SANFORD - From a fishing pier that had been the original bridge across the St. Johns. River, Gov. Jeb Bush signed into law Friday the funding for a 21st Century bridge he says will enhance the quality of life. for area residents.

Bush's statewide Mobility 2000 transportation plan for the next decade fast-tracks construction of a St. Johns. bridge and widening of the entrances on Interstate-4. The \$138 million St. Johns' project will begin next year instead of three years from now

Surrounded by Volusia and Seminole county officials and state representatives at Wayside Park, Bush thanked everyone who had worked in the bridge effort.

Too many people have spent too many hours stranded on the old bridge," he said. "When this bridge is completed, there will be more time for family — and a better quality of life."

Bush gave thanks to U.S. Representative John Mica, who he said had secured federal funding not only for the St. Johns bridge but for a number

of Florida transportation projects. Mica was unable to attend the signing ceremony at Wayside Park

We're here to celebrate a lot of hard work and good public policy," Bush said.

The purpose of the governor's \$6 billion Mobility 2000 Initiative is to give citizens easier daily commutes and for both residents and visitors to reach their destinations quicker and safer. In addition, businesses will be able to better serve their customers and people will have faster emergency

# City to discuss firemen's union

SANFORD — The Sanford City Commission on Monday will discuss a movement by the city's firefighters to form a

The move has drawn criticism from Mayor Larry Dale, who says a union would harm the relationship between the city and its firefighters.

The Sanford Professional Firefighters, Local 3996 applied to the city's Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC) for registration in May On May 31, a petition was delivered to the city requesting recognition. as the exclusive bargaining unit of the employees in the proposed unit.

The city has 20 days from receipt of the petition to

respond to the request. City Commissioner Whitey Eckstein said he was duap-the move to unumize when no firelighters have addressed the movement with the commis-

Eckstein said the city has been attempting to meet the needs of the fire department. through a new fire station. ambulance, fire truck, and ongoing attempts to improve salaries.

"It's their right to form a union," Eckstein said. "I'm just confused that they're not happy. We've tried to really help out. I didn't think we did anything wrong."

Commissioners Velma Williams and Brady Lessard both said they support the right of firefighters to form a union. Lessard, the liaison to the fire

# Report on public funding for hotel due by mid-July

SANFORD — City and county officials are working to meet a July deadline on a report that will give a clearer picture about the amount of public funding needed to complete a hotel and conference center in Sanford's Fort Mellon Park.

Sanford is requesting the

county contribute about \$4.5 million to the project, which would essentially cover the conference center's capital costs as estimated by the city's consul-

Seminole County officials retained Real Estate Research Consultants, Inc. of Orlando to review the feasibility study completed for Sanford.

In a draft report, the county's

consultant said capital costs for the conference center may be as high as \$175 per square foot, rather than \$105 per square foot estimated by the city's consultant. In that case, an investment of \$7.5 million would be required, not the \$4.5 million noted in the report to the city.

The Board of Seminole County Commissioners and the Sanford City Commission will

receive a report on the estimated public cost for the project in mid-July, when final versions of city and county cost estimates for the conference center are expected to be complete.

A special tax district has been established for the Sanford site. The county has also agreed to use tourist development revenue to help fund the project in

on a number for the public cost for the conference center," said Sanford City Manager Tony VanDerworp, "It won't hold up the project."

The city's consultant, Hunter Interests, Inc. of Baltimore, Md., estimates \$8.03 million in public funding will be needed to pay



# Sports celebrities A different set of rules

So Ray Lewis is not a murderer. What a relief for the National Football League - not to mention the management of the Baltimore Ravens football team.

After a Fulton County (Atlanta) prosecutor dropped a double-murder charge against Lewis last week, he pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor charge of obstruction of justice and testified against two of his

buddies. He will serve a year on probation. With that resolution, Lewis, a Ravens linebacker, was welcomed back onto the practice field.

