

Police chase ends in fatal I-4 crash

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS — A police chase on Interstate-4 early Saturday morning left two people dead and two others injured after a sports utility vehicle rolled over.

The crash, which closed much of the six-lane highway nearly three-quarters of a mile west of the State Road 436 overpass, occurred as Seminole County sheriff's deputies attempted to pull over the driver of a white Ford Expedition.

The pursuit began at approximately 2:15 a.m. Saturday when an off-duty Seminole

County sheriff's deputy working security at Club 436, located at State Road 436 and Anchor Road, near Altamonte Springs, heard a gunshot.

According to witnesses, the shots were fired from inside the SUV while in the parking lot of the Joy gas station located next door to Club 436. When the officer called for back up, a sheriff's corporal and a deputy trainee on patrol nearby began following the SUV along State Road 436 toward the I-4

overpass. According to Steve Olson, public information officer of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, the deputies tried to stop the vehicle, but were not successful.

According to police reports, as the chase continued onto the westbound lanes of I-4 the SUV forced the sheriff's cruiser into a guardrail. The fleeing SUV then lost control and rolled over.

Calvin Bivins, 21, of Orlando, and Robert

Clark, Jr., 23, of Orlando, were both ejected from the vehicle and pronounced dead at the scene. David Rogers III, 23, and Terrence Taylor, 23, both of Orlando, were taken to Orlando Regional Medical Center and later released.

According to Olson, it is unclear as to the relationship of the four involved in the car chase.

"The other two have not been arrested," said Olson. "I'm not sure if they have been questioned."

According to Olson, the deputies were unharmed. They did not work the remain-

Honoring our troops: McClintock in Mediterranean for Operation Iraqi Freedom

Navy Petty Officer 3rd Class Paul D. McClintock, son of Nancy L. and William B. McClintock of Casselberry, is currently in the Mediterranean Sea in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. He is assigned to the command ship USS La Salle, forward deployed and homeported in Gaeta, Italy.

Sailors aboard McClintock's ship played a significant role in Operation Iraqi Freedom by overseeing daily sorties by carrier-based aircraft and Tomahawk Land Air Missile launches from cruisers and destroyers in the Eastern Mediterranean Sea.

USS La Salle has also been involved in a program developed and implemented to protect ships transiting the Strait of Gibraltar and entering the Suez Canal, which includes supply vessels of Military Sealift Command.

Command ships provide communications and accommodations for fleet commanders and staff. They are equipped with air and surface radars, helicopters, chaff launchers and an electronic warfare suite.

McClintock joined the Navy in September 1999.

Valdes files papers for bid to keep tax collector seat

SANFORD — Seminole County Tax Collector Ray Valdes filed the required papers last week to run for re-election.

Valdes, who is completing his fourth four-year term in office, will face District 1 Seminole County Commissioner Grant Malloy in what is expected to be one of the high profile local races in 2004.

"I've spent my time in office keeping Seminole County on the leading edge," Valdes said. "Other counties look to us to see how to run an efficient operation while providing good customer service and a good rate of return."

Valdes is a member of the Florida Tax Collectors Association, and his colleagues have elected him to every office within the organization. He also is the vice president of both the National Association of Treasurers and Finance Officers and the National Association of Hispanic County Officials. He has a presidential appointment on the Board of Directors of the National Association of County Officials.

If re-elected, Valdes said one of his goals is to convince state officials that counties can assist the state in issuing driver's licenses without charging citizens more for the service.

"Seminole County has only one place for people to get their driver's license," Valdes said. "We believe our office can offer more locations and better service. However, the state wants to charge citizens an extra \$5.25 for that convenience. I don't believe that is right."

Valdes said customer service is the key to a successful operation. "I come from the corporate world, and I went in believing that I could change the level of customer service for the better," said Valdes, who credits his employees with helping the tax collector's office earn top national awards.

Valdes is a graduate of the University of Georgia. He has earned the highest certification level in his field by completing 100 credit hours in a national program administered by the University of Tennessee.

