GUARDSMEN GET INCREASE IN PAY ROLL

UNCLE SAM BELIEVES THAT LABORER IS WORTHY OF HIRE

Washington, July 28. Increased pay for officers and men of the regular army and national guard in general, improved camp conditions to safeguard their health and authorization for them to vote in the field at the coming presidential election were provided in amendments to the army appropriation bill approved today by the senate.

By a vote of 41 to 13 the senate also suspended the rules to adopt an amendment changing the age limit of enlistment in the regular army from eighteen to twenty-one years without the consent of parents or guardians. Under the provision men under twenty-one now serving in the army would not be retained in the service unless they filed within thirty days the written consent of their parents or guardians.

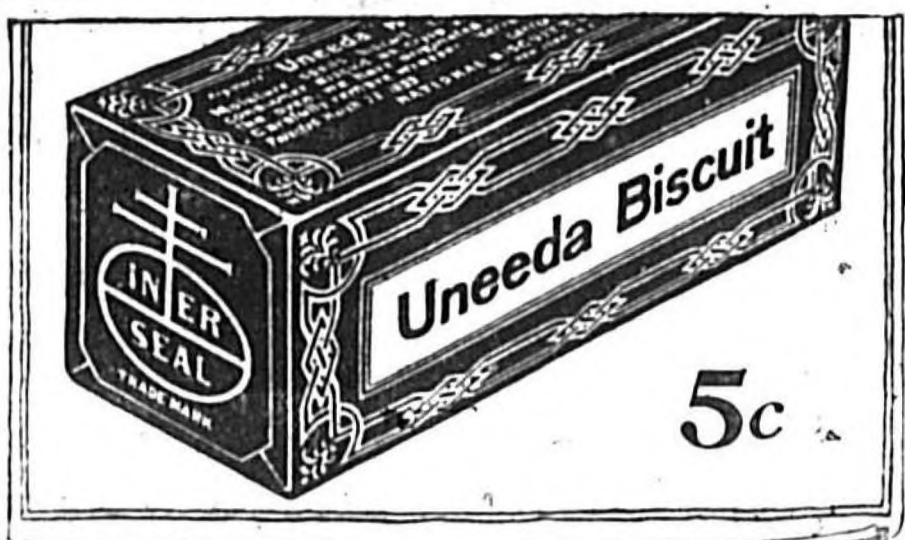

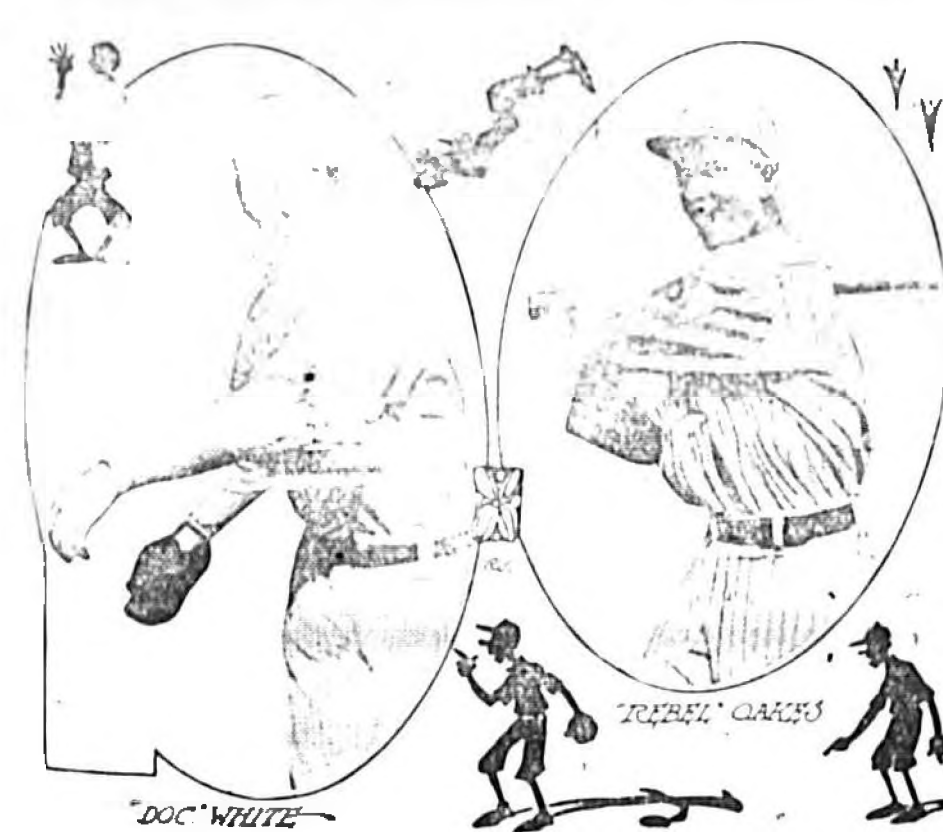

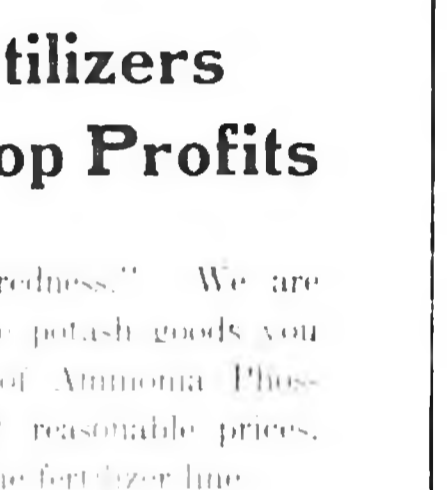
