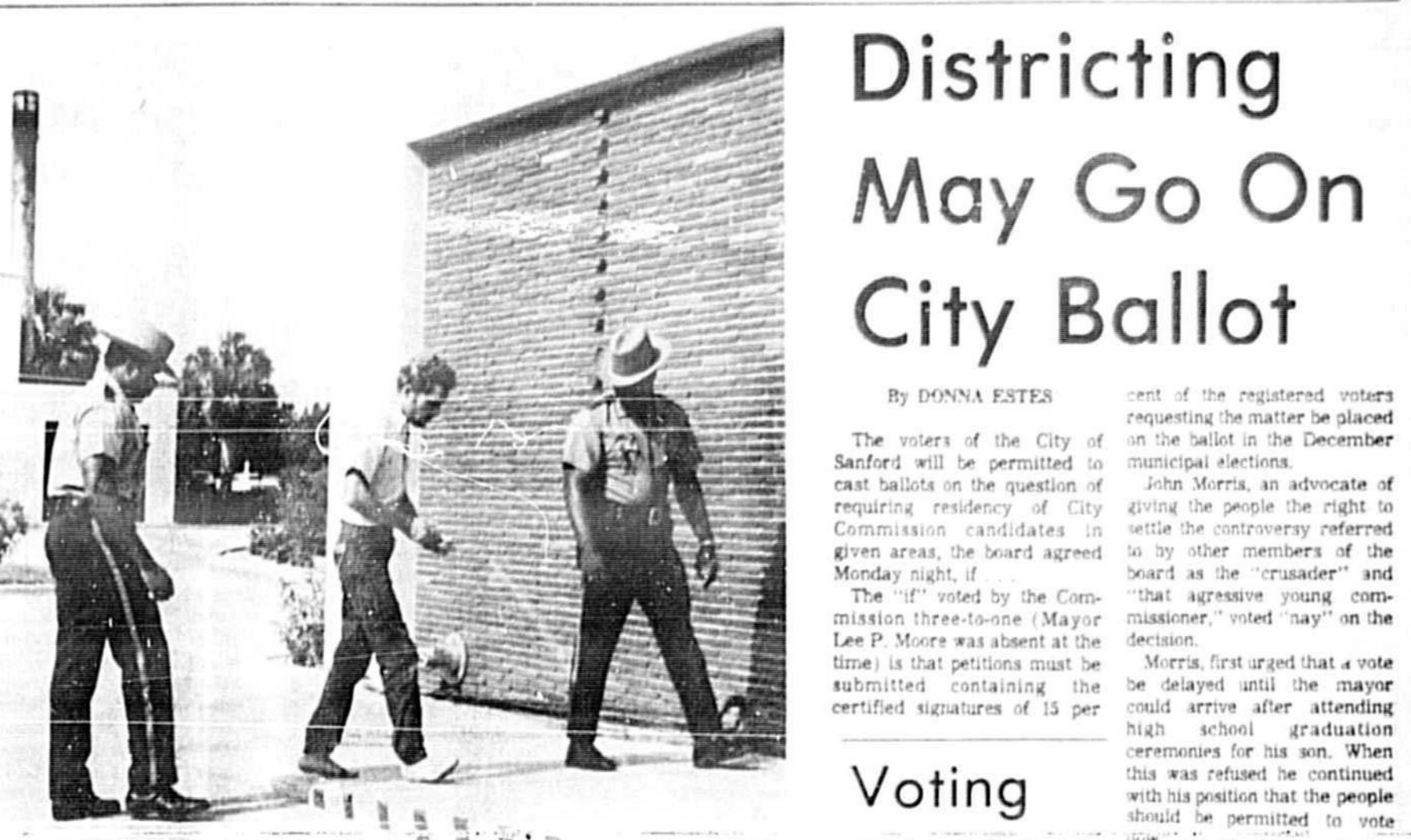

James Everett Brown made one unsuccessful escape attempt today, and Sheriff John Fulk made sure he could not make another.

As it turned out, his real name is Brown and he is an escapee from a Tampa jail. He is charged with breaking and entering with intent to commit a felony and with the Tampa Police Department.

