## Lyons wants to supervise elections

SANFORD - A former Sanford City Commissioner is running for public office once again.

Kerry Lyons, who served on the City Commission the last four years, is running for Seminole County Supervisor of Elections.

Lyons wants to use technology, education, and greater voter access to increase turnout at elections. The general election will be held Nov. 7, 2000.

"I have a strong commitment to public service," Lyons said. "This is something I'm very intent on doing. I want to use my experience as a commissioner to improve voter turnout in the county."

For the March 2 city election in which A.A. "Mac" McLanahan was chosen to replace Lyons on the commission and the public safety departments were placed under the city manager's supervision, only 18 percent of the city's registered voters cast ballots.

Lyons did not run for reelection to the commission. In Sanford's District 3, the only district where voters could cast ballots in the commission race, just 8 percent of the registered voters turned out.

In the general election of November, 1998, 46.6 percent of the county's registered voters cast ballots. This is a nearly 15 percent drop from the general election of 1996, when 61.5 percent of the county's registered voters went to the polls.

In the general election of 1994, 64.4 percent of the registered voters cast ballots. In the 1992 election, 85.7 percent of the registered voters turned out. In 1990, 60.1 percent of the registered voters cast ballots.

## Helmet law can prevent injuries, save lives

SANFORD - On March 25 in a quiet Sanford neighborhood, rescue workers responded to the scene of a child who had been struck by a vehicle while riding his bicycle without wearing a helmet.

The boy was rushed from 100 Anderson Circle to Orlando Regional Medical Center, and survived the accident. However, the boy also received head injuries that may have been prevented by wearing a helmet.

The Sanford Police and Fire Departments are working with the Safe Kids program to ensure that children can afford to wear helmets while riding. Please see Helmet, Page 5A.

## Lake Mary gives fire chief more power

LAKE MARY - Lake Mary city commissioners voted unanimously last night to amend the city's alarm ordinance and allow fire chief Craig Haun the same power now granted police chief Richard Beary to waive false alarm fees and prohibit occupancy of a structure cited for disconnection of a required fire alarm or sprinkler system.

Chief Haun said the amendment "addresses the specificity of adherence," because in the past it only addressed the power of the police chief for both burglar and fire alarms.

The commissioners also voted unanimously to amend the fire ordinance:

- to make burn permits valid for one day and not be issued for more than two consecutive days. No more than two burn permits may be issued for any one location within a 30-day period. Currently, there is no time limit and no fee assessed for the permit;
- to authorize issuance of a Fireworks sale permit and giving fire officials the ability to revoke the permit in drought scenario. It is now issued as a tent permit with fire officials verifying the tent permit and fire extinguisher accessibility;
- to amend the installation and use of key-lock boxes and tamper switches on new structures. Key lock

boxes and tamper switches -- allowing emergency response officers instant access to a structure without waiting for a key from the owner -- will eventually be required in all existing buildings as well. According to Chief Haun, this has been addressed in building plan reviews in the past and relates to alarms and power shunts (electrical cut-off). "Now as an ordinance, it makes standards enforceable."

- to amend installation standards and supervision of fire sprinkler systems
- to clarify the code for renovations of existing structures;
- to details charges for standby fire protection or rescue service. There is no

fee structure currently in place. Chief Haun said that in the past charges were assessed on a case-by-case basis. "Now we have a set standard." He explains that the fee is not a revenue source for the department. It serves to offset additional costs and could be waived if needed;

- to make Standard Fire Prevention Code, 1997 Edition, published by the Southern Building Code Congress International, Inc., the city's official fire prevention code.

The commission meeting began with commissioners honoring firefighter / Emergency Medical Technician Flann Waldorf with a leather helmet for 10 years of service to the city.

## Coto is a breath of fresh air in transition time

Coto takes care of county business, but will gladly hand over the baton once the county picks a new manager.

SEMINOLE COUNTY - On his last day of work, County Manager Gary Kaiser said "Good Luck" to Acting Manager Cindy Coto and gave her a can of aerosol B.S. Repellent.

A little something for Coto to squirt when the county air gets too thick.

