County OKs purchase of Katie's Landing

SANFORD — Seminole County Commissioners agreed to pursue a joint agreement with the state to purchase

Katie's Landing
It's a deal the county has been trying to close for more than two years, and with the window of opportunity for state funding closing in less than two weeks, commissioners agreed to authorize staff to begin working on a joint acquisition with the Division of State Lands.

While deal still awaits state funding, vote seen as getting 'over a big hump'

Commissioners also agreed to fund \$121,800 of the \$700,000 purchase price. "We got over a big hump today," said Clay Henderson, attorney for Russ and Katie Moncrief, owners of Katie's Landing. "This has been a long time coming."

Part of the hold up has been disagreements between the state's parks department and the county over how Katie's Landing will be managed and how the costs would be divided.

"Katie's will become part of the Wekiva Springs State Park," said

Commissioner Randy Morris, "Initially they will manage the are during the deconstruction of some of the outbuildings, and then the county will eventually take over management of the area. We managed most of the state park land along the Wekiva anyway."

In a letter to Commissioner Daryl McLain, Henderson stressed the need for the county to move quickly.

"There is a current level of uncertainty regarding the availability of state land

Expect delays as I-4 bridge work begins this month

SANFORD - We knew it was coming, and now it's here. Construction of a new Interstate 4 bridge over the St. Johns River is actually underway. The work presently consists of the installation of test pilings, but new construction is set to begin before the end of

this month. The contract for the \$102 million project was ratified in March. The bridge was not scheduled to be replaced until 2007, but concentrated efforts by government bodies and legisla-tive leaders moved the project up to the top of the list.
According to Department of

Transportation spokesman Steve Homan, "We'll be building two bridges over the St. Johns, one on each side of the present bridge, which will continue to be used. This shouldn't give anyone any traffic problems except for what we call 'visual delays', that is, rubbernecking from passing motorists looking at the construction work." Homan said the two bridges

will be three lanes in either direction, with an additional 10 feet of shoulder on either side. "This isn't going to be a widening as some reports may say," he said. "This will be an outand-out replacement.

"After the two bridges are

Nala came to the facility in


February as a canine companion, Lormann said. She is part of the Canine Companions for Independence program, which

Let's face it; some people have musical talent. They may not have studied music, but to them, it comes naturally. We have had many such talented people over the years.

Many decades ago, I had a cousin who would write music as it was performed by a person who couldn't read or write music. Thanks to her writing, his compositions were published. It was Ludwig Strouse, son of Johan Strouse the noted waltz king who, although not as famous as his father, has many selections being performed in con-

certs across the globe.

Modern Jazz pianist George Shearing was blind from birth and couldn't read music, yet his music was second to

none back in the 40s and 50s. This Friday, May 11, will mark the anniversary of the birth of another great composer, Israel Isidore Baline, born in 1888 in Tyumen, Russia. He and his family moved to New York City when he was four, and their name was Americanized to Berlin.

This of course, was Irving Berlin.

After the death of his father when he was in his teens, he began singing in bars and on street corners to help earn money for the family. He taught himself how to play the

Naturally, everyone knows some of the songs he composed: Alexander's Ragtime Band, White Christmas, God Bless America, There's No Business Like Show Business, Doin' What Comes Naturally, Puttin' on the Ritz, Blue Skies, and Oh, How I Hate to Get

Up in the Morning, plus dozens of others.
Yet Irving Berlin could neither read music,
nor write it. He hired people to take down notes as he played them.

While many of his songs were patriotic in nature, sung to bring about a spirit of pride in our country, others were based on what he saw in his lifetime. Puttin' on the Ritz, for example, had nothing to do with Sanford's Ritz Theater, but how he perceived people dressing up, possibly beyond their means, to attend special occasions in New York City to make others believe they may be wealthy.

During World War I, he encountered a sol-dier who told him that fighting in a war wasn't as difficult as getting up at 5 a.m. each morning. Thus, the appropriate song, heralded by military personnel since that

As far as I am concerned, and hopefully many others agree, Irving Berlin was a legend. His music will never be forgotten. He has been honored many times for his works.
Irving Berlin managed to live 101 years

and five months, passing away on Sept. 22, 1989 in his beloved New York City.

While I firmly believe that those planning on pursuing music as a primary or secondary career study extensively, over the years, we have had some outstanding people who have given us great music, simply on their own. They are exceptional people.