"The man is a leader," said Paul Waricki, Valdes' deputy and

Rev. Scott retiring after 30 years

SANFORD — After 35 years in the ministry, Reverend Bruce Scott of the First Presbyterian Church of Sanford is retiring.

Born in Coffeyville, Kan., Scott's Presbyterian piety seems

to be genetic:

his father and younger brother, who sadly passed away at age 45, were both involved in the ministry.

"You don't decide on an occupation like

this," Scott said. "I felt the call of God." After high school, he attended Park College in Kansas, where he obtained a degree in Psychology. At age 22, he joined the United States Peace Corps and was sent to Colombia.

Two years later, desiring to be an ambassador for God and feeling His call, Scott enrolled in the Loveville Presbyterian Seminary.

"I got married twice in the same year there," he joked. "Once to my lovely wife and once to the Church. My two marriages are legal!" In April 1969, he married Jane, and at his graduation in September 1969, he married Presbyterianism.

"My wife has been a partner in ministry, active in church work, and she works full time at SCC as a librarian," said Scott. "I could not have done it without her."

Jane and Bruce have three daughters, two of whom are married. The youngest, Elizabeth, now leads the youth group of the First Presbyterian Church of Sanford.

"Her first child is due July 15," Scott remarked. "They're going to need a baby-sitter. I'm looking forward to the job."

Scott's first job as a reverend was in Cincinnati, Ohio where he stayed for 14 years. After that, he ventured south to Naples.

"I was in the ministry at Naples," Scott said, "and I heard about this church in Sanford being open." He submitted his papers, spoke with officials here, and committed to "marriage until retirement."

That was 10 years ago, and Reverend Scott has kept his word.

Seminole's McLain elected vice chairman of METROPLAN Orlando

ORLANDO — Seminole County Chairman Daryl McLain was elected vice chairman of METROPLAN Orlando last week.

McLain, who will begin his reign as vice chairman on July 1, is currently the secretary/treasurer of the organization. He will replace Orange County Commissioner Ted Edwards, who was named chairman for the upcoming 2003-2004 term, as the organization's second in command.

"The METROPLAN is the most impor-

tant transportation agency in Florida," said McLain. "For me to participate in this is important because that's how regional transportation issues are prioritized."

During McLain's one-year term, he will be responsible for facilitating meetings in the absence of the chairman and will serve on the executive committee, which formulates the organization's stance on transportation issues.

According to McLain, the natural progression of the organization is to promote the vice chairman to the

Central head of the organization the following year. If this holds true, McLain will become chairman during the 2004-2005 term.

This is McLain's second tour of duty with METROPLAN Orlando, a regional organization responsible for transportation planning in the Orlando metropolitan area, including Seminole, Orange and Osceola counties.

"There are 25 metroplan organizations in Florida, but we are the only regional one," said Robinson. "Since transportation doesn't stop at the

county lines, we have to plan regionally for our area."

The group is comprised of 19 voting members and seven non-voting members representing local governments and the region's largest transportation agencies.

"When voting on the elected officials, the board looks at the candidates service to the region and its transportation needs," said Muffet Robinson, director of communications and public outreach of METROPLAN Orlando.

