WASHINGTON, Aug. 3.—(AP)—Figures released by the department of commerce showed that the volume of wholesale trade in Jacksonville, Fla., during 1933 was 57.7 percent smaller than that of 1929, the "prosperity" year, while the number of wholesale establishments last year was 22.4 percent less.
