Sen. Ed Gurney's troubles continue to mount, and we can't help but feel that many of them were brought upon the Winter Park Republican by none other than himself.

The most recent bad news emanating from Florida's senior senator's office stems from what could have been a most effective assignment-working with the Watergate Committee.

Now, we are told that Gurney has missed the last eight straight public Watergate Committee sessions, ostensibly because (according to a Gurney spokesman) the senator was "too busy with other Senate duties."

Further, we have learned that on several occasions Gurney was the only Watergate Committee member available to swear in witnesses, and that he refused to do so, even though he was sitting in his office, which is close to the interrogation room.

Gurney, through a spokesman, says he won't relinquish his seat on the Watergate Committee. This seems ridiculous. If the senator is too busy to participate in what is surely the most significant political development in this nation's history, he should step aside.

(First of Two Related Columns) Secretary of Defense James R. Schlesinger is a genuine intellectual who would rather argue the fine points of government and leadership and what makes a great power act

He will spend an hour discussing philosophically the right (and duty) of a Cabinet official to have a limousine or other symbol of office (and he will quote you verbatim the commoner Cromwell of England on this matter). And he will spend even longer periods discussing what he believes to be the attitudes of men in the Kremlin, making certain his listener understands that neither he nor anyone else in

this government really knows. Because of his obviously high standing in this administration, made clear by the series of high posts he has held - the number one man in Atomic Energy, head of the Central Intelligence Agency and now secretary of Defense - it is worth listening to his private views on detente with the Soviet Union, a concept much challenged these days. In Schlesinger's mind, detente is a seriously important but limited concept. It means merely that we do not view every Russian action with hysteria, and over react. It

means that Russia's rulers likewise give up paranoid reac-

tions to American moves. Instead, we study each Russian action intellectually and objectively to see just how it affects U.S. interests and security. That study must be done

In this, the Russians are conservative in that they are taking no undue chances.

Detente in the Schlesinger sense, therefore, does not necessarily make possible a reduction in arms. It may mean an increase in defenses or even a step up in the arms race. Proof Now Required

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)motorists will be required to show proof of insurance to have their cars pass inspections.

"If they don't, we're going to have to send them back to get it," said Sgt. Billy Smith, Florida Highway Patrol safety

The no-fault auto insurance law makes liability protection mandatory as of Jan. 1. No one knows how many Florida drivers will have to buy insurance but Smith said 14 per cent of all drivers involved in accidents are uninsured.

There's no penalty for failure to have insurance, as long as the car is not involved in an "Under Florida law, you

don't have to have insurance til you're involved in a wreck, but if you don't have it, they take away your tag and your driver's license," Smith Auto inspection stations will



Seminole Reports 44 Females Are

Seminole County detectives said today there are 44 missing females from the county and the Brevard County authorities are combing the missing persons files to see if the fourth body, which was found Thursday, is from Seminole.

Brevard authorities have indicated there may be a link bet-

ween their case and the Altamonte Springs dump murders, but

Seminole detectives have not yet gone to Brevard to compare "From October to today there have been 486 people reported missing in Seminole County. We have found all but 56 of these

people," Seminole Sheriff's detective E. J. Maloney said. The decomposing bodies of two young women were found in a dumping area in late August. One of the women was identified as Laura Lynn Harberts, 18, an Orlando hospital clerk; the other

Moloney said the Brevard Sheriff's department has the missing persons file from Seminole County. "All information on missing persons is sent nationwide over our teletype," Molone

"The Brevard authorities have not contacted me yet and don't expect they will. When a body is found it is no longer classed as a missing person and the case is turned over to a crime against persons detective," Moloney said.


