A Boon To Hunters

Many of the difficulties confronting sportsmen and bird lovers in their efforts to preserve game arise out of the lack of regulation general enough to cover the whole

territories visited by migratory game.

Thus, although the United States and Canada have laws governing migratory waterfowl, many countries to the south of us, especially Mexico and the Central American nations, are without proper regulation.

In those lands the taking of game violates every principle of conservation. Not only are waterfowl allowed to be captured by every concaivable trap or snare, but they are permitted to be sold in public places and there is frequently quite a commerce carried on in game birds.

It is evident that much of the good which is done by providing providing arounds in formal and the providers.

At is evident that much of the good which is done by providing breeding grounds in Canada and the northern United States and the protection afforded young birds, is in part offset by the lack of regulation when these same birds migrate in the winter into Central and South Amer-

That this unfortunate condition may be remedied is seen in the recent ratification by the United States Senate of a plan laying the ground work for a chain of national parks preserving natural wonders and historic spots and protecting wild life in this and 16 other American republics.
