BISHOP, Va. (UPI)- An explosion ripped through a two-miledeep section of a Pocahontas Fuel Co. mine here today, trapping 22 men. A company spokesman said 166 other miners fled to safety, Two rescue squadrons of 15 men. each began working their way toward the trapped men. The rescue squads were equipped with portable telephone equipment and were expected to begin reporting to the mine office during the afternoon. Roland C. Luther, company vice president at the scene, said he did not know whether the missing men were dead or allve.

The survivors fied by foot and of flatcar from the miles of tunels that run beneath the West Virginia-Virginia border in this mountainous area. The blast occurred in the same mine where 37 men died in an explosion Feb.

Luther said 14 miners about ,500 feet from the blast area telephoned immediately after the explosion and said they were barricading themselves. But when it was found that the ventilation system was not affected in their area.


