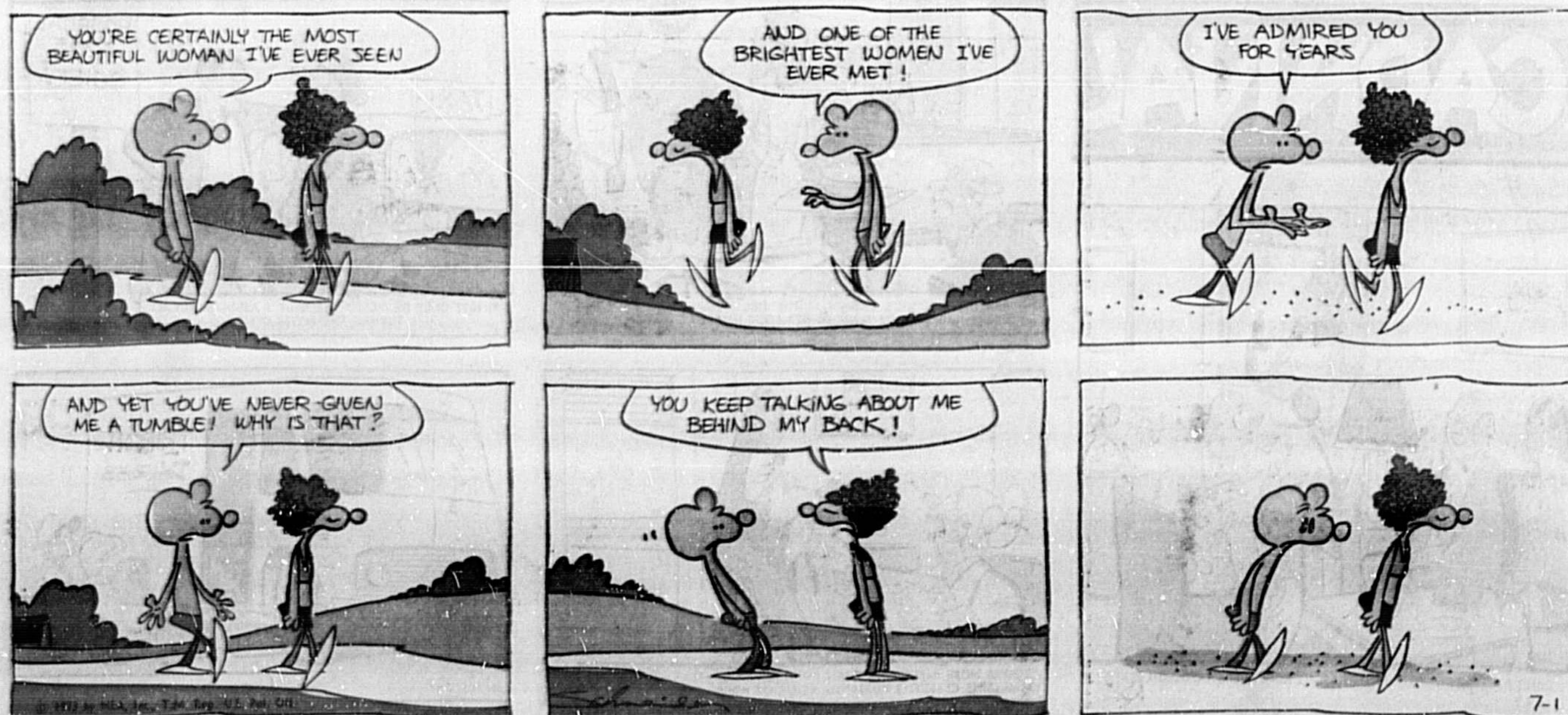

Book Clerk Jailed Under State Law

Seminole County vice agents made their first arrest for promoting obscene materials under a new Florida State law, after making several arrests during recent weeks.

Danny Lee Lamb, 21, of 424 Brittain Circle, Casselberry, was lodged in the county jail under \$500 bond after his 1 p.m. arrest at the Olympic Book Store, SR 436 and Brewer Street, Altamonte Springs.

Sgt. R. C. Parker arrested Lamb at 1:45 p.m. and then went back to the store shortly after 3 p.m. As agents approached the store, a clerk was standing in the doorway and went inside and locked the door.

Parker said the county ordinance will be invalidated Sunday and the state law will be used, with bonds of \$500 for arrests rather than \$100 under the county ordinance. The state law also carries a tougher penalty for convictions.

In other police action, a 33-year-old Sanford man was arrested at a 13th Street restaurant about 4:30 a.m. Saturday, after he allegedly raped a 16-year-old Sanford girl in a wooded area behind the Academy Manor Subdivision off Airport Boulevard, west of Sanford.

John Archie Harrison, Apt. 82, Castle Brewer Court, was charged with rape and assault with intent to commit a felony by Sgt. Johnny Wright Jr. of the Seminole County Sheriff's Department. Harrison was the second man this week Wright has arrested on rape charges, and both arrests came within an hour after Wright was notified of the assault.

Wright said the rape occurred between 2 and 3:30 a.m. when Harrison allegedly pulled the girl out of a car at a Southwest Road bar-b-que restaurant. Wright said Harrison threatened the woman with a pistol, and forced her to walk three blocks to the wooded area where she was raped.

