Former Chief Insists There Has Been No Increase In Safety, For American Fliers

U.S. Fliers Called **Best In The World**

Use Of DH Planes Is Criminal Neglect, Officer Declares

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24,-(AP)-Col. William Mitchell reiterated before his court martial today his charge that American aviators were flying in flaming coffins.

Resuming the witness stand for conclusion of his crossexamination at the hands of Maj. Allen Gullion, assistant trial judge advocate, the air officer insisted there had been no increase in safety for the flying men. Major Gullion developed by questioning the witness that the number of flying hours per fatlity for the fiscal year 1921 was 934, while for the fiscal year 1925, the number was 5,269.

"Doesn't this prove safety of flying has increased from 1921 to 1925, inclusive, about 550 per cent?" Major Gullion ask-