No felony, no foul. How generous and forgiving life can be if you're successful in big-money athletics. The normal rules of civilized conduct do not apply to you. In exchange for salaries larger than the treasuries of some small countries, you get to choke your boss (or choke your player, if you're the boss), abuse illegal drugs without the prospect of prison, punch fans, mistreat women, malign your teammates of color (and anybody else who doesn't look like you) and generally flaunt your arrogance and contempt for people less wealthy and

Lewis didn't kill anybody — never threw a . . . . . . . punch, by some accounts - but he is no hero either. Indeed, he's not even given to basic compassion and decency. By his own admission, he fled a brawl that erupted outside an Atlanta bar suspecting that something terrible had happened. But he didn't pick up the phone and call for an ambulance. Concerned only that his career might be ruined, he warned his friends not to talk to police and subsequently lied to police

Of course, those offenses pale in comparison to the behavior of some athletes and coaches. Lewis is the perfect gentleman up against Knicks basketball player Latrell Sprewell, who choked his coach, and Indiana University coach Bobby Knight, who choked his player. The case against Lewis was never as disturbing as the case against former Charlotte Panthers receiver Rae Carruth, who has been charged with capital murder for allegedly plotting the drive-by shooting of his pregnant girlfriend.

Then there is the idiot John Rocker, who has tainted the reputation of a team heretofore remarkable for not only a string of championships but also generally good behavior off the field. Having been given a more-than-generous second chance to rejoin the Braves pitching staff after Sports Illustrated ran his ignorant rant about people of color, gays and foreigners, Rocker mistook the opportunity for redemption as a validation of his prejudices. He proceeded to threaten the reporter who wrote the story.

Even then, Rocker was not done making a fool of himself. Sent down to a minor league team last week (for poor pitching, the team said), he responded with the maturity of a spoiled 9-year-old, threatening to quit baseball. Rocker's sense of entitlement is such that he believes he is entitled to behave — or pitch — any way he pleases

Rocker's hubris may have been fed by the rousing — and troubling welcome he received from many white fans when he returned to the bullben after a short suspension. As early as spring training, he was getting standing ovations. Pans held up signs not only welcoming to return but also supporting his outrageous remarks.

Rocker's fan support may be of a slightly different nature since it crosses over into that most controversial area of American life -- race relations. Still, there is a more general lesson here: Money-hungry team owners and too-forgiving fans bear some responsibility for the rowdy conduct of all these misbehaving athletes. As long as jocks play well for the home team and their off-field misbehavior doesn't require prison time, they are greeted with enthusiastic support and big-money con-

It's no surprise, then, that they begin to believe that the standard rules of conduct do not apply to them. That's what they've been told,

Mistrust of government is an American tradition that predates Vietnam, of course. The writers of the Constitution were skeptical enough to include checks and

balances that prevented the government's exercise of arbitrary power. The turn of the century saw disillusionment from those exploited by corrupt political machines that ran our major cities and those victimized by a war with Spain fought for mostly fabricated

reasons. But the Vietnam years brought a new kind of distrust and disillusionment. It's difficult to separate the strands of Vietnam, Watergate, the growing impact of television news, nuclear proliferation and the baby boomers coming of age. We know, though, that something shifted in those years. Distrust turned to cynicism.

On an almost daily basis





during the latter years of Vietnam, our television sets and newspapers offered up evidence that what our leaders were telling us wasn't true. We saw pictures and heard stories from this war that we had not before — or since. Reporters had greater access and less censorship than in any American military operation, in large part because Vietnam was an undeclared war. Morley Safer showed American troops burning villages. We saw American soldiers confused, discouraged, bloodied, maimed — a jarring contrast to the optimistic spin from government officials. "People felt they were lied

to, especially after Tet (in 1968)," said CBS correspondent Richard Thrailkeld, who covered the war. "Tet showed the public that what they'd been told for the last three or four years had been hogwash. Victory was not around the corner.

Watergate reinforced the growing cynicism. Then there was Iran Contra. And Clinton's, sex scandal and impeachment. ("I did not have sex with that woman.") We discovered the government lied to us about Waco and Ruby Ridge. Secret documents have recently surfaced detailing the CIA's role in the 1953 military coup that overthrew Iranian prime minister Muhammad Mossadegh and installed the malleable Shah. We found out last year



and shake the foundation stone of nuclear non-proliferation." said Zhang Qiyue, "it will also directly trigger a new arms race, including an arms race in space.