From 1967 until it closed in 1976, the present site of New Tribes Mission on East First Street in Sanford, was the Sanford Naval Academy. It was a private preparatory boarding school, offering private personal education with small classes, with the focal point being true learning experiences.

Students enrolled in the school were from various parts of the United States, as well as some from Central and South America, Mexico and Canada.

Many of the staff members were retired military personnel, giving the students a structured learning environment while offering leadership training as well as an advanced education. The staff members were excellent as role models for the midshipmen and stood as examples of leadership and service to their country from the late 60s to early 70s.

Some of the instructors, many local area residents from Daytona Beach to Orlando, not only served as educators, but as

coaches, guidance councilors

and house parents.

Local high school girls served
as cheerleaders for the school
during their athletic programs
which included baseball, football, basketball, track, swim-

ming and crew.





Much accomplished, much still unfinished

It took nearly 40 years, but four little girls have at last received a final measure of justice. Last week,

Thomas Blanton Jr., a former Ku Klux Klansman, was sentenced to four life terms in prison for his role in bombing a black church in Birmingham, Ala., in 1963.

It was an unspeakable crime. The four girls — Denise McNair, 11, and Addie Mae Collins, Carole Robertson and Cynthia Wesley, all 14 - were in the church basement when the bomb exploded at 10:19 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 15. The hatred and savagery of the perpetrators — men who would not countenance full citizenship for blacks — fright-

science. In its perverse way, the bombing played a part, just as firehoses and police dogs did, in prodding Congress toward passage of civil rights laws. Those lawmakers who believed themselves fair-minded

ened Southern blacks and seared the nation's con-

could not stomach the slaughter of innocents. In the 40 years since that awful day, Birmingham, like the rest of the South, has been transformed. Though city leaders resisted any serious effort to bring the church bombers to justice in the early 1960s, Blanton is the second of four original suspects identified by the FBI to be convicted in decades since. Ringleader Robert Chambliss, convicted in 1977, died in prison. And a third, Bobby Frank Cherry, has been indicted. (A fourth suspect died without ever being charged.)

Even if Cherry, who has been ruled mentally incompetent to stand trial, is never convicted, he and his co-conspirators have long since been condemned to the very fate they were willing to kill to avoid: a New South of integrated schools, black mayors and black jurors sitting in judgment of their crimes. Retribution is rarely so sweet.

Yet there is the danger of making too much of this, of looking for something casually called "closure," of assigning this episode to the history books and forgetting. Closure cannot come until we acknowledge the climate that accommodated the Blantons of Birmingham and Montgomery and Atianta and Augusta and Greenville and Biloxi. They thrived because middle-class whites who knew better — respectable, God-fearing, upright folk — did nothing to stop them.

Few wanted to risk the enmity of their peers or

the comfort of their social positions. Doing the right thing is often difficult and isolating. Few will chance it. That's a hard and bitter truth, but one that ought to be acknowledged more often.

Interviewed for Spike Lee's stirring documentary, "Four Little Girls," Chris McNair, the father of Denise, spoke of Birmingham's infamous police commissioner, Bull Connor, known for his brutality toward peaceful black protesters.


"A man like Bull Connor couldn't exist without the status quo — the big boys in any town," McNair said. Neither could the mad bombers like Thomas

This is a season of biographies and memoirs, anniversaries and commemorations of civil rights activism. Indeed, May brings the 40th anniversary of the Freedom Rides, when young men and women, black and white, rode buses into hostile Southern towns to protest segregated public transportation. These commemorations tend to be upbeat, dwelling on the victories, celebrating the heroes.

There is nothing wrong with that. The South indeed, the nation — has much to celebrate, having undergone such a dramatic social transformation in such a short time. But the United States has not shed itself of bigotry — homophobia, religious intolerance and, always, the hostilities of the color line. More good people will have to find the courage to stand up for justice if the nation is to live up to its creed.

Beary: Column emotional but leaves out facts

To the editor: Cynthia Tucker's recent column concerning our nation's anti-drug efforts was full of emotion but void of fact. Her summary that our strategy is "a miserable failure" is not only inaccurate but clearly demonstrates the false and misleading information the public

Did you know that the 1999 National Household Survey on Drug Abuse revealed that the overall use of drugs in the United States has fallen by almost 50 percent during the last 20 years? Or that after increases in the early 1990's, during the last three years we have recorded a consistent downward trend among adolescent use of Illicit drugs? How about our nation's crime rate? Did you know that it is at the lowest level in 20 years? Does this sound like failure?

