experiences in Iraq, which the Herald will publish over the next several weeks.

May 19, 2003 I never thought I'd be a desk sergeant in Baghdad, but I was the first desk sergeant on duty when a complaint came in. I sent two teams and an interpreter out with the ITF. I then called Enforcer Base of the situation.

I'm working down in the middle of Baghdad in an old burned out police station. I have two MK-19s on the roof and concertina wire strung around the building, plus the win- a

dows are all sandbagged. The lieutenant here overnight other every day.

Today the ITF caught two looters stealing parts from an regime vehicle.

It is 0130 in the morning and is eerie dark outside the building with all the lights but he only "meows" in out in this part of the city. Arabic. He seems to be a My fear is getting killed by a sniper somewhere. There are plenty of places for someone to shoot from.

I have nothing to drink here but hot coffee or hot tea. No thirst quenching drinks and we did not get water rations today. Some days we get water and some days we don't. When we do, it is usually one bottle, 1.5 liters, at the most three bottles on a

good day. An Iraqi lady slipped me a note, actually she is from Egypt, but the note was in English asking for help because some thugs were threatening to blow up her house. I took care of her and turned the matter over to the Iraqi police.

I saw a cockroach the food and bed linen to sleep other night. I don't like that! I saw a cat outside the police station and have been trying to call him up for some food, friendly cat but like every living creature in this atrange place is fearful of

every thing.

I washed clothes today but you can never get them really clean. My socks are all stiff with dirt and hardened grime even after I washed

May 24, 2003 We sent two patrols with the IPF today. Me and another sergeant went into an Iraqi house and confiscated an AK-47, some rounds and pistois. Then we went across the street and found some more weapons.

Our main purpose was to find the guys and weapons responsible for shooting at neighboring houses. Didn't find the guys or the particular weapons, but we had a haul of several AK-47s.

I was bored today so I

took the shotgun and went out with one of the patrols to check a complaint made to the Iraqi police. Later in the day we caught two Baath Party members and confiscated two brand new AK-47s and 300 rounds of ammo. The weapons were Baath

Party issued weapons. Through an interpreter I talked with the two men. They were brothers and one said he was a carpenter and the other a truck driver. I further questioned them about how a carpenter and a driver would have two Baath Party Issued weapons. Then I got four names and addresses of Baath Party members, allegedly on the top ten list of the Iraqi Regime Baath Party. That makes my score three, first was General Rasool, now these two, plus a bag of terrorists documents. Now can I go home?

According to Wells, the transportation service takes extra precautions to ensure this doesn't happen. Litton said, despite the disagreement, the city and county "enjoy a good rela-tionship." Lake Mary dropped plans to annex Colonial Town Center. There are no plans to pursue the matter for now, Litton said.

the idea. "We looked at the details [of consolidation]," Litton said. "But, the numbers just didn't work out. The residents would have had to pay much more in taxes."

As for the proposed tax increase city commissioners will finalize in September, Greene said community response has been positive.

"The response to this point [from residents] has been 'Why?' " Greene said. "When we explain why, they understand and support what we're doing."

#### Board urges county to pick up employees insurance costs

The Seminole County Risk Management Executive Committee voted unani-mously Monday to recommend a 16.5 percent cost increase to the Board of County Commissioners for Seminole County employees' health insurance cover-

In order to provide employees with the same United Healthcare cuverage as seen in the current fiscal year, commissioners will need to approve the 16.5 percent increase in premiums during an Aug. 12 commission meeting.

If approved, this increase will relinquish the need for a benefit reduction for county personnel.

I'd like to stay with what [benefits] we have," said Commissioner Dick Van Der Weide, who, along with commissioners Grant Maloy and Carlton Henley, sits on the Risk Management Executive Committee. "I don't see how we can continue with the philosophy of charging more and giving less. I want all our employees to have adequate and affordable health insurance.

This plan, although better for the employee, will bring tive county's cost to an esti-mated \$13.1 million annually, based on current enrollment.

"We were able to get it funded during the budget work sessions," said Maloy. "If we were to reduce it now It would be hard to explain to employees. It would be a morale crusher. They would feel that the guys sitting up here had the money and still cut benefits.

"In the future we might

can't afford it when a large increase happens, but for now it is funded," he added.