China asserts that U.S. deployment of a missile defense system would violate the 1972 Anti-Hallistic Missile treaty and thereby foment global destabilization. A similar argument has been

made by Moscow, as reiterated by Russian president Vladimir l'utin during his recent summit meeting with Bill

But China was not a party to the 25 year old ABM treaty, so it. has no grounds to invoke it. And

while Russia has more standing than China, the fact is the treaty was between the United States and the Soviet Union, which no lunger appears on the Rand-McNally, having been consigned to the dustbin of history way back in 1991.

The ABM treaty is a relic of the Cold War era, predicated on the idea, correct at the time, that the United States and Soviet Union posed the greatest nuclear threat to each other.

So long as neither nation developed a defense against incoming missiles, the thinking went, the certainty of massive retaliation would deter either superpower from launching a first strike.

This doctrine, codified by the ABM treaty, was known as "mutually assured destruction." with the apt acronym MAD.

Today, the premise under past 18 months." which the ABM treaty was curceived is no longer operative.

The United States enjoys quite civil - if not altogether warm relations with the former Soviet republics, including Russia and Ukraine, which inherited most of the former superpower's nuclear arrenal.

The biggest threat of a nuclear strike against the United States or Russia comes not from each other, not even from China, but from a rogue state like North Korea or Iran or Iraq that might not be as circumspect about firing off an ICBM as long-time nuclear nations

Indeed, in congressional testimony back in February, Robert Walpole, a national intelligence officer for strategic and nuclear programs, told lawmakers that the "progress of countries toward acquiring longer-range ballistic missiles has been dramatically demonstrated over the

North Korea tested its Taepo Dong-1, which has the capability

of delivering a small biological or chemical weapon to the United States, Its Taepo Dong-2, which may be tested this year, can deliver a nuclear payload.

Iran tested its Shahab-3, a medium range ballistic missile that could enable it to strike Turkey. It is busily developing its next generation of missiles, the Shahab-4 and Shahab-5, which will enable Teheran to reach out and touch the United

Iraq has been impeded, somewhat, by United Nations controls imposed following the Persian Gulf War. Nevertheless, Teheran continues to develop missiles. According to Walpole, fraq could test ICBMs capable of delivering payloads of several hundred kilograms to the United States in the next five to 10

So how have Pyongyang, Highdad, Tehran and other Yankee-hating spots managed to technology enabling them to develop warheads that will, in the all-text-mear future, enable them to blackmail or even attack the United States?

With the knowing and willful assistance of Moscow and Beijing, which dare to accuse the United States of jeopardizing global security by proposing to move forward with a missile defense system.

The United States has a right, has a moral imperative, to protect its citizens from a rogue missile attack by a huntile nation.

The Russkies and the Communists may not like it. But it is their exports of nuclear and missile technology to client states like North Korea, fran and Iraq that require the United States to deploy a missile defense system as soon as possi-

What's clear is the government hasn't changed much it's been secretive, manipulative and brutally opportunistic for decades. But we have changed. We question authority, as the '60s bumpersticker said. We believe nothing. We look at government leaders today not as our parents did at FDR or Eisenhower or Kennedy. We see them as talking heads looking for votes in the same way that TV programs look for ratings: whatever sells.

When Vice President Al Gore supported the Gonzalez family's bid to keep Elian in the United States, few assumed he had taken that position based on conviction. The public automatically concluded he was angling for Florida's 25 electoral votes in the November presidential election.

Several weeks ago, John McCain, "Mr. Straight Talk," confessed that he really doesn't support the Confederate flag flying at the South Carolina capitol building. He said he was just trying to win votes in the primary. The confession was greefed, as McCain must have known it would be, with yawns. Of course he lied. He's a politician.

Our cynicism is a predictable response to the available data. So perhaps what's remarkable, having seen what we've seen these past 25 years, is that the cynicism hasn't slipped into nihilism. We still believe deeply in the architecture of American government. We believe in the ideals. We believe we ought to be wearing the white hats.

Therefore, though we are not surprised by even the most unseemly acts, we still find ourselves, at least now and then, disgusted and horrified, as with No Gun Ri and the Iranian coup.

