Juion has scored a clean sweep in the quarterfinals of the World Chess Championship eliminations, insuring that a Russian will meet Bobby Fischer next year for the title. Tigran Petrosian, the world champion in 1963 and 1966, wound up the quarterfinals Sunday with this third victory over Lajos Portisch of Hungary. Their final score was 3-2, with eight draws.

The semifinals will begin in April. Petrosian will play Viktor Jorchnoi, who defeated Henrique Mecking of Brazil 3-1 in the quarterfinals. The other semifinalists are Boris Spassky, the 1969 world champion who was defeated by Fischer in 1972, and Anatoly Karpov, 22-year-old Soviet

TEL AVIV (AP) — Israeli invasion forces withdrawing eastward across the Suez Canal were vacating Egypt's major eastern air base today, blowing up aircraft hangars and destroying military installations, the Israeli command reported.







Washington's Ideas Still Stand Strong

On a day assigned for honoring the memory of George Washington, it is apropos to quote from another of February's great men, Abraham Lincoln. Lincoln is credited with

"If you call a tail a leg, how many legs has a dog? Five? No, calling a tail a leg won't make it

Nor, he might have added, does calling Feb. 18 George Washington's birthday make it George Washington's birthday, which remains in most minds Feb. 22.

Using a Lincoln quotation to begin a Washington column points up something else, too, and that is that Washington somehow never reached the quotability of Lincoln. Which is kind of unfair: Washington uttered quite a few memorable remarks.

They hardly qualify as one-liners, and if they sound stilted that may be because that was the language mode of the day

Washington's words have amazing durability - they can be applied to the events of the 1970s as well as to the waning years of the 18th Century. In his Farewell Address, the speech he made after declining to seek a third term as president, he spoke of foreign relations and national security:

"Against the insidious wiles of foreign influence . . . the jealousy of a free people ought to be constantly awake, since history and experience prove that foreign influence is one of the most baneful foes of republican government

"There can be no greater error than to expect or calculate upon real favors from nation to nation. It is an illusion which experience must cure, which a just pride ought to discard . .

"The great rule of conduct for us in regard to foreign nations, is in extending our commercial relations to have with them as little political connection as possible.


