Sheriff says bar skirts the rules

Problems at Wavie's Nightclub in Sanford causes commissioners to reconsider ordinance

SANFORD — During Tuesday's Seminole County Board of County Commission meeting, the Seminole County Sheriff's Office requested an amendment to the county's current alcoholic beverage ordinance. The current ordinance states that it is illegal to sell alcoholic beverages between the hours of 2 and 7 a.m. within Seminole County. The proposed amendment would also make it illegal for a patron to possess an open container, prohibiting the consump-

tion of alcohol, between the same hours. The rule would apply to establishments licensed to store, sell or serve alcohol.

Commission unanimously voted to move forward with the amendment. The next step is to bring the topic to the public arena for discussion.

According to records, the proposed amendment is a direct result of several inci-

dent reports filed by the sheriff's office at Wavie's Nightclub in Sanford.

In a letter to Commission, Sheriff Donald F. Eslinger writes, "Due to an increased number of citizen complaints and incidents requiring Sheriff's Office response, it has come to my attention that Wavies Bar in Sanford has established a practice of allowing patrons to remain in the establishment

after 2 a.m. The problem arises in that the patrons are purchasing packaged bottles of liquor at Wavies, prior to 2 a.m., and consuming the alcoholic beverages in the nightclub after the club discontinues liquor service."

According to Eslinger, it is the sheriff's office hope that this amendment will allow the Florida Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco (FDABT), whose mission is to effectively supervise the distribution of alcoholic beverages and tobacco products to

Benefit walk to aid MS research set for Saturday

A benefit walk for individuals suffering from multiple sclerosis will be held Saturday at Fleet Peeples Park in Winter Park.

More than 9,000 mid-Floridians are currently diagnosed with multiple sclerosis, a chronic disease of the central nervous system that interferes with the brain's ability to send and receive messages.

The MS Walk, sponsored by the Mid-Florida Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society, is scheduled to begin at 9 a.m., with registration at 8 a.m., and will include a 5K and 10K walk.

Approximately 40 percent of the funds raised during the MS Walk will go toward international research to find a cure. Since its establishment in 1947, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has spent more than \$260 million on research.

The remaining 60 percent of the money will remain in the tri-county area of Seminole, Orange and Osceola counties to provide programs and support to those suffering from the disease.

The walk brings people together in the spirit of service to help raise money for the discovery of a cure, treatment options and finding the causes of multiple sclerosis," said volunteer Fred Gaines, whose daughter, Elizabeth, was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis 18 years ago. "To know that the patients and their families are not alone is important. It brings people together for a common cause. At Saturday's walk, you will see multiple sclerosis patients, families, extended families, people they work with and people they worship with. It's amazing to see all the lives that are touched by knowing someone who has multiple sclerosis.

"It makes your heart feel good," he added.

Gaines and his wife, Ruth, are coordinators of the MS Walk. They are both part of the Mid-Florida Chapter of Multiple Sclerosis, one of 63 branches in the nation. Founded in 1958, the chapter handles a 23 county area servicing more than 9,000 people diagnosed with multiple sclerosis and more than 30,000 family members.

The local group provides a wide range of services, including educational programs, self-help groups, research, medical equipment loan costs, transportation, referrals and literature.

Museum vital resource for African American arts

In the mid-1990s, Irene D. Johnson discovered there was a scarce amount of African American artwork displayed in local museums.

The Crooms Academy graduate felt it was a problem that couldn't be ignored. So, in 1994, she founded DeLand's African American Museum of the Arts.

"Wherever my husband and I have lived, we always became members of the local museums," Johnson said "When we moved to Deltona in 1989, we joined the DeLand Museum of Art. As members we toured other area museums, and I saw that there was no artwork by or of African Americans. That just wasn't right. I decided I wanted to get something done before I leave here — before I leave this world."

Johnson discussed her ideas with others, and a group quickly formed to rectify the situation. By 1995, the African American Museum of Arts received non-profit status and was raising money to establish a center for African American and Caribbean American culture and arts.

The next step was finding a building for the project. Johnson and her board of directors considered numerous locations, including space in strip malls and downtown buildings.

"At that time, we just wanted a place to put a telephone," she said. "But, we wanted to make the center accessible to blacks, so we decided on a DeLand location."

Johnson believes it was her charismatic

personality and a little divine intervention that finally helped the non-profit group find a place to call home. While searching for space, Johnson discovered a building in

Hip-hop record producer murdered

CASSELBERRY — The owner of Orlando-based Max-A-Million Records, Wilfredo "Big Wil" Rivera, was fatally wounded inside a Casselberry strip mall Sunday.

