according to figures at nearby private institutions. All county residents will be required to pay the higher costs under private ownership, not just indigents who receive medical care funded by the

to increase by at least \$10 a day just for beds alone.

According to figures in the clerk of court's office, it was disclosed that Florida Hospital charges an average of \$73.98 for one day for indigent care. Seminole Memorial charges \$58.58 for the same oneday period.

Winter Park Memorial fees for treatment is even higher at \$74.60 for a single day.

Murphy Medical Center at Gainesville charges \$71.20 for one day's care, and Fort Myers medical center bills an average \$72.50 for a day's treatment. Orange Memorial charges are about \$70 a day, according to figures.

Students 'See' Justice

Dominick Salfi is to be commended for presenting his "mock trial" program at county schools and we were interested in this first hand report by an eighth grader at Sanford Middle School giving her reaction.

In Friday's trial, Mark Whigham and Parker Winston portrayed two hypothetical Sanford Middle School students who, while hitchhiking home from a football game, were picked up by a young woman, portrayed by Martha McDonald. Her car was stopped by officers, represented by Deputies Harold Taylor and David Lohr, and found to contain marijuana. The three defendants were charged with illegal possession of marijuana.

Young Harrell's father is Chief Deputy of the Seminole County : Sheriff's Department.

The first two witnesses for the prosecution were Deputy Sheriffs Lohr and Taylor, who impressed students with their careful consideration of each answer and attention to detail. Mrs. Rose Harris, chemist for the Region Four Crime Laboratory, was the final witness for the state. She explained the process by which marijuana is identified.

Attorneys Baum and Morris presented the defendants as their witness. The audience was impressed to see their classmates examined and cross-examined like actual witnesses.

At press time the jury was still out. However, no matter what the verdict is, all eighth grade students at Sanford Middle School benefited from Judge Salfi's program.





Whatever its ultimate political consequences, the ITT case is developing into a personal tragedy for one of the Justice Department figures most directly concerned—

Richard McLaren The headlines have obscured McLaren's quite remarkable antitrust achievements, not the least being the ITT case. Worse, the investigation has tended to impugn his character by suggesting that while sincere, he was so weak that under political pressure he would reverse himself on what he believed.

Actually, McLaren is an earnest trust-buster so determined on his goals that he invisted there be no strings and no outcide pressure on his work as the antitrust chief. His predecessor, the able and impeccably honest Donald Turner, had believe the law as written did not give the government sufficient grounds to win in court against the merger of related companies. The third key man in the anticonglomerate cases, Solicitor General Erwin N. Griswold, concurred. But McLaren persisted and pushed his cases against ITT aimed at forcing the giant conglomerate to give up the Grinnell Corp., the Canteen Corp. and the Hartford Fire Insurance Co.

The lower courts decided against McLaren in Grinnell and Canteen And he was denied an injunction aimed at preventing ITT from going ahead with the Hartford merger until that case was settled.

One can speculate on what would have happened if the Hartford case had been brought to trial, and what would have been the result of the Grinnell and Canteen appeals. One can read in detail of ITT's attempts to influence the decision, and there is already enough known of these to give one a sour taste.

One can discuss whether forcing ITT to give up Hartford (if possible) would have seriously injured the stock-holders, or whether the divesting would or would not have had ripple effects in the nation's stock exchanges and the



from expanding in ways that would hamper competition. The answer must be subjective. But it is already clear that in the recent past major conglomerates have shown greater caution. Part of this slowdown is due to new accounting rules, new tax regulations and to market gyrations which make some takeovers less profitable. After discounting these facts, the conglomerate watchers this reporter has contacted are convinced McLaren's antitrust campaign and settlements, though not all that he hoped for, have helped strongly toward closing a most serious antitrust loophole. Now remember that the antitrust law was not written

with conglomerates in mind. It took some controversial and somewhat tenuous interpretations to tie conglom erates into this statute, which aims at preventing big companies from getting a paralyzing share of one type of business or another, not at preventing conglomerates from acquiring relatively unrelated businesses. No case of this type had ever been won against a major

conglomerate. In essence, though McLaren had reached one previous significant out-of-court settlement, he was attempting to write new law through legal action. And note that his own court record to date on this case was zero wins and three important losses. The marvel then is not that McLaren didn't get more.

The marvel indeed is that he achieved what he did. It there was political pressure on him, what he achieved was all the more remarkable.

The Seder dinner is the heart of the Passover celebra tion. The feast is a religious service for the home and all