Now let's talk about our national effort. All the professionals involved with reducing our nation's drug dependence sup-port our current strategy which consists of a balanced approach of three key elements, Prevention/Education, Enforcement and Treatment. For a visual affect, just imagine each key element as part of a threelegged stool. If one leg is removed or significantly altered the stool is useless. This illustrates the need

Despite Ms. Tucker's opinion that treatment is the only solution, every treatment professional I work with tells me that without incarceration or fear of incarceration most addicts will not seek help. Her assumption that our prisons are full of people who simply use drugs and have done "nothing worse than torture themselves and their loved ones" is blatantly false. In Florida, only.
5 percent of the prison population (five percent federal system)
were admitted for Drug
Possession - this includes many cases what were plea-bargained down from Drug Trafficking and Sale and Delivery. Additionally, research reveals that over 60 percent of adult male prisoners across the nation tested positive for drug use at the time of their

arrest for every type of crime imaginable. Most Americans understand that drug use changes behavior and exacerbates criminal behavior.

In closing, those of us charged with implementing our national anti-drug strategy recognize that we are far from victory but we are clearly on the right path and suc-ceeding. If we can reduce drug demand, addiction and the crime rate without much help from the media and a confused society, just imagine what is possible with enlightenment.

Bob Kerrey's damage control maneuvers

Article 118 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice says, "Any person subject to this chapter who without justification or excuse, unlawfully kills a human being when he 1) has a premeditated design to kill; 2) intends to kill or inflict great bodily harm; 3) is engaged in an act which is inherently dangerous to others and evinces a wanton disregard of human life; or 4) is engaged in perpetration

Thomas or attempted perpetration of burglary, sodomy, rape, robbery, or aggravated arson; is guilty of murder, and shall suffer such punishment as a court-martial trial may direct."
Army Lt. William L. Calley Jr.

was convicted of four counts of murder under this article for the execution of more than 100 women and children at My Lai, South Vietnam in 1968. Former Sen. Bob Kerrey of Nebraska is now defending himself against similar accusations. Kerrey has recently started talking about the women and children killed by his unit in a Feb. 25, 1969 raid in the Mekong Delta village of Thanh Phong.
In interviews with "60 Minutes

II" and Gregory L. Vistica (for the

New York Times Magazine), Kerrey said he had no recollection

of killing women and children. Gerhard Klann, a member of Kerrey's unit, says Kerrey gave the order to fire. There is a dispute among the combatants as to whether they were fired on first. Kerrey says they were but has acknowledged that after 32 years, "my memory of this event is clouded by the fog of the evening, age and desire."
A Vietnamese woman

named Pham Tri Lanh was interviewed about the incident by "60 Minutes II" in February. She says she witnessed the killing of 17 unarmed women and children. She was identified as the wife of a Viet Cong fighter.

The truth about this incident, and perhaps many others like it — known and not yet known may be hard to determine. But there are a number of questions that should be asked.

Why did this take so long to emerge? Newsweek magazine, which had the story two years ago when Gregory Vistica was on staff, sat on it. Newsweek assistant managing editor Evan Thomas, who interviewed Kerrey with Vistica, told The Washington

Post, "We could have run the story. We had Kerrey's confirmation. We just didn't want to do it to the guy when he wasn't run-ning for president." Did someone do a political hit on Kerrey so he wouldn't run for president?

Newsweek editors demonstrated far less heart when they ran a story in 1996 alleging that Adm. Jeremy "Mike" Boorda, chief of naval operations, did not earn two of his many decorations. Vistica was the reporter on that story, too. Less than two hours after he received an interview request from Vistica about the medals, Boorda committed sui-

Last Friday (April 27), Kerrey met with five other members of his SEAL commando team (Klann was not invited) to discuss what happened the night of the raid. Each signed a statement, which disputed central elements in Klann's story

While in Thanh Phong, "Klann says that the squad rounded up women and children from a group of hooches," Vestica writes in the New York Times Magazine. Then, according to Klann, Kerrey gave orders to machine-gun the captives, fearing they might alert enemy soldiers. Kerrey says he and his men fired from 100 yards away. The problem with that version is that the dead were hud-dled together when it might have been expected that upon hearing gunfire they would have headed for the bunkers that were under many of the huts, or scattered in different directions. It was dock different directions. It was dark and it seems unlikely that even the best marksmen could hit and kill every human target in such a

