ROOSEVELT In Another Campaign Move By Roosevelt

NEW YORK, Dec. 26.—When President Roosevelt appointed H. Charles Hays to be chairman of the Federal Alcohol Control Administration he was moving toward the consummation of a move which has carried his actions since he first took office. Whereas New York State has for its "liquor czar" a former politician, named in the eyes of restaurant and a member of the party in power, the Federal control of liquor has been placed in the hands of a Republican, comparatively unknown to public life and steeped in the traditions of a distinguished lineage.

The move strongly upon the subject of temperance and thinks that now we, as a nation, are on the right road toward attaining it.

"I believe," he said, "that the average man does not consider that he is committing a crime when he takes a drink. No amount of law could make him feel that he is. That is the principal cause for the failure of prohibition."

To surround the obtaining of liquor with stringent regulations will not further the cause of temperance. That is what we must look out for now. The more laws we have, the more people who will not obey them, and the more laws we have, the more people who will not obey them.

"I had ample proof of that during prohibition. If the individual liquor laws were made law, they are unenforceable. They will not stand up to the temptations and the temptations will win from which we have suffered. Freedom is the greatest ally temperance can have. It cannot be attained through laws but by education."

"I am reasonably sure, now that the Eighteenth Amendment has been repealed, that drinking will decrease. The young people will no longer consider it smart to carry hip flasks. Moreover, when a man wants a drink and goes to a decent place and get it without breaking the law, the speaking will die."

"What about the saloon?" I asked.

"The saloon has never been abolished. It turned into something worse. The saloon in itself was not the real evil. It was the focus behind it which did the damage."

"The man whose name appeared above the door of the old saloon rarely earned it. He was a dummy for the firm which supported the liquor. As such he was compelled to start producing liquor; otherwise, the place would be taken away from him. Under our new regulations, saloonkeepers can have no interest in retail establishments nor can they take up as a retailer's handling of their particular lines. This will change the character of drinking places. Of course, much has been said about the evils of the bar. I do not see much difference between drinking standing and drinking sitting down. However, many problems still remain to be worked out."

"Some people," he continued, "looked with horror toward what they felt would happen on the first night of repeal. The fanatical cry predicted an orgy of drunkenness. Instead of this, the saloonkeepers refused to sell drinks, and these people who were so concerned went to hotels, where they drank moderately. From no large cities were there any reports of an unusual number of arrests from drunkenness."

"The drying up of the week-end strong me, as particularly noted. Of course many of them decided to go straight and get it done. But beyond that, what happened showed that men who had not hesitated to break what they considered a tyrannical law were content to stay a national law."

"It may be a little time before the small bootlegger is really driven out of business, but I do not think that he will be a mere nuisance for long. Being prohibition there were too many bootleggers. They were scattered in all parts of the country, and it was impossible to control them."

Legion Officials Police Hold 4 Seek Revision Of 1933 Economy Act

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26.—(AP)—American Legion officials estimated recently that the Amendment of the economy act they have suggested to President Roosevelt would increase the budget for the next fiscal year by approximately \$70,000,000. Of this, it was said, \$10,000,000 would go to widows and orphans of veterans.

The national commander, Edward Hayes, told reporters adoption of the amendment would affect one-fourth of the saving resulting from the veterans section of the economy act.

Other Legion requests on the legislative slate are for expansion of the army, building of the navy to London treaty strength, and congressional action upon the Legion's universal draft bill as recommended by the war policies commission in its 1928 report.

Explaining the Legion's views regarding widows and orphans care, Hayes said they should be given benefits and relief on the same basis as awards are now accorded to those in the Spanish American War under the economy act.

The Legion wants a regular army of 14,000 officers and 150,000 enlisted men, as compared with the present proposal of 10,000 officers and 112,700 enlisted men and a national guard of 250,000 men and 100,000 officers.

ROOSEVELT TO HIS CONGRESS READY

House Clerk Will Read
Annual Note Before
2 Bodies On Jan. 3

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26.—(AP)—President Roosevelt's first annual message to Congress will be delivered on Jan. 3—the first day of the session—for reading by the House clerk.

Speaker Rainey said yesterday that contrary to reports, the President did not plan to deliver the message in person but some of Mr. Roosevelt's advisors are still urging him to appear in person to deliver the message to a joint session of the Senate and House.

Democrats are contending that the country is more back of the President than a few months ago and that they are prepared to follow him in his recommendations. Republicans generally are saying little and awaiting developments.

Speaker Rainey said he expects the ordinary and extraordinary budgets to call for appropriations in excess of \$2,000,000,000 for the fiscal year 1934. This includes the budget estimates of \$3,600,000,000 for ordinary expenses of the government.

Of the balance, about \$1,700,000,000 is to be asked for continuation of the Public Works Employment program; about \$500,000,000 for Federal Relief; additional capital for the Reconstruction Corporation for business stimulation; and varying sums for other government enterprises.

First on the legislative calendar, Rainey said, would be a bill for the repeal of the Volstead Act as it applies to the District of Columbia, territories and possessions. This is to be followed by the liquor

message and a message concerning the first day of the session. It will call for a \$2 billion levy on deficits, to be carried on beer, retail present liquor duties on wines, spirits and brew, all the revenues from these sources, estimated at more than \$200,000,000, to go into the Federal treasury.

The President's budget message will be received by Congress on the second day of the session. Indications are that the President, under the authority granted him in the Economy Act, may restore 5 percent of the Federal pay cut effective Jan. 1, in view of increased living costs. The budgets for the next fiscal year, beginning July 1, provided for restoration of the full 15 percent.

been granted; after 25 years Spanish War veterans are required to prove their disabilities to be service connected, notwithstanding the government admits that there are no competent records to prove them; and its administration is aimed at saving money, not justice and fairness.

Also it gives only meager pitance to helpless and aged Spanish War veterans; it deprives needy Spanish War veterans of hospital and domiciliary benefits; it fails to recognize the service of men actually sent to war; it refuses to recognize disabilities due to improper food and sanitation; it humiliates the Spanish War veterans by making them objects of charity. Spanish War veterans are of an average age of 60 years and the government as well as industry will not employ them because of their age; a careful survey shows 52 per cent of Spanish War veterans were entirely dependent upon their pensions for an existence and 23 per cent partially dependent; its passage was not necessary to maintain the credit of the United States Government as claimed, as is shown by the fact that twelve billion dollars was appropriated after its passage for other purposes, which amount offsets two hundred times the amount taken from Spanish War veterans.