James Everett Brown, 25, of Charleston, W. Va., was coming out of the courthouse where he had been taken for counsel appointment. When he reached the bottom of the steps he kicked off his shoes and dashed across Park Avenue and along side the Masonic Building.

Judge Saff, noting there is "no hope that in the future you will be law abiding," sentenced the 24-year-old former Winter Park resident to "not less than 30 years and not more than life" at a state prison.

Districting May Go On City Ballot

The voters of the City of Sanford will be permitted to cast ballots on the question of requiring residency of City Commission candidates in given areas, the board agreed Monday night.

The "if" voted by the Commission three-to-one (Mayor Lee P. Moore was absent at the time) is that petitions must be submitted containing the certified signatures of 15 per cent of the registered voters requesting the matter be placed on the ballot for the December municipal elections.

John Morris, an advocate of giving the people the right to vote on the question referred to by other members of the board as the "crusader" and "aggressive young commissioner," voted "no" on the decision.

Morris first argued that a vote be delayed until the mayor could arrive after attending high school graduation ceremonies for his son. When this was refused he continued with his position that the people should be permitted to vote.

Water Deal Is Near At Casselberry

CASSELBERRY — The city's acquisition of CASSUCO water system is "closer than you think," according to indications at a city Council session last night.

Lester Mandell, president of CASSUCO, said the city would purchase the new 500,000-gallon storage tank, wells and other equipment would be the first phase of long range proposals with the end of providing city acceptable water and also would be "the first step in solving the water problem in the city."

CASSUCO's proposal is that the city would build the new plant at a cost of \$180,000 and would then lease the plant to CASSUCO, with CASSUCO assuming the total cost plus interest. This method is being suggested since the city could more easily acquire a loan for this.

Council Chairman Edith Durck questioned the proposal, saying, "It looks as if you're diverting attention from the acquisition of the system by the city," Mandell replied, "We are communicating every day about the acquisition... We came up with this plan which we felt was feasible and practical for going forward."

Mandell went on to say, "This new proposal would in effect hasten the sale transaction." He assured those present that the council's approval of the water plant proposal before he went any further on it, and there would be a general feeling of approval among council members.

Tammar Braden, chairman of the Seminole County Advisory Council on Aging, said, "What are your expectations? In what we have to offer worthwhile? Speak up and speak out. Let's come up with ideas to make our life style worthwhile."

