

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) - A prosecutor, challenging Patricia Hearst's credibility as an informer, says the secret bank robbery story she told authorities was motivated by loyalty to her underground lover. Steven Soliah.

100 Persons Killed In Beirut Fighting

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — The new truce supervision committee said today that Palestinian troops would form a buffer force between Beirut's warring Moslem and Christian street fighters, but meanwhile the fighting raged without letup.

Police said about 100 persons were killed and 100 wounded by mortar and rocket fire during the night. One of those killed was the 16-year-old grandson of Pierre Gemayel, whose rightwing Phalange party has the largest Christian militia in the year-old civil war. Police also reported that more than 150 persons were idnaped but that most were released after a short time





Compensation Opposed

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Marion Daniels, a 25-year-old college student who spent seven years in retardation centers, deserves no compensation from the state, a House report says.

In those early days the mails were seen as a Switzerland, took the British to task in a recent vital and necessary channel of communications. for commerce, for government, and for public information and education.

Despite the electronic media, written communication remains vital to our way of life today. Much of such communication depends upon the daily mails. It is likely to do so for the indefinite

Are we unable to afford the kind of postal service the colonists set up in the early days of the struggling nation, even before it was a nation?

The Postal Reorganization Act of 1970 was intended to bring business management to the committed murder - were executed in Madrid. Postal Service. It has succeeded admirably in then the British ambassador was recalled and modernizing many aspects of the service.

But carried to an extreme, the concept of an independent postal service now threatens to destroy service on which Americans have depended for more than 200 years. A vicious cycle is in prospect - higher postal rates, shrinking mail volume, continuing cutbacks in service and lavoffs

This is not what Congress had in mind in 1970. Congress should act now to save the Postal Service before it is too late.

Pipeline Dry

Congress last month took the first step to reopening the tap that controls the flow of federal funds to the campaigns of presidential candidates. Both houses voted to revamp the Federal Election Commission by providing that commissioners be named by the President as decreed by the Supreme Court.

But the cutoff of public funding that began March 22, the court's deadline for reestablishing commission authority. emains in effect until Congress can reconcile itself to the Supreme Court's concern over FEC independence.

And the House indicated in its votes on the issue that it is not only reluctant to give up congressional control over the commission, but is intent on grabbing more. Members voted recently to retain veto power over commission regulations and to assume, in addition, a veto over "advisory opinion."



Commission (FCC) has made a major concession to the Citizens Band radio industry in the form of instant temporary operating permits for new CB radio operators.

The new instant permits came on the heels of a storm of protest when the FCC issued an instant temporary permit to Mrs. Betty Ford just before the Wisconsin primary election while literally hundreds of thousands of applicants had waited weeks to obtain a response to their own ap-

Until now, a long wait was expected by the would-be CBer between the time he applied for sometimes as long as three months which was just long enough for the warranty to expire on some new radios before the operators could even go on the air legally to test

With the instant permit, the new CBer can operate his set immediately providing he fills out and mails his application for a permanent license before using the temporary permit. The only hitch thus far has been the unavailability of the new temporary permit forms. A spokesman for the Tampa regional office of the FCC said yesterday that the forms are being distributed to dealers in