During the budget session, commissioners allotted funds for an 18 percent increase, an estimated \$13.23 million. After negotiations to bring the costs down while still maintaining the current coverage was complete, the result was the 16.5 percent increase. This plan will show an estimated savings of \$126,750 to be reapplied elsewhere in the upcoming budget

If approved, this plan will not effect the monthly premium expense for employees enrolled in the HMO plan since the county covers 100 percent of this fee. It will, however, have an effect on the costs for employees enrolled in programs other than an HMO and employees' spouses and children, since the county pays only 50 percent of these plans, leaving the remainder for the employee to pay. These employee costs, based on current enrollment, will be an estimated \$3.5 million.

Under the proposed plan, the cost increase for dependents will range from \$26 to \$65, based on the number of dependents and which plan the employee is enrolled in.
The decision made today

was the right one," said Andria Herr, president of the Winter Park- based Allied Group Insurance Services, Inc., who represented the county in negotiations. "A lot of other municipalities in this area are not having such civil discussions about their health insurance."

According to County Manager J. Kevin Grace, this decision is in line with previous years, including a 14 percent increase last year

SEA TURTLE DECALS New manatee and sea turtle decals are available at tax collectors' offices all around the state. Each year, thousands of the popular decals go to individuals who donate at least \$5 to the manatee or sea turtle

protection programs. The decals provide an important source of funds for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (FWC) efforts to protect endangered and threatened

manatees and sea turtles. This is the 12th in a series of decals created to raise money for Save the Manatee Trust Fund and Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund. Donations support manatee and turtle research, rehabilitation and educational pro-grams. Decal campaigns usually bring in \$140,000 (combined manatee and turtle) and are vital for funding

recovery projects.

Kathleen Finch, a 13-year-old eighth-grade student, from West Palm Beach, created the artwork for the manatee decal. Her watercolor image of a swimming mother and calf manatee was one of 79 designs sent in by Florida middle school art students who entered the decal contest. The new manatee decal features Kathleen's artwork and the words, "The Manatee - A Florida Treasure," along with the FWC Resource Protection number 1 (888) 404-FWCC.

The endangered green sea turtle featured on the 2003 sea turtle decal is one of 343 turtles rescued from St. Joseph Bay during a cold-stun event in 2001. When ocean temperatures drop rapidly, sea turtles can become "stunned" by the cold water, and are unable to move. This green sea turtle was rehabilitated and returned to the ocean. The 2003 sea turtle decal is the FWC's way of saying "thank you" to the 15 statepermitted sea turtle rehabiltation facilities that treat hundreds of sick or injured sea turtles each year.

GENERATORS AFTER STORY APPEARS IN BOATU.S. MAGAZINE

In an effort to replace a potentially deadly exhaust part that may have con-tributed to at least eight deaths, Kohler has initiated a voluntary recall of all of its marine generator sets powered by L600 or L654 gasoline engines. Manufactured between 1950 and 1989, the generators include the following model numbers: 2R, 2A, 25R, 25A, 3.5R, 3.5A, 4R, 4A, 5R, 5A, 6.5R, 6.5A, 7.5R, and 7.5A.

"Kohler's recall announcement came just days after an article on Kohler's problems appeared in the July 2003 Issue of BoatU.S. Magazine, said BoatU.S. Founder and Chairman Richard

Schwartz. As highlighted in the article, court records indicate that hundreds of owners of boats equipped with older Kohler generators have been at risk of carbon monoxide poisoning due to an exhaust component that can deteriorate in the marine environment. Investigators found that the generator's exhaust tube, made of black iron, had deteriorated from the inside out. While the outer surface seemed intact, the tube was damaged badly enough to allow exhaust gases to escape into a boat's cabin. fronically, initial design specifications called for a brass exhaust tube, costing \$8 more than its black counterpart.

"After multiple successful lawsuits and evidence that Kohler was aware of the risks involved, this recall will address many of the remaining hazards and protect lives, said Caroline Ajootian, director of the BoatU.S. Consumer Protection Bureau who wrote the article for BoatU.S. Magazine.

"This repair is not something for a do-it-yourselfer. it's in an area that's difficult to reach and inspect. Let Kohler assume full responsibility for the fix," says Ajoutian. Boat owners having one of these Kohler models should not make any assumptions as whether the part has been replaced, but should immediately contact an authorized Kohler dealer or call Kohler at 866-866-4933 (outside the U.S. call 920-803-4986). 