"Gary told me that Ron Rabun gave it to him - that it's one of the rites when passing the manager's torch."

Coto said she hopes to pass the aerosol can to a new manager in the next month or so. Coto declined offers to be an applicant for the permanent manager's job. "I am happy where I'm at," she said.

The county has received 60 or so applications as the result of a nation-wide search for a successor to Kaiser, who left public service last week to become president and chief executive officer of HTE, Inc. in Lake Mary.

At 42, Coto is a valued manager who has steadily climbed the county ranks. She began 21 years ago as a personnel aide who supervised four clerks.

She advanced to the assistant personnel director, to deputy director of environmental services to director of Central Services to Deputy County Manager.

"Cindy Coto is extremely knowledgeable with a good overview of the county's total operation," said County Chairman Carlton Henley. "Wherever her assignment, she has done an excellent job."

Former Commissioner Win Adams said that what impressed him the most was that Coto "was and will never be a 'yes person.' She's methodical and conscientious. She knows what she's talking about but she will explain all the options available," Adams said.

Everyone at the County Services Building recognizes Coto's work ethic and her ability to relate to both staff and the board. Someone recently likened her to the actress Donna Reed, whom Coto strongly resembles. Who wouldn't trust Donna Reed? And who wouldn't trust Cindy Coto?

Coto says that she believes her greatest contribution to the county has been her eagerness and ability to do any task. "I don't think there's any

single contribution but a combination of all the jobs I have performed," she said Tuesday. "I pride myself on being ready to take on any project or issue."

As the daughter of Air Force Master Sgt. Ralph W. Adams, Coto learned many cultures and lessons that have helped her in a career she never expected. "I'm from an era when girls like myself thought they would be housewives and mothers," she said. Born in Watsonville, Calif. (outside San Francisco), she grew up in Japan, Texas, Colorado, Germany and Florida. She went to high school in Deland and graduated from the University of Central Florida.

Coto is married and has two children - Sean (20) and Chandler (19). Chandler is going into the Coast Guard. Sean attends Seminole Community College.







## Cooper was a farmer and a biology teacher

Again you will read about people mentioned in the April 29, 1933 issue of the Sanford Herald.

### R.F. COOPER

Ruby F. Cooper, a young Sanford man, divided his time between teaching biology at Seminole High School and farming. He was a North Carolinian who stated that he had rather live in Sanford than anywhere else because of the tremendous possibilities.

Mr. Cooper was raised on a farm near Salemburg, N.C. He had to assume its responsibilities at the age of 12 when his father died, leaving him as the only boy in a family of five people.

He graduated from Mars Hill High School and then worked his way through the University of Florida from which he was graduated with a BSAE degree.

In August 1922 he came to Sanford where he taught agriculture at Sanford High School from 1922-1928. While he was there, he was instrumental in getting the football team well established by assisting as coach.

From 1928-32 he was actively engaged as a farmer; during the past year he had returned to SHS as biology teacher as well as operating his farm.

During 1925 he did some research work at Cornell University in New York; while there he traveled around the area which comprised the extent of his travels.

Mr. Cooper was an active member of First Baptist Church where he had been Superintendent of the Intermediate Department since 1922.

He resided at 610 Palmetto Avenue with his wife, the for-

mer Gladys Boyce, their two sons, James Henry and Charles Floyd, and his mother, Mrs. Annie Cooper.

(Mr. Cooper was the first agriculture teacher at Sanford High School located on Palmetto Avenue. The class met in the basement and had a laboratory acre on Celery Avenue. Their celery took first place at the state fair that first year and their collection of vegetables, third place.

I have known Mr. Cooper all of my life as he continued to be active at First Baptist as a deacon and in various other capacities. I know that he also served as a county School Trustee during the 1940's. He currently resides at Renaissance and celebrated his 100th birthday last September.)

### R.A. NEWMAN

R.A. Newman had come to Sanford in 1907 and had managed Hill Hardware Company ever since that time. He had served on the old city council and was one of the first five members of the new city commission when it began in 1929. He was presently serving as a director of the Sanford Atlantic National Bank.