Rivera, best known for representing and producing underground hip-hop artists in Central Florida, was shot while inside Eye Communication Design in Casselberry. He later died at Florida Hospital in Orlando.

According to reports, Michael Madison of Orlando was with Rivera inside the store at the time of the shooting. At approximately 12:30 a.m. Sunday, two Hispanic males overpowered Rivera and Madison to gain entrance to the business. After taking a gun from Rivera, both men were pistol-whipped and Rivera was shot.

Madison drove Rivera to a nearby gas station to contact police. Rivera was then taken to the hospital and officials began an investigation.

"We're still following up on leads," said Steve Olson, public information officer of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office. "We're making headway, but nothing that has led to an arrest."

According to Olson, officials are uncertain why Rivera and Madison were at Eye Communications Design and how the two gained entrance. Rivera had previously operated a business at that location and it is believed that he had access to the building.

As the producer of such hip-hop acts as Sonny Chulo, Southstar (previously known as Northstar), Chi-Chi Yeyo and Jonny Bravo, Rivera was well known in the Central Florida music scene. According to Ozone Magazine, he was also known for using violence to resolve business conflicts.

According to an article published before Rivera's death in Ozone Magazine, he had turned his professional life around. In the March article, Rivera said, "Lately, I've learned to conduct myself as a business man. We're not here to be hoodlums in the street, we're trying to make money. But we're still got to handle our business."

Max-A-Million recently earned its first hip-hop award from radio station Live 95-FM for Chulo hav-

Volunteer angels flying in Central Florida's sky help save hundreds of lives

"I love to fly and like to do something worthwhile when I fly," said Pringle.

Angel Flight Southeast, a non-profit organization, provides and arranges free transportation for people who require medical treatment and must travel long distances. The treatment may include chemotherapy, emergency relief flights, transplants, compassionate care and more.

"It took one phone call," said Dr. Smith. "Less than ten minutes this guy I'd never met, and who had never met me, said that my trans-

portation problems from Miami to Tallahassee were over. I can't say enough about them."

The organization started in 1982 in California under the name American Medical Support Flight Team (AMSFT). The members wanted to ensure that the cost of transportation wouldn't be an obstacle in getting the necessary medical care.

A retired Lake Wales woman named Mary Webb created an AMSFT team in Florida in 1984. She operated out of her home, gaining more pilots and organiz-

ing different groups to form the Air Care Alliance. In 1992 AMSFT changed to Angel Flight Southeast. Pringle and his son moved it to Leesburg when Mary could no longer run it.

"Aviation is not a cheap hobby and this is the way the pilots are giving back," said Lee Johnson, CEO of Angel Flight Southeast "To call a pilot at 2 a.m. to fly a total stranger for a life saving transplant; that's an angel."

Since its inception, Angel Flight has flown an increasing number of flights each year. From 237 flights

in 1995 to more than 1,100 in 2001, the requests for flights continues to grow. Angel Flight flew 100 missions in the month of January alone.

"It's been on a continual growth track since was founded and our goal is to make sure the organization keeps up with the needs of the people," said Johnson.

There is a need for as many as 10,000 missions a year. The organization has yet to reach that goal, primarily because word is slow to