Disgust and horror are good things. They show we still hold out hope, that we haven't thrown in the towel. I think about this when I hear people say that since the Vietnam War. Americans have no shared values anymore. I'd argue that's not true.

What is shared by both the right and the left, even the radical right and radical left, is a paradoxical American soul. It harbors, side by side, a cynical distrust of politicians and a genuine love of country.

I think we share something else, too. Though Americans from across the spectrum surely hold different definitions of leadership, we share the hope that someday the leaders will come along who'll live up to the core American ideals that, against the odds, still beat within us.

Yet I wonder, in our cynicism, would we recognize them when they appear?



Ray is also currently running for Seminole County Commission. He said he would probably drop out of the county commission race if he wins the city commission seat.

"I would have to decide at the time," Ray said, "Most likely, I would drop out?

If elected to the City Commission, Ray said he would not run for mayor in March

2001. However, he will run for mayor if he fails in his bids to win a seat on the Sanford or Seminole County commissions.

Ray is currently serving as Chair of the Citizens Advisory Board, and a member of the Nuisance Abatement Board, the Sanford Citizens Patrol, as wellas several Neighborhood Watch groups. He recently earned his GED high school diploma from Seminole Community College

Ray does not believe the City Commission is currently accessible enough. He favors either holding town hall meetings or regular City Commission sessions once a week. Currently, regular City Commission sessions are held twice every

"I feel that the commission now is not living up to being The Friendly City," Ray said. Ray is opposed to building a

hotel and conference center at Fort Mellon Park, Instead, Ray favors building such a facility along the Interstate-4 corridor.

As for development of the downtown area, Ray would encourage more "mom and pop stores" to open. He also said the downtown area needs more entertainment complexes and increased advertising

He is concerned that Sanford may be growing too fast. Ray wants to revise the city's land use and planned development goals to decrease the amount of agricultural property being zoned commercial or planned development. In addition, he favors hiring a full-time City Engineer to save on contracting

Ray is opposed to controversial Zoning Ordinance 3502, passed in February, which bans pawnshops, bail-bond businesses and certain community resource facilities from being wittan 1,500 feet of each other. It also keeps pawnshops and bailbond businesses at least 300 feet

from residential areas 'I'd like to see it abolished, or

at least revised" Ray said. "It hurts the small business person and non-profit agencies.

A member of the Seminole **Volunteer Enterprises Board of** Directors, Ray said he has been holding discussions with local businesses to allow parking for patrons of the non-profit agency's proposed soup kitchen.

Seven residents of the downtown historic district have sued the city of Sanford over a parking variance approved by the City Commission which would have allowed the soup kitchen to operate.

I would allow the soup kitchen to operate because I don't think parking is a problem over there," Ray said. "Local businesses are willing to let peo-

ple park on their property." Meanwhile, Ray wants the city to hold discussions with Seminole County to encourage other cities to take on the burden of county-wide social service programs.

"But, I don't think we have the right to deny the needs of poor people," Ray said.



# The return of Dr. Mergatroyd

**DEAR DR. GOTT: In some** of your previous columns, you used to explore the frontiers of medicine, using your fictitious "hero," Ethan Mergatroyd, I really miss him. How about a redux?

**DEAR READER: OK, here** 

Dr. Ethan Mergatroyd had been having headaches of late - tension headaches, he presumed, because he was bothered by a great deal in his narrow world. He was especially upset by his conviction that doctors were misperceived by the public as being callow and materialistic. He was convinced that the profession was being unfairly stereotyped as full of over-privileged and nonchalant practitioners.

Deep in his marrow, he believed that the problems facing the medical profession were beyond his - and other doctors' - control Patients' unrealistic expectations about quality care, an increasingly aging population that demanded more of that care, and the general infatuation with prepaid health plans and health-maintenance organizations. In Dr. Mergatroyd's view, these issues should be decided by by by someone in authority.

It just wasn't fair that he was prevented from keeping the luminous promises he had made to himself when, as a resident receiving a paltry stipend. he had pledged to enjoy the Good Life, one in which he



# Personal digital assistants growing in popularity

Descendants of organizers and calculators, personal digi-tal assistants (PDAs) like the Palm or the Psion are actually miniature computers. Some can record your voice, play videos or hold the full text of a novel. But their real value comes from their ability to store and retrieve thousands of phone numbers, calendar entries, todo lists and short notes.

