23 degrees.

Plans for the Seminole County
Fair and Celery Display to be
held Feb. 12-17 are being carried
to completion rapidly and it
should be the "biggest and the
best" ever held in this county.

The weather man predicted
a heavy frost for the central
portion of Florida tonight with
temperatures ranging from 21
to 29 degrees.

The forecast was a bright, clear
sky, a night with rapid fall on
the mercury between 6:00 and
8:00 P. M. tonight.

Monday should mark the end of
severe temperatures in this cold
wave, the official said.

Among the low temperatures
predicted: Glen St. Mary, 13; Ocala, 16;
Hastings, 18; Bunnell, 20; Flor-
horne, 10; New Smyrna and Mims,
16; Deland, 16; Sanford and
Oviedo, 21; Howey, 17; Brook-
sville and Lakeland, 21; Clearwater,
23; Moore Haven, 22; Homestead,
24.

Local growers and shippers
reported that the celery crop
has been damaged by the continued
cold wave, the longest in many
years, "but no one knows how
much," one shipper said. Some
estimates on the loss in the per
acre yield for the part of the
crop which will be harvested
in February run as high as 50
percent.

Despite the apparent damage
from the cold, growers are gen-
erally optimistic and expressed
belief that better prices will
offset any losses in yield. "The
future looks bright to me," said
one grower.

"Lettuce, escarole and other
leaf crops were hardest hit by
last night's cold but there is
only a small acreage of these
crops in this county. Cabbage,
bunch vegetables and most of
the other crops which are in sea-
son, have not been severely dam-
aged by the cold. There is some
strawberry acreage in the county
and growers reported that the
cold had not damaged the plants
appreciably but that the yield
has been reduced to almost noth-
ing, resulting in an increase in
price.

Reports from the Moore Haven
district indicated that the cabbage
crop there was damaged result-
ing in a jump in price for cabbage
in that section to as high as \$50 per
ton. Prices for vegetables at the
local State Farmers' Market also
continued to rise.

Seminole County's citrus crop,
too, was damaged but the extent
of this damage was not immedi-
ately known, and will depend
largely upon the weather within
