Fame Is Linked To Ice Cream Soda

In about 1880, Sanders served the first ice cream soda known in this part of the country. The sweet cream soda (similar to our present-day egg cream) had been popular for some time. One warm summer evening Sanders discovered, while he had a lot of customers in the store, that all his sweet cream had turned sour. Ice cream was close at hand so he decided to try it as a substitute for the sweet cream. Those first customers who tried the ice cream soda liked the combination, and it was not long before every soda fountain in the country was serving the new concoction.

Scrub & Lacquer Pitted Aluminum. By GENE GARY Copy News Service. Q. The aluminum sill of our sliding glass doors has a dark substance in places and whitish substance in other places, which seems to be eating away the aluminum. When we clean the sill, the substance just keeps re-appearing. We have heard an opinion that it may be caused by dampness and some chemical reaction with the concrete, but no one has been able to tell us how to correct the problem. Is there any way to stop it, or at least is there something we can apply to the metal for protection from further deterioration. The house is three years old. — A.V.S. A. Aluminum won't rust but it will pit and corrode. Clean the area thoroughly with a stainless steel wool pad dipped in a solution of three parts water to one part etching chemical cleaner. Cover the wet pad with powdered pumice or other heavy duty abrasive and rub by hand with a reciprocating motion. Apply to an area small enough to be completely covered and kept moist for three to five minutes, then follow the treatment with thorough rinsing. After cleaning, give the aluminum a coat of clear lacquer, preferably of the methacrylate type which can be obtained from most large paint stores. This lacquer treatment is recommended by one of the largest aluminum companies (Aluminum Co. of America —
