Farm Debt Leaders Attend Important Meet At Capital

A plan that special efforts be made at this time to save from foreclosure Florida farms and other property affected by the recent freeze has been made by Governor Deen Shultz, according to Frank T. Kellinger of Daytona Beach, spokesman for the Florida Farm Debt Adjustment Commission in 33 counties on the East Coast who called on local members of the organization in Sanford today.

The plan was framed during a meeting of leaders in farm debt relief work held Monday and Tuesday in the office of the Florida body in Tallahassee, which Mr. Kellinger attended as representative of the federal land banks in refinancing farm debts were explained by Henry Johnson, a member of the senior loan committee of the Columbia, S. C., land bank at this conference.

Views on the general farm credit situation were offered by Dr. G. W. Fisher, noted economist of Raleigh, N. C., who is admitted to being head of the department of agriculture in the North Carolina State College and a member of his state's tax commission, is serving as executive secretary of the North Carolina Farm Debt Adjustment Commission.

Workers' Leader Charges New Deal Leader Is Traitor Organized Labor

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2.—In a stinging attack on the automobile code of Donald Richberg, leader of the New Deal Council, John L. Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers, said today that he had "thought of him in the last few days as a traitor and dishonorable before a Senate sub-committee on another day."

Lewis called the Administration's "traitor" Richberg, "Springing the leins of labor as he did, and to the President the code of labor in the automobile industry for the past few weeks."

Mr. Richberg was not present at his obligations in the event but I think of him as a traitor to organized labor that nurtured at whose breast he was nursed."

Lewis said the 48-hour-week, "economical and industrial revolution" was "a disaster."

Italy Institutes Period Of Compulsory War Service

"I Intend To Make Italy Great," Mussolini Says As He Enlists Eight-Year-Old Boys

ROME, Feb. 2.—(AP)—Compulsory military service for all Italian males between eight and 33 years old went into effect throughout Italy yesterday.

"I intend to make Italy great," Benito Mussolini said, as he inaugurated perhaps the most sweeping peace-time mobilization in history, "through training millions of young men."

Actual military training begins at the age of 21 years, while compulsory training continues for 10 years.

The Florida Bank and Trust Company has paid neither real nor personal property taxes for 1934, having obtained a court order restraining the city from collecting taxes on the grounds the assessments were unreasonable.

2 Ex-Officers Agreed To "Get" Senator; Pair Shot At Huey On Five Occasions

Baton Rouge, Feb. 2.—(AP)—Senator Huey P. Long drew testimony from a witness at his "murder plot" hearing that two former deputies sheriff had conspired to kill him for \$14,000.

The testimony was given by George Davis, tall, raw-boned, former deputy of the East Baton Rouge parish who said that he and Fred Parker, another former deputy, had hatched the plot.

Davis, telling his story calmly, placed on the stand after his witnesses had refused to testify, claiming constitutional immunity.

Davis said he and Parker made several attempts to shoot Huey Long with rifles and that they tried to get a shot at him through a window of the governor's mansion, at the state house, and again at a hiding place, and another time at the governor's mansion.

He said their attempts failed because they were closely covered and watched by state police.

The witness said they used a car assigned to the office of the sheriff of East Baton Rouge in their travels after Long, and they had two rifles, one belonging to Davis and another to the Lobbiel Hardware Company, owned by relatives of Sheriff Robert Pettit of East Baton Rouge.

Parker and Fred O'Rourke, whom Long described as the "chief agent" of the Standard Oil Company of Louisiana in the plot last Saturday against the senator's dictatorship, were the witnesses who refused to testify.

A new plot to assassinate Senator Long was "revealed" by the dictator last night as he returned his investigation in the state supreme court chamber here.

The inquiry, started to the accompaniment of sky-rocketing martial law, threatened rebellion, and radio broadcasting, was to have unfolded details of last week's insurrection and the alleged conspiracy to murder him.

But it also brought the disclosure of a telegram which said Long was to have been killed yesterday, upon his return from Washington.

The telegram, sent to the Chicago Tribune from Hammond, La., and signed "George K. Campbell, editor of the Vindicator," said: "Plans are well laid for the assassination of Huey Long on his return from Washington Friday. Under no circumstances quote me as my life would be jeopardized. Determined citizenry of Baton Rouge, East and West Feliciana."