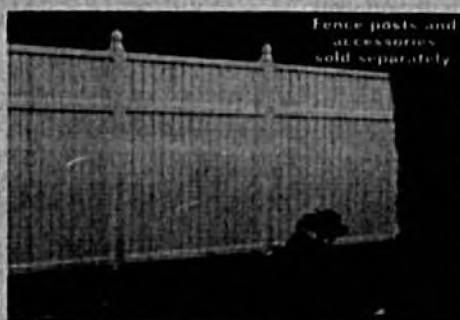

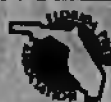

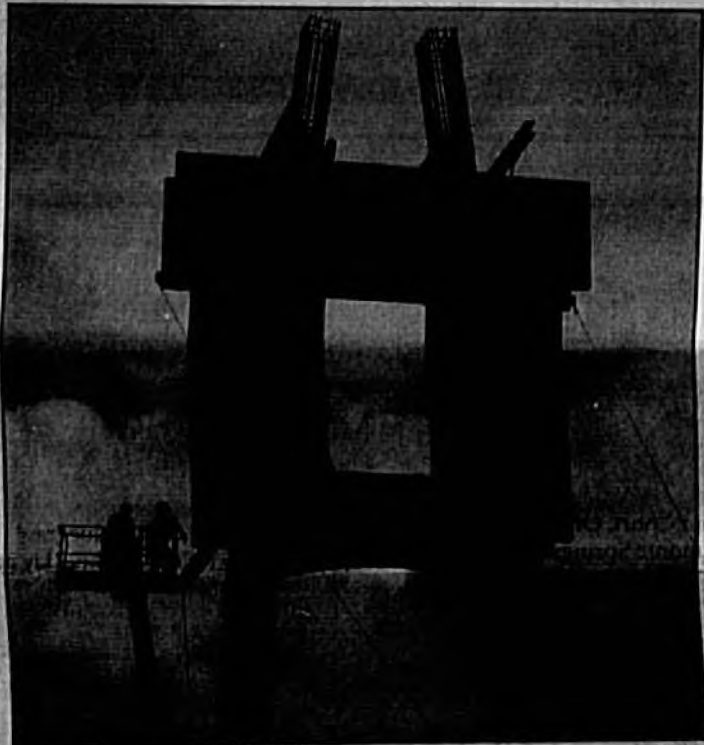

No change to citrus estimate

The U.S. Department of Agriculture made no changes to its orange crop forecast for the 2002-2003 season, which remains at 199 million boxes.

The Early and Midseason varieties, which include 5.5 million boxes of Navels, remain at 113 million boxes.

In addition, the Valencia estimate remains at 86 million boxes.

Specialty fruit estimates remain the same with Tangerines at 5 million boxes; Tangelos at 2.4 million boxes; and Temples at 1.4 million boxes. The grapefruit estimate, remains at 40 million boxes.

A minor decrease was made in the yield for frozen concentrated orange juice (FCOJ), which was decreased from 1.57 gallons per 90-pound box of oranges to 1.55 gallons per 90-pound box of oranges.

The Florida citrus industry has a \$9.1 billion economic impact to the state and employs nearly 90,000 people, directly and indirectly.

Florida Citrus Mutual, founded in 1948, is the state's largest citrus grower's organization with more than 11,000 members.

the historic Spring Hill community that she considered perfect for the museum.

The building, located at 325 S. Clara Ave., was owned by the DeLand Housing Authority. After meeting with officials from the organization, a permanent location for the museum was found at a monthly rent of \$125.

"I think they realized they were looking at a person who wanted to improve the community and wasn't looking for anything in return," Johnson said. "Actually, I did want something. I wanted it to succeed."

Success is nothing new to Johnson. Born in Sanford, she was valedictorian when she graduated from Crooms Academy in 1947. After high school, she attended college in St. Augustine until a professor encouraged her to move to Washington, D.C., and work for the government.

"He said to me, 'I don't know why you are staying in Florida,'" she said. "At the time, Florida was extremely segregated and there weren't many opportunities for me."

When Johnson arrived in Washington, D.C., she procured a job with the Commerce Department. She earned enough money to return to school and enrolled at Howard University

in 1950. Around the same time, she met Maxwell Johnson, who she soon married.

Johnson graduated from Howard in 1954 with a bachelor of arts degree in history and government. As a result of Maxwell's seminary work, the couple moved to Detroit and then Richmond, Va., where Johnson was hired by the U.S. Treasury Department.

Eventually, the couple moved to Baltimore, Md., where they remained for more than three decades. Johnson began a career in education and obtained two master's degrees in the field. She retired at the age of 57; and in 1989, she decided it was time to return to Florida.

"When we retired, we went on all the cruises we wanted to go on," Johnson said. "That's when we joined the museum and realized there was a need for a place that would shape the thinking of young African Americans in a positive and self-affirming manner."

Using the interpersonal skills and education she acquired throughout the years, Johnson organized a fund-raising cam-

aign for the museum. She came up with the "founding members" concept and asked organizations and individuals to donate \$1,000 for the cultural arts center. More than \$24,000 was initially raised to renovate and restore the DeLand facility.

In 1998, the museum opened. Today, it houses a revolving gallery, where visitors will find works of both established and emerging artists. Six major exhibits are displayed each year.

The museum is also the home to a permanent collection of more than 150 artifacts, including sculptures and masks from African countries. In 1999, the museum founded the Little Theater of DeLand to give children and adults the opportunity to develop their dramatic abilities.

After-school classes in photography, arts and crafts, music and creative writing and dance are also conducted for elementary and middle school children. A summer art camp is sponsored each year, where students visit local museums and historical places and attend concerts and plays.

"These programs are a perfect starting place for anyone seeking to enhance their knowledge and appreciation of African American and Caribbean American cultures," Johnson said.

After the museum opened, Johnson, along with the board of directors, began thinking about expansion. She learned that a parcel of land across from the museum also belonged to the DeLand Housing Authority.

