WASHINGTON, Aug. 23 .- Senator Fletcher, Democrat, Florida, Friday in a statement expressed his gratification over the refusal of North Carolina senate to ratify the proposed child labor constitutional arrendment. He said that the action of the state house of representatives in amending the state law to prohibit "gainful occupa-tion" by children under 14 years of ago shows North Carolina's "determination to free itself from accusations regarding the exploita-

"There has been so much misinformation and willful misstatement disseminated regarding the labor of minors that such error persists in the minds of many usually well informed persons regarding the subiect. The number of children under 14 employed in mechanical and manufacturing industries in the United States, according to the census of 1920 was 0,473 including part-time employment.