The group is responsible for planning for

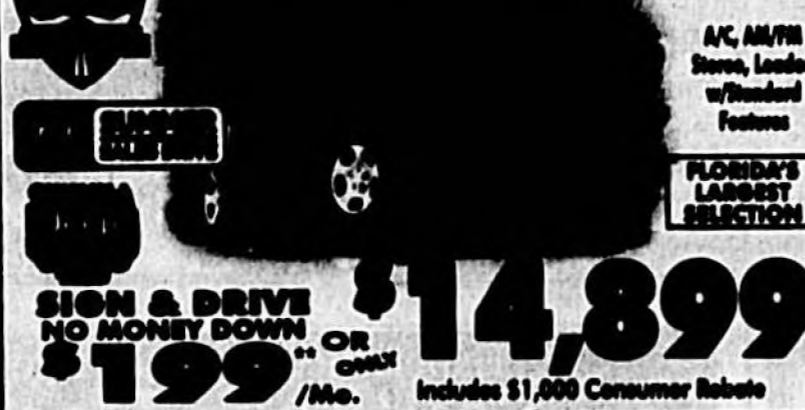

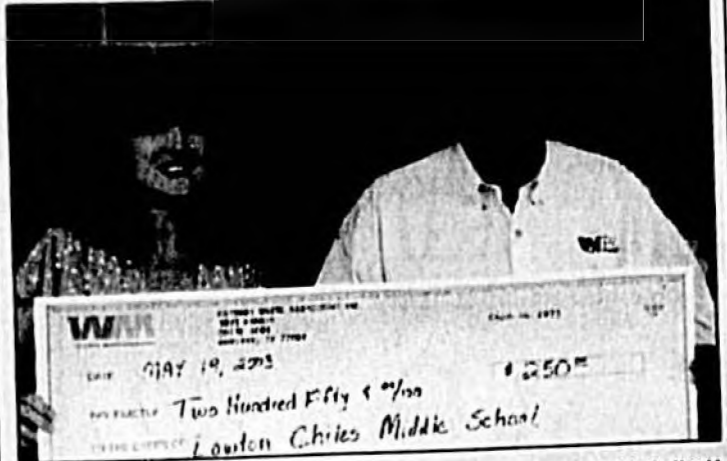

USDA Revises Citrus Crop Estimate

The U.S. Department of Agriculture increased the Florida orange crop forecast for the 2002-2003 season by 1 million boxes, raising the estimate from 200 million to 201 million boxes. The Valencia estimate was increased by 1 million boxes, from 88 million to 89 million boxes; however, the Early-Mid estimate stays unchanged at 112 million boxes. The Valencia crop harvest has increased due

to groves that have yet to be harvested. The grapefruit estimate was reduced in the white varieties by 300,000 boxes, resulting in the total grapefruit estimate being lowered from 39 million to 38.7 million boxes. The decrease is a result of unharvested fruit that will not be utilized for the season. Tangelos and Temples remain the same at 2.35 million boxes and 1.3 million boxes respectively. However, Tangerines increased slightly by 100,000

boxes to total 5.5 million boxes. The yield for frozen concentrated orange juice (FCOJ) to 1.52 gallons per 90-pound box of oranges. The Florida citrus industry has a \$9.1 billion economic impact to the state and employs nearly 90,000 people, directly and indirectly. Florida Citrus Mutual, founded in 1948, is the state's largest citrus grower's organization with more than 11,500 members.

campaign manager. "His colleagues in every organization he joins quickly sense his leadership-by-example style, his sharp ability to comprehend and solve problems and his straight-shooter attitude."

Campaigns for tax collector usually shape up as benign races, but the Valdes-Malloy race is expected to generate considerable attention.

"Having an announced opponent over a year before the election has prompted us to start our re-election campaign earlier than planned," Warsicki said.

Malloy, who filed his papers in early May, has said he plans to make an issue of what he sees as Valdes' ethical lapses.

According to publish reports in

the Orlando Sentinel, during his 14 years in office, Valdes and his family have purchased land, well below its worth, being auctioned for back taxes. The family has also purchased certificates that earn interest on people's delinquent taxes.

The Valdes camp fired backed that they intend to watch Malloy's actions on the county commission.

"I feel sure the citizens of Seminole county will watch closely to see if any major contributors to (Malloy) come from special interest groups or developers appearing before the county commission with projects for approval during his final 15 months," Warsicki said. "That would be seen as unethical to many people."

Sanford woman arrested on drug charges after police receive tip

SANFORD — Juanita Guerrero of Sanford was arrested early Friday morning on charges of drug trafficking and drug possession.

At approximately 5 a.m. Friday, Sanford Police Department's Special Tactical Unit conducted a search of Guerrero's home, located at 2800 Palmetto Avenue in

Sanford. Police received the tip about Guerrero's drug involvement through an anonymous call to the department's drug line.

"This is proof that the drug line does work and that we get positive results from it," said Investigator Gary D. Johnson of the Sanford Police Department. "We were able to shut down the house and get a bunch of drugs off the street."

According to Johnson, the

street value of the drugs found in the house owned by Guerrero and her husband, Federico, is unknown at this time.

