A copy of the New York Herald, dated April 15, 1865, was brought to this office yesterday by Alfred Nelson, a carpenter, who found the copy while employed in repairing the home of M. Hanson, Sanford shoe dealer, near Paola.

The copy contains a graphic account of the assassination of President Lincoln and also the attack on Secretary Seward. The columns are replete with stories relating the progress of the various armies of both the Confederacy and the Union.

BERLIN LETTER

BERLIN, Jan. 2.—(AP)—Germany has taken to the third place among European nations in the popularity of what are called the "white sport" winter games, in which Norway and Sweden are admittedly the leaders. More than 20 national and international ski tournaments have been arranged for January, February and March in lower Bavaria, the Harz mountains, the Black forest and the mountains of the Thuringia.

The National Ski Association has 70,000 members, with an additional 15,000 junior membership. There are 85 skating clubs with memberships totaling 12,000. In Berlin alone there are half a dozen indoor skating rinks, one of which is the largest in the world.

Although Norway and Sweden still are supreme in ski-jumping, German athletes have passed the German record in ski-jumping and lead in ice hockey and fancy skating. The German ski-jumping champion, Neuner, holds a national record of one meter short of the European record held by a Swede.

Sight-seeing tours of the Bavarian mountains and forests are being continued through the winter. In specially constructed heated limousine aeroplanes of the junker all-metal type.

Four airplane tourist services have been established by the Trans-European Union of Munich. The trips range from a 15-minute flight over the city and suburbs to a two-hour trip encircling the Zugspitze, the highest peak of the Bavarian Alps. Travelers going up do not have to dress any more warmly than they do for the street.

Among the more touching manifestations of the Christmas spirit in Germany was the action of 20 inmates of the Ziegenhain penitentiary of the state of Hesse. For several weeks preceding the last of the year, the inmates, free time in whittling and assembling toys for the children in a home for the feeble minded at Treysa, near Cassel, which is entirely maintained by private citizens.

PARIS

PARIS, Jan. 2.—(AP)—Anti-feminism still exists in the French academy of Sciences as is shown by the opposition to the nomination of Madame Curie as successor to Professor Adin Heller, who died some months ago.

The academy usually lets little things pass before giving a vacancy, and the present delay is attributed entirely to the anti-feminist section, which in 1911 succeeded in preventing Madame Curie's election by nominating Professor Edouard Branly, wireless investigator and electing him by a margin of one vote.

This year the anti-feminist has been unable to find a candidate possessing the slightest chance against Madame Curie, so they have confined themselves to dilatory tactics. The chemistry section of the academy, however, is beginning to murmur that its representation should be brought up to the normal number.

France is going to have a "Hollywood" of her own, a new center for the motion picture industry which is expected to be in full swing in the neighborhood of the exclusive resorts of Biarritz by the autumn of 1927. An article in LE SOIR recently outlined plans for the new movie city.

LE SOIR bewails the decline of the motion picture industry in France, and especially the fact that Germany has surpassed France in this field, but finds a ray of hope in the "extraordinary suitability of the Basque coast" for making pictures.

"The Riviera is beautiful," LE SOIR quotes a well known French director as saying, "but beautiful in the same way as the pretty girls who make a business of being artists' models and know the price of their beauty. The French film industry would do no better at Nice than it has done at Paris. Let the French directors go to Basque country."

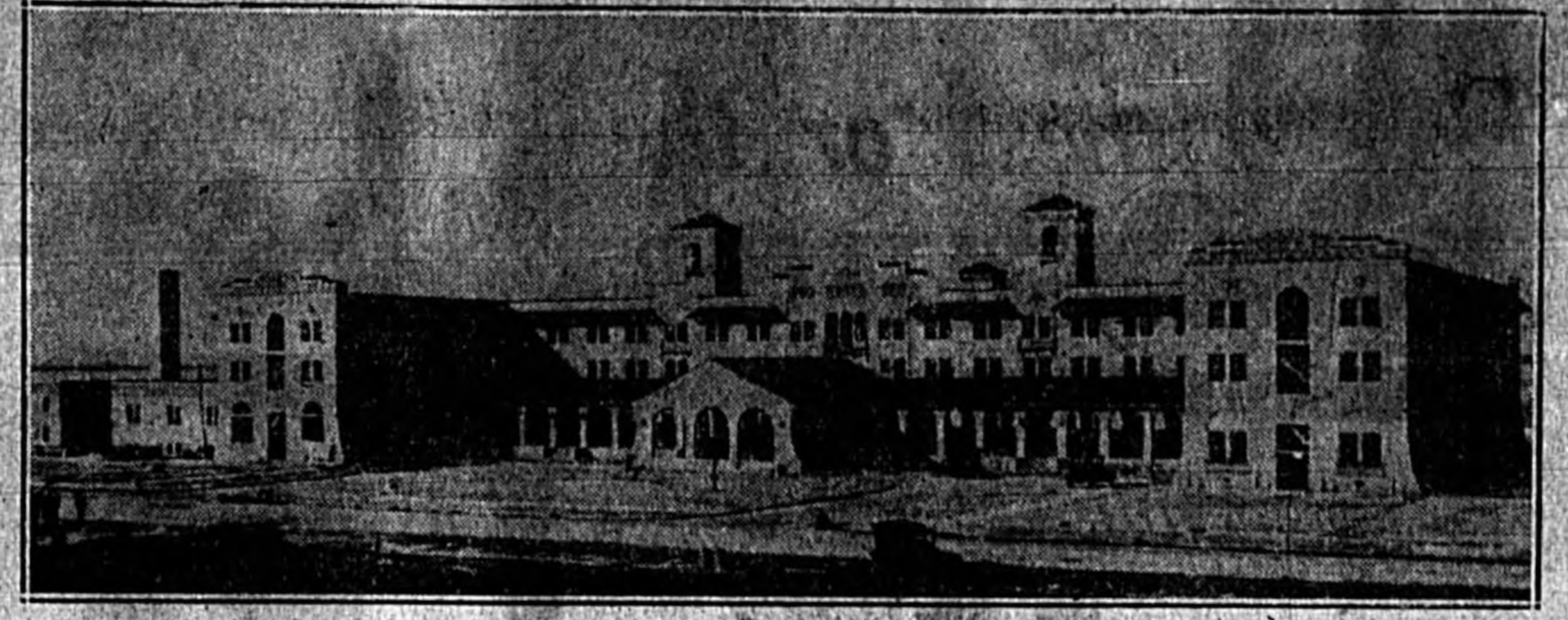

The actual cause of death was a cerebral blood clot, which developed during the battle between the queen mother and the disease when the end came, having been summoned hurriedly yesterday when the sudden turn for the worse was noted. The patient late last night sank into a coma, from which despite heroic efforts by her doctors, she never emerged.

The widow of King Humbert, who was assassinated at Monza, July 29, 1900, Margherita passed her seventy-fourth birthday on Nov. 20.

Distress Among Miners Of Nova Scotia Culminate In Burning Of One Store And Robbery Of Others

GLACE BAY, N. S., Jan. 4.—(AP)—Distress among the coal miners in Glace Bay and New Aberdeen, where there has been lack of steady employment in collieries of the British Empire Steel Corporation, culminated last night in raids upon and burning of provision stores by unemployed storekeepers suffered the loss of considerable stocks in both places and one store in New Aberdeen was burned.