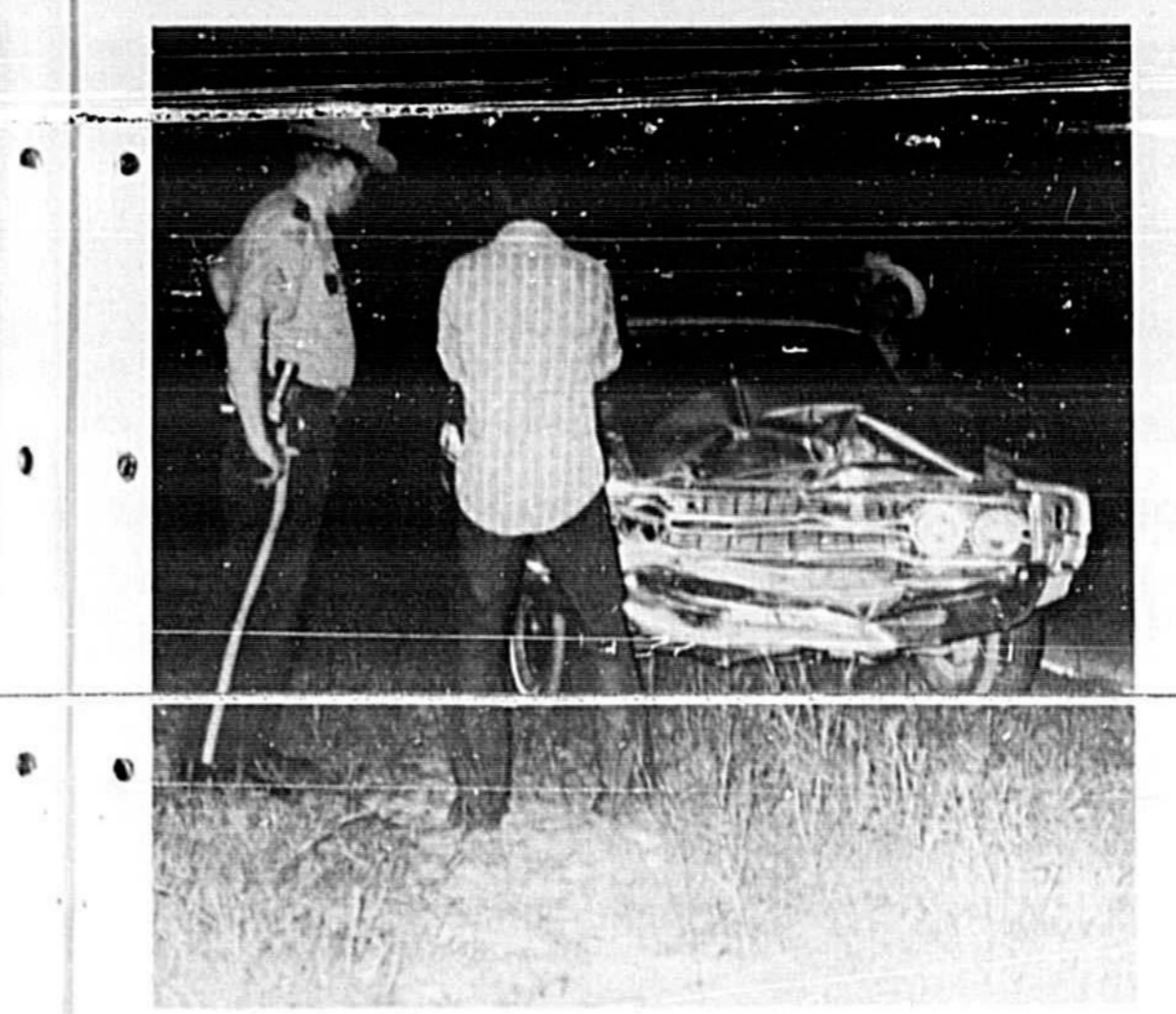

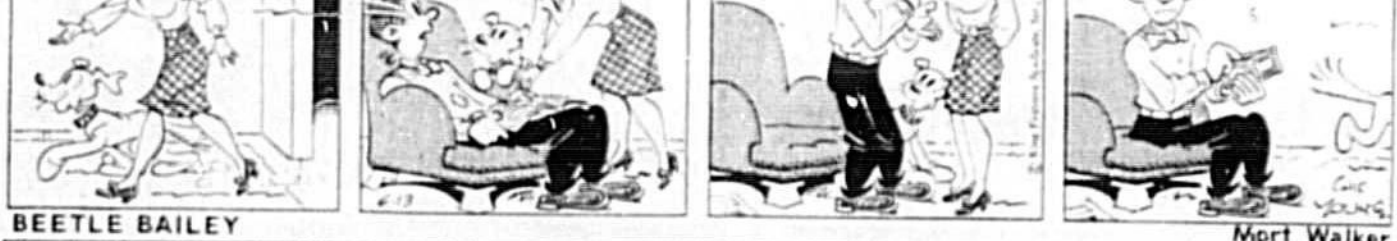
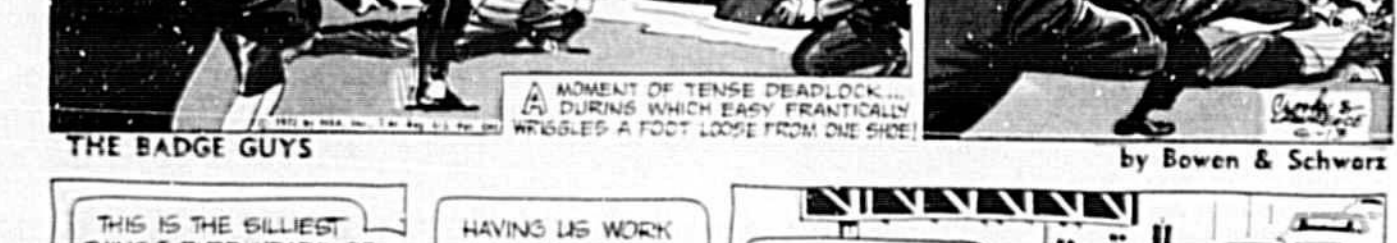
