Woman, Who Killed Seven, Held Insane

ST. PAUL, Nebr. April 20 .-Mrs. Della Sorensen, 28 who confessed yesterday to killing by poison, seven persons, including two of her own children and husband, probably will be placed in the incane asylum, according to County Attorney Dobrey, following an investigna-tion. He said she was mentally unbalanced. The series of deaths extended over seven years. The woman related how she killed her baby, Deloris, and three-year old daughter, Minnie, the former because her "crying fretting" and the latter because she was afflicted with the St. Vitus' Dance. She poisoned her husband, she said, after a quarrel. She confessed to killing four other persons.

CHICAGO, Apr. 20.-Severe wind rainstorm nearly reaching tornado proportions in/some localities, swept a destructive course from Wiskilled, two score injured and property damage placed at \$1,500,000.