Virtually all PDAs can retrieve data from a desktop computer. And all can send and receive e-mail, either through the desktop computer or their own modern. The newest application for PDAs, expected to come into widespread use in the next couple of years, is direct, wireless Internet access.

There are two basic styles of PDAs: screen-based, typified by the market leading Palm. units, and keyboard based There are also three operating systems: Palm O5, used exclusively on screen based units,



Windows CE, used on screenbased and keyboard-based units; and Epoc, used exclusively on Psion keyboard-based

PDAs are designed to allow information to be exchanged — "synchronized," in PDA lingo with a desktop computer. Pressing one button activates the synchronization, letting you transfer data back and forth. Most PDAs can synchronize with a variety of e-mail software and at least one type of personal information management application, word-processing program and spreadsheet. Units that use Windows CE support Microsoft Office and Microsoft Outlook - period. Those PDAs need thirdparty software to synchronize with anything else

PDAs come with 2 to 32 megabytes (MB) of memory. Even the smallest amount should be more than enough for most.

We tested all the leading brands and styles of PDAs available in early 2000. Here's some of what we found.

Palm OS. Palm units and the Handspring Visor clones (equipped with software for both Windows and Macintosh) are small, fast and very simple to use. You can use a penlike. stylus to tap an onscreen keyboard or to enter data by writing in a shorthand called Graffiti. Some newer models feature wireless Internet access or the potential to add functions, such as an MP3 music player or pager. I'alm O5 models can accept a welter of specialized software. For lists, goto www.palm.com.or.

- Windows CE. The new version of Windows CE, known as Pocket PC, is an improvement over its predecessor. All Pocket PCs now come with an MP3 player, Pocket Excel and Word, and Microsoft Reader, a program that lets you read electronic books. Battery life. remains a weak spot because of the color display. To find Windows CE software, go to http://pda.tucows.com/wince

Keyboard-based. These are most useful if you need to do light typing, such as writing e-mails. Most of them are targer than screen-based models too big for a pocket - yet their size accommodates Windows CE better than screen-based PDAs. The biggest drawback to the Windows CE models is their meager battery life only a week or two at 30 minutes use per day.

If you need just a small, sim-

model such as the Palm IIIe (\$150). Basic but versatile, it's probably the best choice for

most people. For a built-in Mac connection, the screen-based Handspring Visor (\$180) or the larger-memory Visor Deluxe (\$250) which use the Palm operating system, are good choices. Palm models and keyboard-based Psions can also talk to Macs, but require extrasoftware.

For handling lots of data on the go, we favor the keyboard based Psion 5mx (\$525) and the Psion Revo (\$400). They synchronize with most major software and e-mail applications. The HP formada (\$800) and the Sharp Mobilon (\$650) keyboard-based models each have a fax modem, but their overall performance in our tests was



These included past master of Sunford Lodge no. 26, FA&M. past high priest of Monroe chapter 15, Associate Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter of the Florida Order of Easter Star. and a royal arch mason. He was also a member of Pi-Gamma Mu and Kappa Delta Pi fratemities

McKay also organized the Seminole Chapter of Deolay soon after he moved to Sanford and since then served continuously as its advisor.

At present he resided at 1908 Sanford Ave. with his wife, Katherine, and daughter Florence

A.D. Smalley

A.D. Samlley came to Sanford April 5, 1932 to begin his duties as manager of Sanford's J.G. McCrory store. This was one of the busiest

establishments in the city and Smalley was praised for being a highly regarded member of the McCrory firm. He had become associated with that establishment in 1927. Before that, he had served an apprenticeship in his father's general mercantile store in Georgia.

Born in Lincolnton, Ga. Smalley graduated from Lincolnton High School. He was also a graduate of Young Harris College.

Even though his business found him confined in his store for many hours each day, he was still able to maintain a keen interest in fishing and golf.