Mr. Newman was born in Tennessee, but moved to Orlando with his parents and at-

tended schools there. Later he studied at Rollins College and Massey Business College.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, a Shriner and a member of the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce and Holy Cross Episcopal Church.

He resided with his wife, the former Ada Hill, in Rose Court; they had two children, Mrs. Olive Adams and Robert.

### Linton E. Allen

Linton Allen came to Sanford in 1928 to assume the presidency of the newly formed Sanford Atlantic National Bank after having been connected with various banks in Georgia, Chicago and New York City.

Mr. Allen was a native of Chipley, Georgia and had attended the University of Georgia. A lieutenant, he saw action on the front line trenches of France during the World War. He was also engaged in many other battles.

He was an active citizen with memberships in the Chamber of Commerce, Salvation Army, Masonic Order and First Presbyterian Church.

He and his wife, the former Helen Ives of Orlando, resided in Rose Court with their daughter Helen Elizabeth. His favorite sport and recreation was hunting.

### Sidney L. Nix

Sidney Nix came to Sanford in 1925 to establish a law office, and had since become active in the Elks and Masonic Lodges. He was also a member of the Knights of Pythias, Woodman of the World and Order of Redmen.

He had served as secretary of the local Kiwanis Club for six years and was recognized by the members as responsible for keeping attendance above average. He was also

serving on several local and state committees.

Mr. Nix was born in Jackson County, Georgia, and attended schools in Commerce. He graduated from the University of Georgia with AB and LLJ degrees. When he had completed schooling, he had become an assistant bank cashier and later clerk of circuit court in Jackson County. From 1915 to 1921 he was county prosecuting attorney and later an attorney until he moved to Sanford.

The former Lottie Appleby was his wife and they had four children: Mildren, Charlotte, Sidney, Jr. and Carol Jean.



bicycles. A new Helmet Offenders Program will provide helmets to children cited for not wearing helmets.

Children under age 16 who are given the \$45 ticket can receive a helmet for \$10 or

less. Children whose family receives state financial assistance will be given a helmet for free.

"We're trying to reduce and eliminate head injuries to young people under age 16," Cpl. Rick Poovey of the Sanford Police Department said.

"There's no point to a young kid receiving a head injury."

Sanford police will watch neighborhoods near public schools daily, writing citations to children under age 16 riding bicycles without a helmet.

At Sanford Middle School today, police will participate

in an enhanced helmet enforcement effort. Police will issue citations and hand out information on the Helmet Offenders Program.

Sanford's Fire Prevention Bureau at Fire Station 31 on U.S. highway 17-92 will fit the helmets for children under age 16, with a parental presence. Children with a citation and bicycle offenders documentation will receive a free fitting.

Castle Brewer Court is also participating in the Helmet Offenders Program.

"We realize that buying helmets is a financial burden for many parents," Poovey said.

"Hopefully, this will ease the financial burden."

## Old phonograph parts

**DEAR ANNE AND NAN:** I need several old cylinder-type phonograph records that were used on the Edison type phonographs and dictating machines in the early 1900s to complete a school exhibit. Information as to availability would be appreciated. — **IDDO K. CORKERN**, Baton Rouge, La.

**DEAR IDDO:** In a couple of our reference books we found the name of a person who collects, among other things, cylinder records. He's Steve Ramm, and his address is 420 Filwater St., Philadelphia, PA 19147. He specializes in phonographs and related memorabilia from before 1930. Our suggestion is to write to him — and be sure to include a stamped, self-addressed envelope.

**DEAR ANNE AND NAN:** I once had the recipe for "old fashion rice pudding." I have lost it, and no other recipe is the same. Can you send me this recipe? — **JENNY O'DONNELL**, Naperville, Ill.

**DEAR JENNY:** Here's our favorite recipe for rice pudding. It comes from "The Fannie Merritt Farmer Boston Cooking School Cookbook" (Little, Brown and Co., 1959).

**Old Fashioned Rice Pudding**  
This is very soft and creamy. For a firm pudding, use 1/2 cup of rice. Brown rice gives a delicious flavor. For a richer pudding, stir in 1 or 2 well beaten eggs 30 minutes before the pudding is done.