"I approached them and told them that we would like to buy the facility we were in and the parcel of land," she said. "They said, 'no, we can't sell it, but we will donate it to you.'"

There was one stipulation. The building had to remain a museum for a minimum of five years.

"I told them we were not about to do anything else with the museum," she said.

On Oct. 5, it will be five years. Along with the growing number of programs at the current facility, expansion has already begun on the parcel of land.

In 2002, the museum was one of seven organizations to receive a grant from Volusia County's

ECHO (Environmental, Cultural, Historic and Outdoor recreation) program. The \$100,000 grant is for Phase I of the facility's new cultural park and amphitheater. Construction should be completed on the project this summer. Plans for Phase 2, which includes building a new and larger museum and renovating the current facility, are currently under way.

There's a reason why Irene and Maxwell, who is the co-founder and executive director of the museum, are moving so quickly and efficiently in establishing one of the area's only African American art museums.

"We don't have time to take it slowly," Irene said. "And, we want the community to know that seniors can still be valuable people."

"To us, this is what it means to be retired."

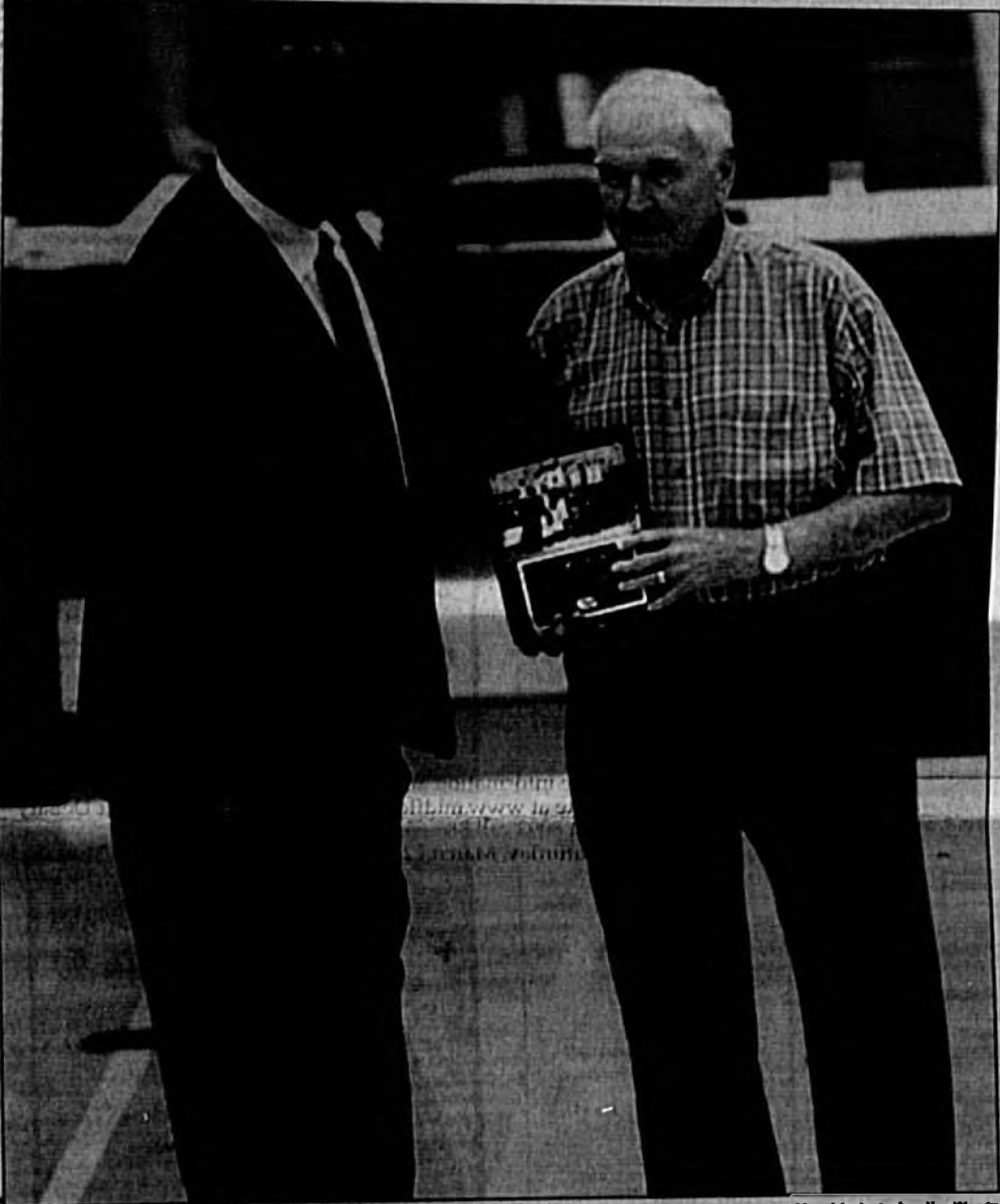
Prior to Saturday's sweep the Raiders lost to Hillsborough by the score of 13-3 on February 28th.