Smalley lived at the Monteguma Hotel with his wife. Both were members of the Sanford Country Club and First Methodist Church

#### Tom Brotherson

After completion of his studies in Sanford schools, Tom A. Brotherson entered the grocery business as a clerk and followed that vocation for seven years. He then began working for W.C. Hill and at present was vice president of Hill Lumber Company

Brotherson was interested in the organizations pertaining to his line of work and was at present a district director of the Florida Lumber and Millwork Assestation

He was an active member of First Baptist Church where he was a trustee and general secretary of the Sunday School.

He resided at 2205 Palmetto Ave, with his wife, the former Mary Stanley, His parents, Thomas A. Brotherson and Loretta Tolar Brotherson, were long time Sanford residents.

#### James Moughton

James Moughton, superintendent of Sanford's streets. came to this city in 1909 from Sharon, Pa. He first tried his hand at farming and also worked for the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad, but went to work for the city of Sanford in 1922. He was appointed Superintendent of Streets in

Born on the Isle of Man. Moughton came to Cleveland, Pa in 1887. He had also lived in Sharon, Pa, where he had worked for the Sharon Steele Company.

He was a member of all branches of Masonry. He was past master of the Sanford Masonic Lodge, past high priest of the Monroe Chapter. past commander of the Taylor Commandery and a member of the advisory board for the order of DeMolay. He was also a member of First Presbyterian Church

Moughton's wife was Hazel Brockway before their marriage. They had three children Elton L. Leslie and Mrs. Ralph Chapman, all of Sanford. The Moughtons lived at 1021 Union Ave (now East Second Street)

Moughton liked to read and his favorite sport was baseball. He was interested in the Sanford Municipal Zoo which had become one of the most successful of Sanford's many attractions.

#### H.J. Lehman



# Seminole, Volusia cooperate on unsolved murder

Seminole and Volusia County investigators are working to solve a 10 year old murder case.

Investigators are using a clay reconstruction of the skull of a woman whose remains were found in a wooded area near Ormond Beach in 1990. They hope the clay model will be the best likeness yet of the woman. whose identity remains a mys-

Anne Coy, a forensic artist. and crime scene technician with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, recently spent a week reconstructing the victim's shull and applying a clay extenor to give the victim life-like hair and facial features.

The work that went into the reconstruction was incredibly detailed and meticulous," said. investigator Donna Davis of the Voluma County Sheriff's Office, the lead investigator. This is probably the best chance we've had in some time to identify the victim."

Officials hope the likeness will jug someone's memory and help identify the victim.

We would love to be able to put a name to this face and bring some closure to this case. Davis said. "She's been dead for 10 years, and the last thing we can do for this victim is find her

The victim's skeletal remains were discovered April 23, 1990 in a wooded area east of Clyde Morris Boulevard, along a path leading to Avenue D in the Daytona Pines subdivision. The death has been ruled a homi-

The victim was killed about three to eight weeks before the skeleton was discovered. according to an examination of the remains by a forensic anthropologist.

Based on the examination, the victim is believed to be a white woman who would have been in her early 30s in 1990, although she may have been between the ages of 25 and 40 at the time of death.

She was about 5-foot-4, with a medium build and light brown hair that investigators believe may have been tied into two pig tails with red bands. The examination revealed she may have given birth to one or more children during her life-

Information about the skeletal and dental remains have been compared with state and national missing persons reports, but so far have yielded no dues to the victim's identity. investigators said.

If the city objects to the approval of the petition, the employee organization can file for an election by a secret ballot, and PERC would order an election. It could take up to 60 days before an election is held, said for Denaro, the city's human resources director.

The employee organization has to be selected by a majority of the employees voting in an election. If the employee organi-

zation is elected, PERC will certify the employee organization as the exclusive collective bargaining representative of all employees in the unit.

No such election will be required if the city approved of the petition. After certification the bargaining begins collectively to determine wages, hours, and terms and conditions of employment, Denaro said.

David Frost, president of the union, said the firefighters are concerned about turnover, safer working conditions in regards to manpower, training and educational programs.

However, city officials have countered that the fire department does not have a problem with recruitment and retention of personnel.

A total of 42 firefighters could be represented by the union.

The city has two types of firefighters — Emergency Management Technicians (EMT) and paramedics.

