"Crack down on the young punks." is the simple remedy many have for the problem of juvenile delinquency.



# Engineers Support Sanford Area Port

(First Of Three) Enough potential cargo is available to support a port terminal at Sanford and the economy of the area is in excellent shape for the construction of such facilities.

Those are the findings of an engineering study ordered by the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce.

The report was released today by Francis E. Roumillat, Jr., chairman of the chamber's Port Authority Committee.

"The St. Johns River probably is the most valuable asset in Seminole County . . . . and we conclude that an excellent opportunity exists to develop the St. Johns and recommend that a one-berth port terminal facility be constructed. . . . . " the report prepared by Lockwood Greene Engineers, Inc., states.

History shows that industry, commerce and population develop as a result of the establishment of water terminal facilities,

Economic benefits to be realized from the port, in addition to the coming of new industries, would be from two primary sources: (1) savings to the area on freight rates and (2) the monetary value added to the area economy by the movement of cargo through the marine terminal facility.

As for potential cargo, the Lockwood

In standard tonnage, this means that if a terminal existed at Sanford today, it would have been possible to import 81,000 tons of automobiles and trucks. Cost of minimum facilities for the Port of

Sanford are estimated at about \$530,000. Such facilities would enable the barge terminal to commence operations and expand at a later date.

The minimum cost would include wharf construction, clearing, grubbing, fill, paving and railroad work. The wharf and

transit shed deck would be the principal cost item, estimated at \$141,400.

The total does not include cost of property, legal fees or engineering.

The site recommended for construction of the water terminal is immediately west of the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad bridge, crossing the St. Johns River on the west end of Lake Monroe, The area of the propcity is about 130 acres.

The site is located at the junction point of water, rail and truck transportation. U.S. Interstate 4 and U.S. Highway 17-92 are near by.

"This is a tremendous advantage not enjoyed by many other terminals," the engineers declare.