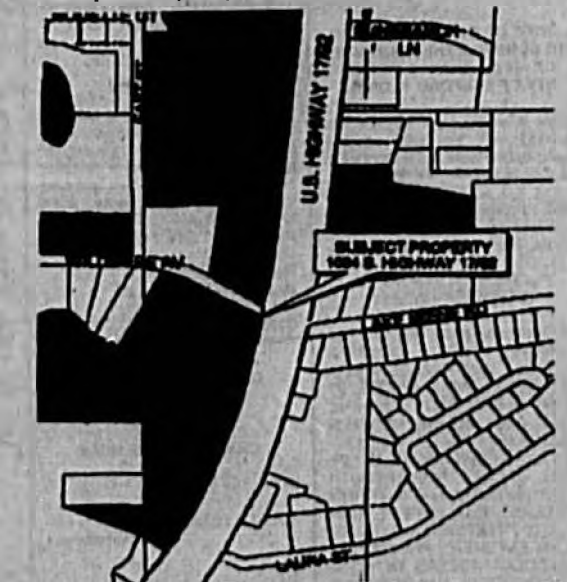

consumers, to assist with the complaints. FDABT has previously indicated it cannot take action because the Seminole County ordinance regarding the restriction of alcoholic beverages is too vague.

"Clarifying this aspect ... will enable agents from the FDABT and our deputy sheriffs to more efficiently and uniformly enforce the ordinance in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of our community," Eslinger states.

The proposed amendment will be discussed during an upcoming public hearing session. The time and day of the session is still to be determined.

At deadline, Wavie's Nightclub, located at 1905 Southwest Road, was unavailable for comment.

Other items to note, the com-

mission:

- Voted unanimously to adopt a resolution making the month of March "American Red Cross Month."

- Approved a resolution recognizing Dianne "Dede" Schaffner as the recipient of the "Success Award for Business Achievement," presented by Success in Seminole magazine. spread in the aviation community.

"We don't have the resources to make sure that everyone knows we exist," said Johnson. "The aviation resources exist to fly a lot more missions. In Florida there are 45,000 registered pilots and let's say that half are still current. They fly one mission a year, that's more than 20,000 missions."

Of its missions, 73 percent of the people it flies, fly more than once. Many of those multi-trip flyers are participating in clinical trials and medical studies. Hospitals or insurance companies usually pay for such cutting-edge treatment but require patients to arrange for their own transportation.

The reactions to the service Angel Flight provides vary, according to Johnson, because the people are going through extremely difficult times. Angel Flight doesn't always hear back from patients, but when it does the patients are very thankful. They recently received a call from Blue Cross Blue Shield of South Carolina who wants to honor two pilots that flew a girl down to Florida with a rare form of cancer. The flight saved the girl's arm from amputation and put the cancer into remission.

"I know all the good I've done

when I rest my head on my pillow at night and that's a wonderful feeling," said Johnson. "That's one you don't get doing commercial real estate or a political stand point."

A patient's flight may take them across the country and because of that, many may be involved in a single mission. Angel Flight Southeast will fly the patient as far as possible in its five-state region — South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama and Mississippi — before pilots from other regions take over.

The same practice occurs with-

in the region, as well. Pringle's flight to Miami is a good example. He transported the Haitian patient from Miami to Leesburg, where a second pilot completed the final leg of the trip to Tallahassee.

Angel Flight Southeast makes up a part of the national organization. Angel Flight America not only helps those with medical problems, but also relocates battered spouses and assists in disaster relief. After Sept. 11, Angel Flight flew blood, firefighters and grief counselors to New York and Washington D.C.

Some pilots remain on 24 hour call in case an emergency flight is necessary such as a transplant. At the moment, 600 pilots volunteer their time to Angel Flight. They use their own aircraft, might rent aircraft or belong to flight clubs. They also help in the regional office doing input and mission coordination. Johnson hopes to organize chapters in Seminole,

Orange and Osceola counties to help spread the word and share responsibilities.

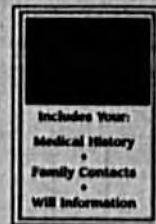