- 4 cups milk
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup uncooked rice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 teaspoon vanilla or a dash or nutmeg or the grated rind of 1/2 lemon
- 1/2 cup raisins, dates or figs, cut small.

Combine the first six ingredients in the casserole. Bake uncovered for 3 hours at 300 degrees. During the first hour, stir three times with a fork so that the rice will not settle. After the first hour, stir in raisins, dates or figs.

**DEAR ANNE AND NAN:** You're my last hope. I've written to the TV show "Interior Motives" and included a stamped self-addressed envelope twice, but I still haven't heard from them. This item is a combination of plastic pieces that are used to fit chair and sofa covers. You know, the large, shapeless kind that slip if they aren't anchored. How do I order these cover fitters? — **BETSY KASLON**, York, Neb.

**DEAR BETSY:** Nan once bought one of those big, loose slipcovers. It was a huge disappointment. It looked great, until some one sat on it — then the cover pulled out and it looked like the dickens. Nan also saw an ad for the "Fitting Pretty" system. It's terrific — the saggy, shapeless cover now stays put. Your letter inspired Nan to call Paula Riley, the inventor of Fitting Pretty. She said, "I started out trying to create a universal cover for furniture — something that was inexpensive compared to reupholstering or having custom slipcovers made. It was easy to make something that looked good; the hard part was finding a way to keep the cover looking good once you sat on the furniture." Paula came up with the Fitting Pretty system for sofas and chairs. It's ingenious. For a sofa, you need to buy both the grip set — pliable plastic wedge-shaped grips that tuck into the back and sides of a sofa (item number 1141, \$29.95) — and the clip kit (item number 1135, \$24.95). It took Nan a couple of tries to translate the directions into a nifty-looking slipcover, but she did succeed. Paula has recently developed a "No-Sew Kit" for making slipcovers using sheets or fabric. It sells for \$19.99, plus shipping and handling.

## Lions gain another 6A-District 3 victory

OVIEDO - With two weeks left in the regular season, varsity baseball teams are beginning to jockey for position for the upcoming district tournaments. Actually, they've been jockeying for position all season, but now things are coming into focus.

The Oviedo Lions took another step toward securing the top seed and a first-round bye in the Class 6A-District 3 tournament - which will be played at DeLand's Conrad Park the last week of April - by beating Lake Mary, 6-2, Wednesday night at Paul Mikler Field.

Oviedo, 20-2 and ranked No. 3 in this week's Class 6A state poll, improved to 8-0 in the

district. Lake Mary, now 1-8, drops to 4-3 in district play.

"In our district, which has six teams in it, it's important to secure one of the top two seeds," explained Oviedo coach Kenne Brown. "That way, you get a bye through the first round of games into the semifinals."

Since both the district champion and runner-up advance to the state playoffs, a win in the district semifinals automatically qualifies a team for the state tournament.

Five-year freshwater fishing license buyers receive the samples and coupons as free bonuses if they purchase their licenses during the promotional period.

Five-year freshwater fishing licenses are available from county tax collector's offices for \$61.50 or by phone at 1-888-FISH-FLORIDA (1-888-347-4356).

To use the phone system, which is available 24 hours a day, callers must have a major credit card and will be billed an additional \$3.95 convenience charge.

Anglers who purchase five-year licenses by phone will be able to start fishing immediately and will receive their credit-card style license by mail, along with a package of free samples and special offers.

Samples include a fanny-pack, various lures, hooks, weights, and fishing-related magazines worth more than \$40.00, in addition to numerous coupons and special offers.

Expect good bass action to continue in the river. Bass will hold in deep bays, and in areas of running water near ambush spots, such as creek mouths, sandbars, and other irregular features. Bream and catfish can be found in deep bays and will readily hit worms and muscle.

Sebastian Inlet is featuring good snook action with fish to 20 pounds. Large live shrimp fished with a bare lead-head jig is a winning combination. One-ounce jigs also work well. Redfish, trout, flounder and jack crevalle are also present in fair numbers.

Captain Jack at Port Canaveral reports fair offshore action with dolphin and wahoo, but the fish are in deep water--from 240 feet on out. King mackerel are on Pelican Flats and cobia are on the wrecks and reefs. Sheepshead and flounder are hitting inside the Port, and trout and redfish are rated as fair in the Banana and Indian rivers.

