The Meterist's Tax Dollar

Although more than one billion dollars were paid last year to the States in special highway tolls by motorist taxpayers, it is estimated according to the United States News, that only 40 cents of each dollar was directly spent

on state highway systems.

What happened to the motorist's tax dollar as estimated by the American Petroleum Industries Committee from reports of the Federal Bureau of Roads, was this, the News says:

Actually spent in road construction and maintenance

State highways, 40 cents.
Allocated for city streets and local roads, 25 cents.
Diverted to non-highway purposes, 16 cents.
Payments on debts incurred to build roads, 14 cents. Administration expense, 4 cents.

State police, 1 cent.
"Total reported diversion of highway funds last year," explains the News, "amounted to more than one-third of the total tax funds actually spent in the improvement of the State highway systems. In about 20 States, diversion amounted to 10 percent or more of the total road tolls paid by the motorists. In several States the amount of diversion exceeded the amount of money actually expended on the state highway systems.

"In New Jersey, for example, the road tax funds aggregated \$43,104,000 last year. Only 25 percent was spent for actual improvement of roads in the State highway system.!






