Florida A Step Ahead In Handling Problem?

Herald Staff Writer Florida has more potentially hazardous waste dump sites than any other state, according to a recent federal study, but a local Department of Environmental Regulation (DER) pokesman said that's good news.

The U.S. House of Representatives Government Operations abcommittee named 54 sites in Florida that are at risk of contaminating ground water. Although the report did not accuse owners of operators of specific sites of polluting the ground water, it said the list of potential contaminating areas s significant because of its considerable number. But Florida residents should not be concerned because this

state led the list, said Tom Hunnicutt, district engineer for the The list was derived primarily from reports made to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) by personnel of each state, he said. It included reports of unlined ponds above a usable ground water aquifer and within one mile of a potential water supply well.



On The Curious **Soviet Diplomacy**

As the Iran-Iraq war continues with no end i sight, the pattern of Soviet diplomacy in a region vital to the survival of the West becomes, to borrow a phrase, curiouser and curiouser. The Kremlin's official position is one of neutrality and non-intervention. Indeed, shortly after fighting began in earnest on Sept. 22 Moscow declared that an Iran-Iraq war could benefit only the "imperialists," meaning the United States and allies. The Russians coupled that pronouncement with a call for negotiations between the Iranians and the Iragis.

This seemingly benign policy of neutrality and non-intervention was reportedly "confirmed" in a Sept. 25 note from Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev to Secretary of State Edmund Muskie. Subsequent events, however, suggest that the Soviets are in fact arranging assistance and western states, Sen. 