Count on fast action at Ponce Inlet with sheepshead, small bluefish, redfish, drum, and a few flounder. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.

## Certain collection practices prohibited

We live in a society where many consumers over extend themselves by taking on more debt than they can comfortably afford. As a result, when the unexpected happens, those consumers are often not able to keep up the payments on their accounts and then their accounts are oftentimes assigned, sold, or transferred to a collection agency. For some consumers, this has been the beginning of a seemingly endless nightmare due to the collection tactics employed by some collection agencies.

Not being able to pay bills is very embarrassing for most people and a reminder of the situation they are in is most certainly not enjoyable. In all fairness to creditors, though, creditors are entitled to attempt to collect the debts owed them. However, there are limits as to what debt collectors can do to collect consumer debts.

A consumer debt is legally defined as any obligation or alleged obligation of a consumer to pay money arising out of a transaction in which



the money, property, insurance, or services which were the subject of the transaction were primarily for personal, family, or household purposes, whether or not such obligation has been reduced to judgment.

Florida law, in order to balance the creditors' right to collect debts owed them and the debtors' right to privacy and to be free from harassment, has placed limitations on what a debt collector can do to collect consumer debts. Following is a partial listing of the behaviors prohibited by statute.

In collecting consumer debts, no person shall: (1) Simulate in any manner a law enforcement officer or a representative of any governmental agency; (2) Use or threaten force or violence; (3) Tell a debtor who disputes a consumer debt that she or he or any person employing her or him will disclose to another, orally or in writing, directly or indirectly, information affecting the debtor's reputation for credit worthiness without also informing the debtor that the existence of the dispute will also be disclosed; (4) Communicate or threaten to communicate with a debtor's employer prior to obtaining final judgment against the debtor, unless the debtor gives her or his permission in writing to contact her or his employer or acknowledges in writing the existence of the debt after the debt has been placed for collection, but this shall not prohibit a person from telling the debtor that her or his employer will be contacted if a final judgment is obtained; (5) Disclose to a person other than the debtor or her or his

family information affecting the debtor's reputation, whether or not for credit worthiness, with knowledge or reason to know that the other person does not have a legitimate business need for the information or that the information is false; or (6) Disclose information concerning the existence of a debt known to be reasonably disputed by the debtor without disclosing that fact.

In addition to the limitations listed above, there other limitations as to what debt collectors can do to collect consumer debts. In the coming weeks we will discuss these other limitations as well as the penalties that may be imposed upon debt collectors who engage in prohibited conduct.

## Wife ready to blow her fuse over utility's sick-leave policy

DEAR ABBY: I am very frustrated and need your help. Please do not use my name, city or state. It could get my husband fired.

"Al" works for one of the largest electrical utilities in the country. He's a lineman and puts his life on the line every day. Al works hard, gets along well with co-workers and supervisors, and responds promptly every time he's called for an emergency. He has worked many holidays and missed a number of family celebrations.

So what's the problem? Al is verbally chastised and receives low evaluation scores because he uses his sick days when he's ill. With young children, we have the usual colds, flu and viruses. He got the flu twice last winter, and I thought the company was going to fire him. The supervisor demanded that Al get a doctor's note for the days he missed.

Abby, the unspoken rule is *do not use sick days*. His company touts safety and rewards employees for safety records but demands that they work even when sick. How safe can it be for a man shakng with chills and fever to be perched on a utility pole, 40 feet in the air?

The company hasn't singled Al out - they treat all employees this way. In my opinion, forcing employees to work while sick is not in the best interests of the employees or the company. I cannot imagine why the company clings to this warped way of thinking.

How should we handle this without jeopardizing Al's job?

LINEMAN'S WORRIED WIFE

DEAR WORRIED WIFE: Your husband has the right to use his sick days as long as the need is legitimate. If the company is strict about bringing a doctor's excuse after each illness, Al must accept it and not take it personally.



Unless Al is being singled out and treated differently than his peers, or the company is violating an established policy, there is nothing to be done except consider finding a job with a different company, or another line of work.