Based on the information provided by the caller, police were able to request a search warrant and arrest the 48-year-old on charges of possession of less than 20 grams of marijuana, two counts of possession and/or use of narcotic equipment or drug paraphernalia, and three counts of

possession and trafficking of more than 14 grams of amphetamines, including crystal meth.

Guerrero, owner of Fred's Tire Service in Lake Monroe, is being held under medium security at the John E. Polk Correction Facility. Bail has not been set. An arraignment is set for July 8.

After three laps, the workout is finished.

"It doesn't matter when you come into the center," Pruefer said. "It's easy to filter into the workout. And, after you have used each machine three times, you know you are finished."

Although Pruefer owns the Lake Mary franchise, Ladies Workout Express is part of Lady of America. The corporation is recognized as the world's largest chain of full-service, women's only fitness centers and is headquartered in Fort Lauderdale. Established in 1984 with a single location in Houston, Texas, currently there are more than 600 Lady of America and Ladies Workout Express fitness clubs serving more than 1 million members throughout the world.

Pruefer decided to purchase a franchise from the corporation after she — like so many women — struggled with diets and traditional gyms to lose weight. Always an exercise buff, she needed to find an alternative to high-impact fitness routines after she had back surgery.

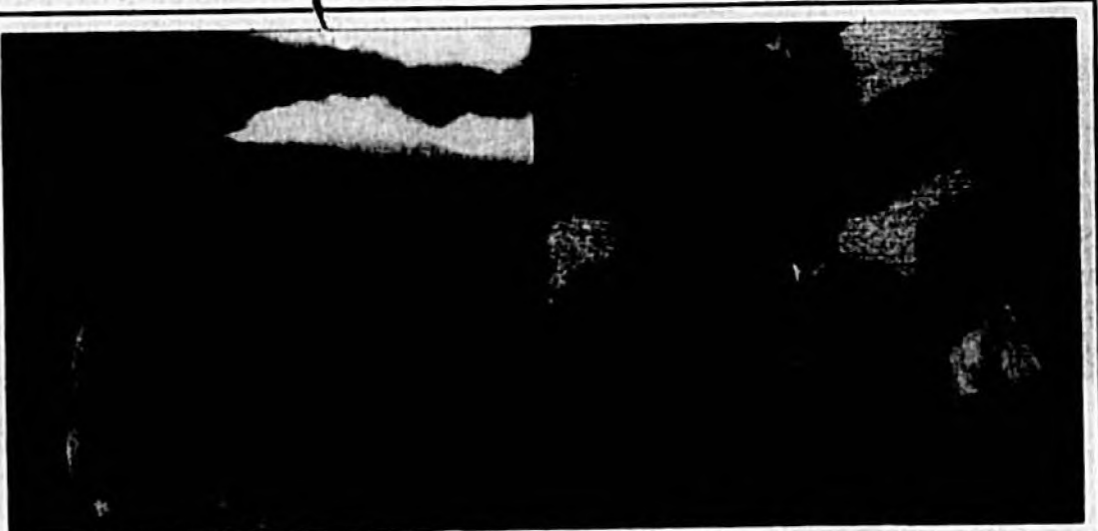

"I wish we could have won more games," said Lombardo. "But we're still a .500 team and I was very encouraged with the effort I saw on the field today (Saturday)."

