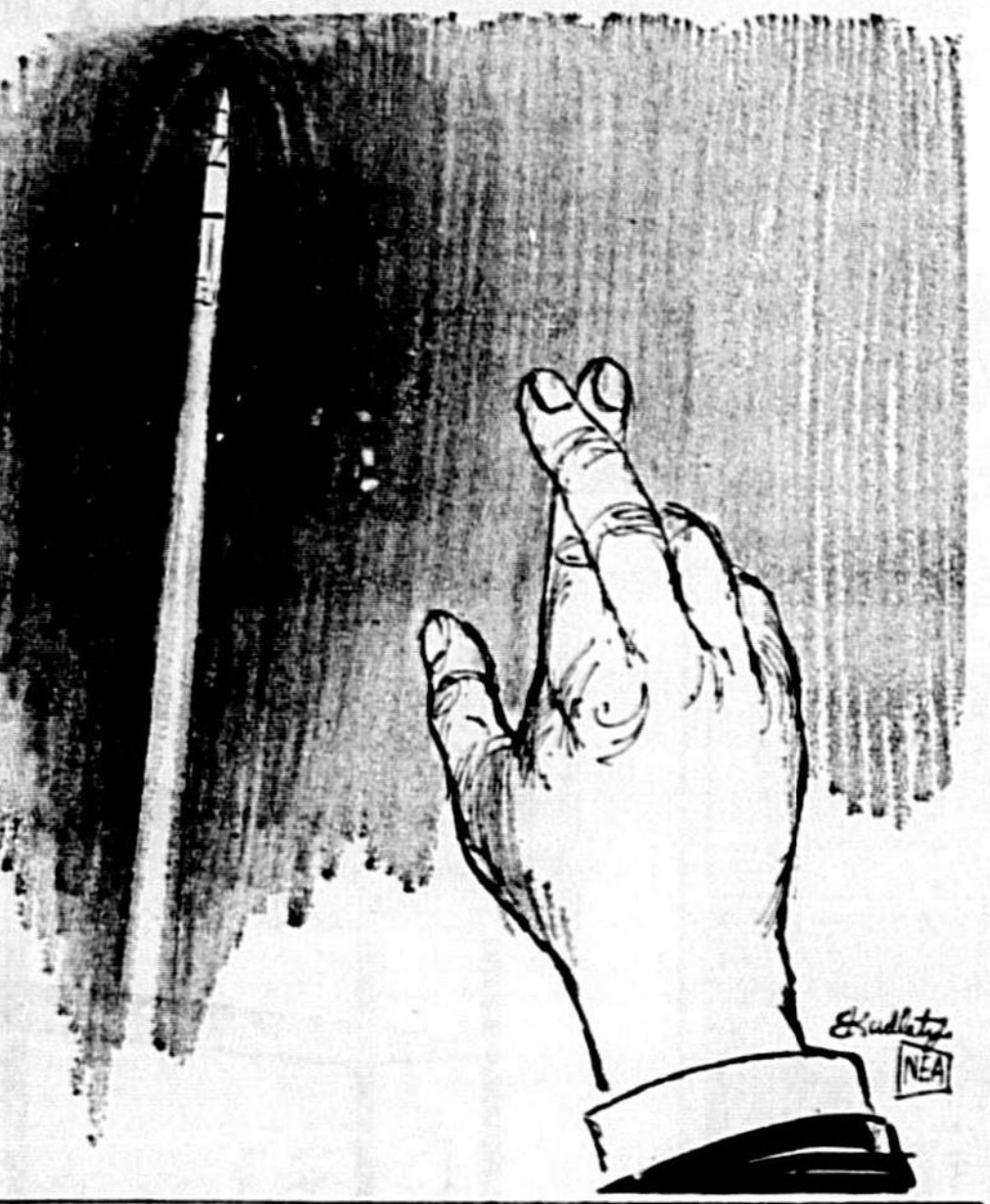
It is with the purpose of informing those who are interested and with the hope of making those interested who today are not, that we make these comments:

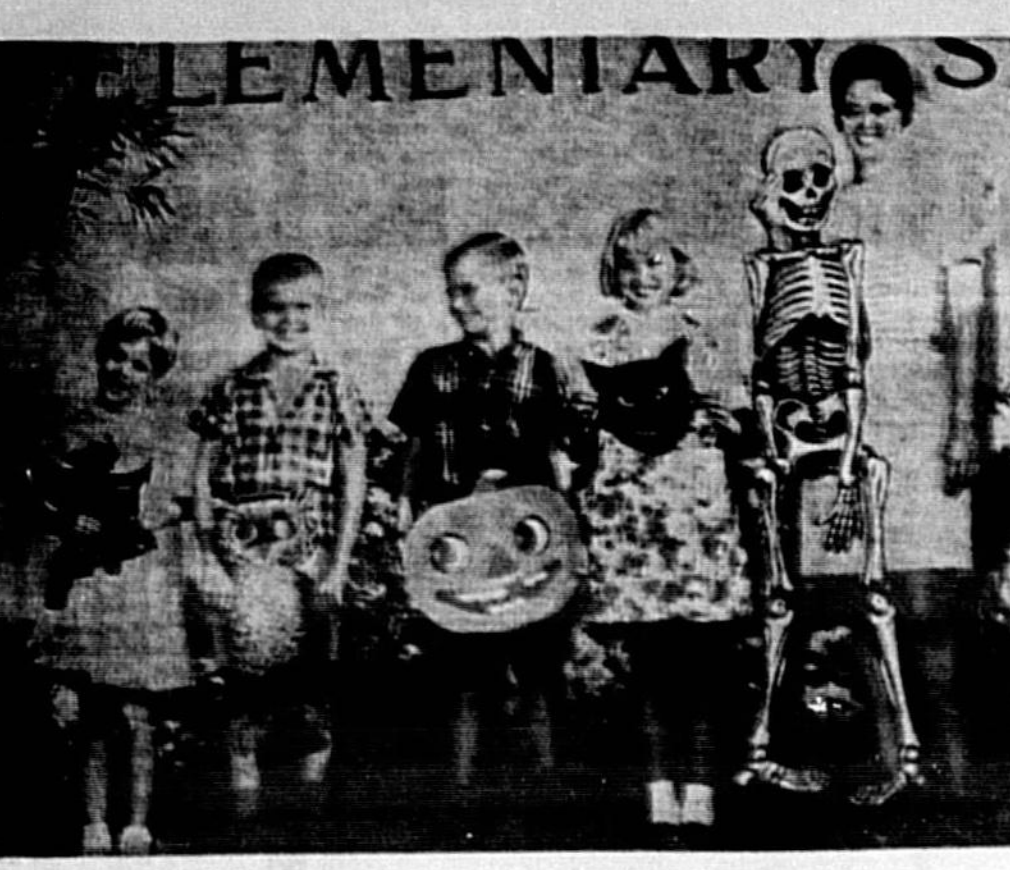

### City Costs Shown Low In Survey

A recent survey of 15 Florida cities by the City of Gainesville and including Sanford disclosed some interesting facts in comparative values and costs of providing municipal services.

According to the report as released by Sanford City Manager Warren E. Knowles, this city was lowest in total general fund budget which is the overall operating costs of providing city services at \$35.15. The range was from Sanford's low to a high of \$169.53 with an average of \$96.64. In utility costs, Sanford placed fifth from the lowest with an average of \$13.44 as compared to a high of \$24.49 to a low of \$7.11; average cost was \$16.30.

Police protection showed Sanford having lowest cost at \$5.97; high was \$23.84 with an average of \$16.90 per capita. Fire protection costs list Sanford to be third from lowest at \$7.73 per capita; lowest was \$4.96, highest \$19.79 average of \$11.72 was reported.

In recreational costs, Sanford was the lowest, but the results are inconclusive as it is now listing costs of parks, etc.

According to the report, Sanford was lowest in costs of refuse fees with a low of \$4.86; highest city reported \$18.11 with an average of \$9.16 per capita.

Library expenditures listed Sanford third from lowest with a range of 10 cents to a high of \$5.86; average is \$1.91 with Sanford at .97 cents per capita.

Cities used in comparison were listed as Bartow, Clearwater, Coral Gables, Daytona Beach, Fort Lauderdale, Fort Pierce, Jacksonville, Lakeland, Orlando, Ocala, Palatka, St. Augustine, West Palm Beach, Gainesville and Sanford.