The starting salary for EMTs is \$25,578 with incentives. The average EMT pay with incentives is \$29,076. For paramedics, the starting pay is \$30,151 with incentives. The average pay for paramedics is \$34,203 with

incentives.

Sanford is performing a study to determine how its firefighter pay compares to area cities with similar numbers of calls for assistance.

The Sanford Police Department is already represented by a union. However, no other group of city employees has formed a union.

"Investing in our transportation system in places like this is vital to Florida's economic prosperity," Bush said. "Our population has doubled since 1970 to more than 15 million today, and we expect it to grow to 20 million by 2020. Bush arrived at 11:30 a.m. to sign the Mobility 200 bill. He left shortly after noon in a silver Crown Victoria to make an appearance in Jacksonville, From there he would do business in Miami.

It was the governor's intention during his Sanford stop to emphasize the cooperation from each of the municipalities in the area. He had just enough time for a quick chat with Sanford Mayor Larry Dale and Lake Mary Mayor David Mealor.

Seminole County Chairman Carlton Henley and commissioners Randy Morris and Daryl McLain also visited with Bush. Morris and McLain have been major players in local transportation issues for a number of years. Morris was chairman of MetroPlan.

"These officials have led you down the right path," Bush said. "Not only will these projects be completed, but they'll be completed without raising state or local taxes."

Mobility 2000, he said, allows many projects originally planned over the next 20 years to be built anywhere from one to 10 years sooner. In addition to the St. Johns River project, there is a plan to six-lane sections of 1-95 from Daytona Beach to the Georgia state line.

# Sanford unveils 5-year plan to improve sidewalks

SANFORD — Sanford is planning a five-year sidewalk rehabilitation program to smooth out dangerous cracks and crevices.

The program will come before the Sanford City Commission for final approval on Monday. Local option gas tax revenue and general funds will pay for the program.

will pay for the program.

"The big problem we have is with Oak tress that have cracked the sidewalks," said City Commissioner Whitey Eckstein. "Many of our sidewalks have become uneven, and people can trip. Those that are most dangerous have to be taken care of first."

The city has \$75,000 in funding to repair the most dangerous sidewalks this summer. The first full year of the program would begin in October, with the start of the next fiscal

Sidewalks have been prioritized by overall condition ranking with the worst ones to be repaired first. Ranking was compiled from the inventory and condition survey of sidewalks that was done by Infrastructure Management Services, Inc.

Cost estimates are based on current Seminole County prices of \$31 per square yard. The city is looking into securing lower pricing. Some sidewalks will only require partial replacement.

Each plan year has a \$350,000 cost estimate with actual expenses expected to be about \$300,000. The first year has a budget of \$400,000, including work to be performed this summer.

"This is something we need

to do because it's a liability," Eckstein said. "We can't put it off any longer."

City Commissioner Velma Williams said the sidewalk repair program is "a step in the right direction," particularly for the area of her district located west of US Highway 17.92

"I'm very happy we're getting the needs of the residents in order," Williams said.

However, Williams said she will continue to urge the commission to build sidewalks within the "inner city" portions of the city.

"I'm concerned about the need to install sidewalks on 16th Street and Persimmon Avenue," Williams said. "In the inner city areas, you don't have many sidewalks to upgrade. We've got to come up with a major plan to reach out to the inner-city areas."

# Taxes for tourism

# Wert puts high priority on attracting visitors to Seminole

As Tourism Development Director for Seminole County, Jack Wert is responsible for collecting, reporting on, and distribution of millions of dollars each year, obtained through taxes levied on the hotel/motel industry in the county. Staff Writer Nick Pfeifaul questioned Wert regarding the operation of his department, the distribution of money, and who pays for some of the sporting events we have seen recently.

Q: Where does the money come from for the operation of the Tourist Development Council? A: Taxes placed on all hotels and motels, as well

as any other short-term lodging places (for under six months) such as camp-Herald grounds, bed and breakfasts, and some apartment rentals which are for less than that length of time. The money is collected through the county by the Seminole County Tax Collector then forwarded to our

account.

Q: How are the tourism taxes coming in this year?

A: Our fiscal year is October 1 through September 30. So far this year, in the first seven months, the taxes have been up five percent over the projected amount.