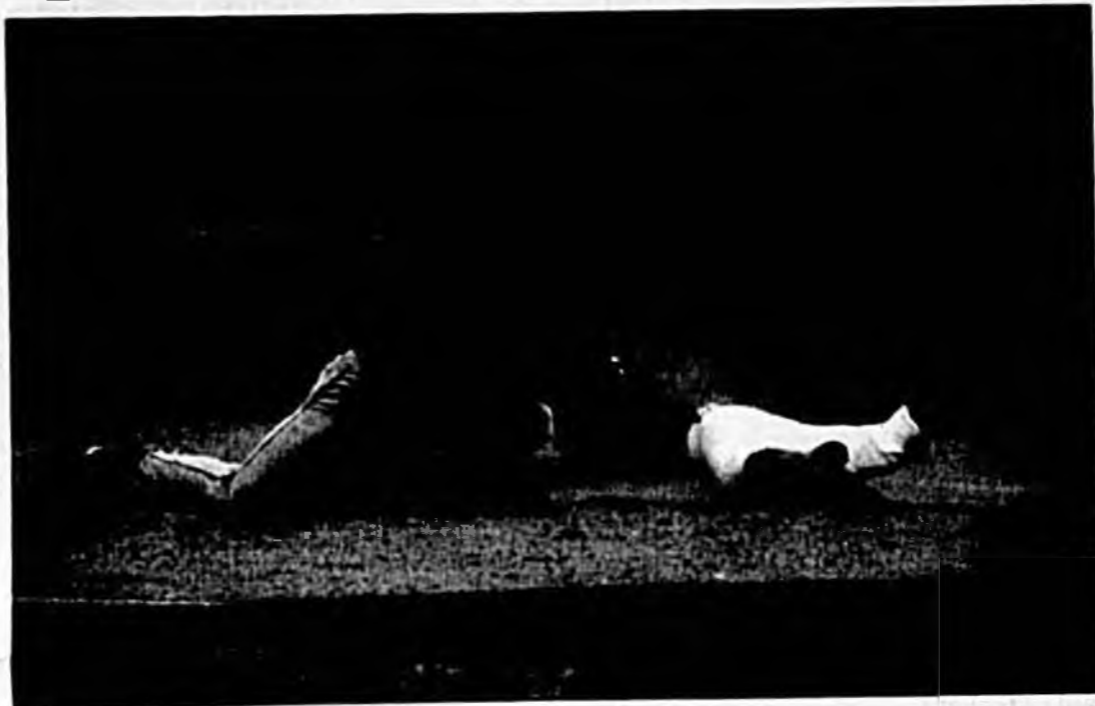
"One reason we are struggling right now is because we have several infielders banged up and our defense has suffered, but we'll get better."

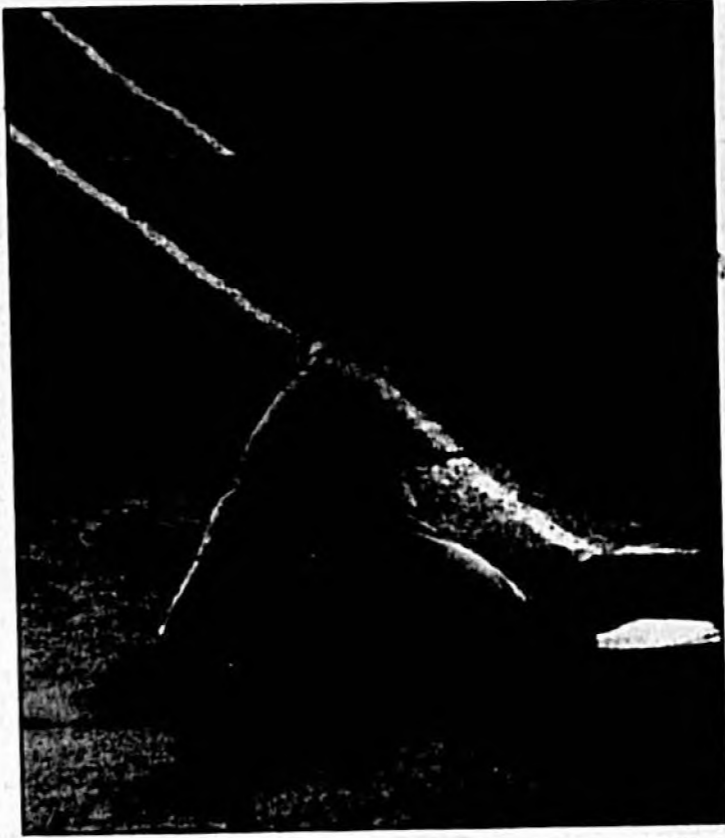
Ryan Horton hurled a complete-game, two-hitter and his offense exploded for all six runs in the fifth inning as the Scorpions blanked Brevard, 6-