DEAR ABBY: I'm writing in response to the letter from the gay man who finally came out after many years of marriage and several children.

Abby, I can relate to the man's wife. A few years ago, my husband came out at the age of 45, when our daughter was 9 years old. It was very traumatic, but I discovered a support group for us, the spouses.

Amity Pierce Burton, Ph.D., wrote a book I found very helpful. It's titled "The Other Side of the Closet: The Coming-Out Crisis for Straight Spouses and Families." She also coordinates support groups, and counsels spouses and ex-spouses of bisexual, gay and lesbian mates.





## WIN AT BRIDGE

There's no need for flamboyance

Willard Duncan Vandiver, in a speech at a naval banquet in Philadelphia in 1899, said, "I come from a state that raises corn and cotton and cockleburs and Democrats, and frothy eloquence neither convinces nor satisfies me. I am from ... Where?"

Successful defense is rarely flamboyant, or frothy. It is usually undramatic. Take the West cards in the diagram. Against four spades, you lead the heart king: three, seven, four. What now?

While deciding, what would you respond with that North hand? The eight high-card points might lead you to believe that two spades is sufficient. However, the singleton club and the known nine-card fit make it worth a

limit raise of three spades. Yet if you still use the old-fashioned forcing raise (say it isn't so!), taking a shot at four spades is better than settling for a single raise. You might not make it, but at least you pressure the opponents, and you're paid a game bonus for success.

When the deal occurred in Springfield, Mo., West continued with the heart jack. Declarer won with dummy's ace and conceded a club trick. In a moment, South raked in 10 tricks via five spades, one heart, one diamond and three club ruffs in the dummy.

Dummy's singleton club should have been like a proverbial red rag. Anticipating declarer's ruffing club losers, West should have switched to his trump. When declarer gives up the club trick, East returns a second trump. Now South gets only two ruffs in the dummy and nine tricks in total.

As you've probably guessed (or knew), Vandiver was from Missouri.

## ASK DR. GOTT

### Lightheadedness vs. vertigo

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have hypertension for which I take medication. Occasionally, I feel dizzy. What causes this?

DEAR READER: Dizziness means two distinct things to doctors: lightheadedness (a vague, uncertain feeling like unsteadiness or faintness) or vertigo (a sensation of spinning).

Lightheadedness is often caused by circulatory disturbances. For example, if you suddenly stand from a sitting position, your blood pressure may not instantaneously compensate for the rapid change. Consequently, you may experience a temporary feeling of wooziness, until the blood pressure rises to force blood to your brain against gravity. This commonly occurs with age, is more common in treated hypertensives and ordinarily is no cause for concern. A similar but more pronounced reaction can appear when a person's pulse falls. If the blood pressure suddenly drops or if the blood pressure is too low (as may be the case in hypertensives who are aggressively treated).

Arterial blockage in the brain's

blood vessels is another common cause of lightheadedness in older patients. Yet, young people will also experience lightheadedness. During the 1940s, bobby-sovers would often faint when listening to Frank Sinatra sing. Old Blue Eyes lost this signature in his waning years, and we will probably never know with certainty what caused adolescents to swoon when he crooned — but swoon they did.

On the other hand, vertigo is a different problem. "Swimming" of the head, loss of spatial orientation, a feeling of revolving or spinning are symptoms that point to the vestibular apparatus of each inner ear, a form of paired gyroscopes that tell us about

body position. When you close your eyes and turn around repeatedly (or suffer from motion sickness), the dizziness you experience is vertigo. In patients with vestibular malfunction, the vertigo can be incapacitating. In general, vertigo requires evaluation by an ear-nose-and-throat specialist.

Although this may seem like a long-winded answer to your question, the distinction between lightheadedness and vertigo is crucial. You probably are suffering from the former, perhaps related to your hypertension and its therapy. Therefore, in your case, I'd start with your family physician. If necessary, he or she can refer you to an otolaryngologist for additional testing.

For other patients, I offer the following advice. When discussing the problem of "dizziness" with your doctor, be sure to define the problem in terms of whether it is lightheadedness or vertigo.