Q: Each month, and each year, projected figures are given. Who makes this prediction?

A: I do, along with several members of my staff. We based our prediction on such things as past history, knowledge of season fluctuations, special events which may attract large numbers, and many other considera-

Q: Have any recipients of this money been planned at this time?

A: Each year, we compile a budget, and that determines where we plan to distribute the money. Of course some of it goes to advertising and promotions.

Q: What is the difference between the Tourism Development Council and the Seminole County Convention and Visitors Bureau? Both are listed on your publications. A: They are one-inthe same. It's just that a Convention and Visitors Bureau is better known

around the world.

Q: Speaking about other parts of the world, what connection do you have with the charter flights bringing thousands of people into Sanford from the United Kingdom?

A: We're very active. We advertise the county in the in-flight movies they see on their way here. Then we share a welcome center at the airport with the Chamber of Commerce and hand out brochures. We also hold trade shows in the United Kingdom, and do a great deal of advertising both here and over there.

Q: With the title of "Convention and Visitors" bureau, do people call you about setting up a convention? Why do people contact your organiza-

A: Actually, the most calls are from consumers - people who plan to visit the area. They may have read about us in publications such as "Southern Living." Some look us up on our Web site. We naturally assume if they are coming to the Orlando area, they are going to visit the attractions. But we add that they can also be involved in such things as airboat rides, river cruises, and other things that Orlando doesn't offer. We advertise ourselves as "Natural Florida" and aim our work on people who are looking for a difference.

Q: Who is involved in your bureau? A: We have a nine member Board of Directors. Three are from the hotel/motel industry, three

We could notify property owners who are in a zone that is impacted by a high amount of airport noise," said Jack. Dow, director of operations for the Sanford Airport Authority There would be no restriction on where they can purchase property. It is just an informa-

tional program. Beverly Baird Boothe, a resident of rural Whitner Way in Santord who has long been an advocate of steps to reduce airport noise, said she does appreciate steps being taken.

We are hoping that our homes and the airport can coexist," Boothe said. "Most of us are still vigilant, but we believe there have been real efforts to listen to us. I think there has been some consideration of our needs.

The airport is also installing an Instrument Landing System (ILS) on the approach end of Runway 27R to allow full use of the air carrier runway. The \$2.3 million project will allow aircraft to land from the east, reducing noise levels in Sanford and Lake Mary

We believe the airport can be a really attractive spot for Seminole County and Santord," Boothe said. "There is tremendous transportation with the GreeneWay expansion, people can get to where they want, and the beauty

here is extremely unique." The Instrument Landing System will provide naviga-

tional assistance for aircraft landing on the airport's main runway during poor weather

Key to Lake Mary, the system will allow aircraft to approach and land from the east. This will decrease aircraft noise in areas to the west of the airport

Wind conditions are expected to be favorable for aircraft. to land from the east 30 percent of the time according to airport officials. Planes must takeoff and land against the wind. The majority of the time at the airport, the wind is blowing east to west

Meanwhile, the \$25 million terminal expansion project is progressing on schedule for completion by December. The project involves construction of a 105,000 square-foot addition to the existing domestic terminal including seven additional boarding gates

The new concourse will house an expanded restaurant, and seating for passengers of seven aircraft.

Three gates will allow for use by international passengers simultaneous to four gates being used by domestic passengers.

Six of the seven gates will be furnished with aircraft boarding bridges to allow passengers to board aircraft without being exposed to weather. The seventh gate will be taifored to smaller regional jets.

The new terminal will primarily serve domestic flights, including Pan American Airways Pan Am will begin daily flights to St. Louis in August Currently, Pan Amhas daily flights out of Sanford to the Chicago-Gary Airport, Portsmouth, N.H., Bangor, Maine, and Pittsburgh, Pa.

For many years, it lay in ruins. When talk began to sell the island and demolish the structure, historians worked to save it, as they have much of the physical history of our nation. And Ellis Island was worth saving. It is a moving monument to the many people who came to this country seeking a better

Several walls are covered with pictures of those who came over. Many families donated artifacts that their parents, grandparents or great grandparents, brought with them to the New World.