Wright said witnesses told him the man who raped the girl was named "Archie," and that he located the suspect less than an hour later at the Westside Steak House.

The victim was examined at Seminole Memorial Hospital by Dr. G. V. Garay, and identified Harrison as her attacker.

Sanford Patrolman Butch Coombs charged a 28-year-old Sanford man with attempting to bribe a police officer and carrying a concealed weapon after the man allegedly tried to give Coombs a \$20 bill to "forget" about the charges.

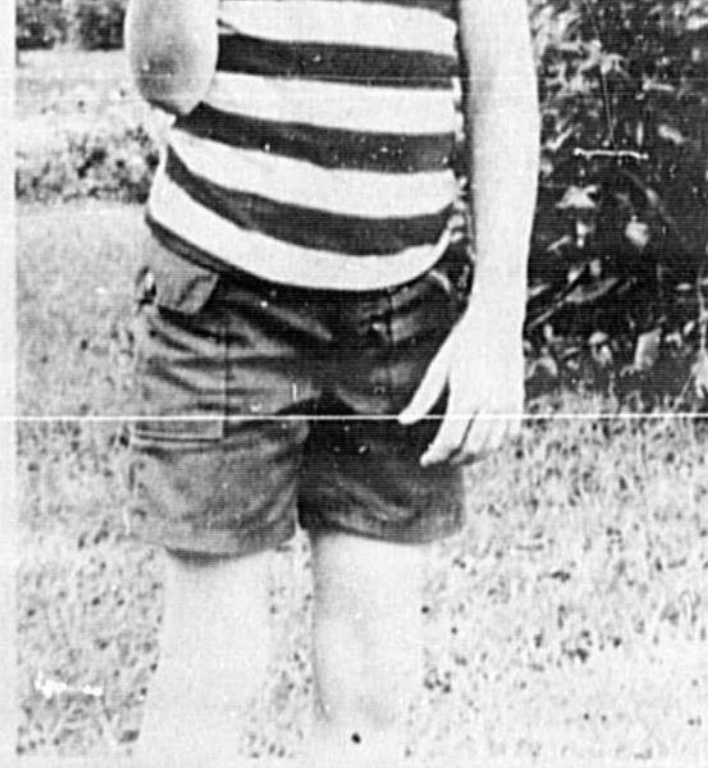

Ehrlichman Rebuttal To Dean's Testimony



WASHINGTON (AP)—Former White House aide John D. Ehrlichman says he has evidence to "trip up" the sworn testimony of John Dean III.

Ehrlichman said he believes Dean is trying to implicate President Nixon to save himself from criminal prosecution.

The only person who would have been in a position to overhear an investigation and to have taken steps to protect the three or four people, including himself, who were involved in the inception of this thing, was Dean," Ehrlichman said.

The former presidential counsel "was uniquely at the pivot point of the cover-up," said Ehrlichman in the strongest counterattack to date against Dean.

Ehrlichman's statements came Friday as Dean concluded five days of exhaustive testimony and stood firm on his charge that President Nixon knew the outlines of the cover-up as early as last Sept. 15.

Dean said Ehrlichman and former White House chief of staff H. R. Haldeman shared that knowledge with the President.

Ehrlichman said in a CBS television interview he first became aware a cover-up was in progress last March after he had begun an investigation at the request of the President.

Dean will be tripped up by the logs I kept at all meetings," the Christian Science Monitor quoted Ehrlichman as saying.

In the television interview Ehrlichman acknowledged he had responsibility for the White House team investigating leaks of national security information. But he claimed he had no advance knowledge that the team planned the 1971 burglary of the office of the psychiatrist of Pentagon papers figure Daniel Ellsberg.

Ehrlichman appeared on CBS program "60 Minutes" and was interviewed by correspondent Mike Wallace in a session taped Thursday.

Dean admitted to senate questions that he was heavily involved in the cover-up. But Ehrlichman said he was acting on the orders of Haldeman and Ehrlichman himself. In his testimony Dean also disclosed that the White House maintained a list of the President's political enemies and that pressure was put on him to come up with a plan to harass them through tax audits, investigations and other steps.

Dean said Ehrlichman knew the enemies list, Ehrlichman said. "That's something that was developed totally outside of my sight and hearing."

Senate testimony established that FBI logs of wiretaps on government employees and newsmen ended up in Ehrlichman's White House safe but he said he never authorized or ordered the wiretapping of newsmen's telephones.

Dean testified repeatedly that he had never been told to investigate the possible involvement of White House aides in the Watergate break-in and had never done so.

Ehrlichman said in the Christian Science Monitor interview that Dean told Nixon, Haldeman and himself that "a very vigorous and intensive investigation had not produced any evidence to implicate anyone except the seven men indicted in the break-in."

In other developments, former Attorney General John Mitchell's attorney said his client definitely has no information implicating the President in the cover-up.

Dean's claim that President Nixon knew of the cover-up caused Sen. Howard H. Baker, R-Tenn., ranking Republican on the Senate committee, to urge the President to find some way to submit a response under oath.

Baker acknowledged any such steps might involve a clash with the doctrine of the separation of powers.

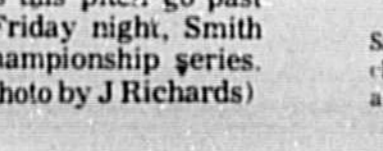