'neat" manner from that distance. Sen. John McCain (R-AZ), a fellow Vietnam veteran and former prisoner of war, defended Kerrey last week in The Wall Street Journal McCain is correct when he says that those who have never been in combat should not rush to judgment of those who

That's not an excuse for doing nothing. Others, like Lt. Calley, have been convicted of actions similar to those of which Kerrey and his men are accused. Other incidents of large numbers of civilian casualties in Vietnam remain uninvestigated or untried.

Is there a cover-up about events at Thanh Phong? If so, who else is involved and how

high up the chain of command? If war crimes have been committed, the United States, which has held other nations responsible for such crimes, has an obligation to credibly investigate its own.





Junior Honor Society.
"Sean got along with every-body," Cheri said. "He got along with young kids and older adults. He didn't treat anyone differently. He just seemed so wise for his age."

A few days before
Thanksgiving, Sean participated in a track meet for his school. In a fack meet for his school.

During one event, he fell at the finish line. Besides a few

scratches and scrapes, every-thing appeared to be fine. The next day, Sean began feeling sick, Cheri said. He began having flu-like symp-toms, so the family took him to the hospital. As the symptoms progressed, the doctors could not diagnose Sean, so he was taken to Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children in Orlando.

"He started to get a rash that looked like a sunburn over his entire body," Cheri said. "He was red from head to toe."

Doctors eventually determined Sean had Toxic Shock
Syndrome (TSS), a rare but
potentially serious illness that
poisons the blood. It can develop quickly in anyone — men, women and children.

By the time Sean was diag-nosed, however, it was too late. On the day before

Thanksgiving, Sean died of complications from TSS.

"When I was by his bed, he turned to me and said 'I think I am going to die now,' "Cheri said. "But, I knew it was OK. He had such faith. He was meant to be here for only a

short time. And, for that time,

he was here for a reason." Before Sean's death, he had written an autobiography for one of his classes. As part of the assignment, Sean wrote his own obituary, in which he described his life as a humanitarian and helping others.

That's how the idea for the scholarship came to us," Cheri said. "It was from his autobiog-

raphy."

Celeste Pipitone, an art teacher at All Souls Catholic School, is helping the family raise money for the scholarship. She has drawn a picture of the school with space to draw a child's portrait. Part of the money she raises from selling the print will go toward Sean's scholarship fund.

"Sean was part of All Souls," Celeste said. "I was lucky to have known him for many years. I wanted to help in keep-

years. I wanted to help in keeping his memory alive."

Sean's family hopes to raise
money through other fund-raisers, including a possible softball
tournament — a sport the 13year-old loved to play.

Although specific details
have yet to be established for
the scholarship, Sean's family
hopes it will eventually help
other children who embody the

hopes it will eventually help other children who embody the boy's humanitarian spirit.

"He touched the lives of so many people," Cheri said. "He was always smiling and had such a positive attitude. He had enough spirit for everyone, especially the underdog."







Landscape management during periods of drought

parts of Florida and usually does at one time or another, and normally, some months are drier than

Springs for instance, are dry, but other factors besides the weather can influence the amount of water available for landscape use. Increased urbanization coupled with a limited water supply is predisposing much of the state to a greater chance of water short-

ages. Because of Florida's sandy soils, plants may experience drought stress after only a few days without rain or irrigation. With limitations on water, we must decide how to best use the limited water available for landscape irrigation. The following guidelines are given as suggestions for management practices during drought.

Ferrer

General Practices Water early in the morning.

Less water loss occurs from evaporation and wind drift in the morning because of cooler

temperatures and gen-erally less wind. Plants watered early in the morning also have a chance to dry before night fall and will be less susceptible to diseases. Irrigate deeply at long intervals rather than frequent, shallow watering.

Deep watering improves drought resistance by promoting deeper, more

extensive root systems. Depth of watering should be about 12 inches for most landscape plants. One inch of irrigation wets a sandy soil to a depth of 12 Inches.

Don't fertilize or, if you do, do so with a slow release fertillzer. Fertilization stimulates growth and increases water

Avoid unnecessary applications of pesticides that require "watering in", instead, use a sprayer to reduce the amount

Water Restrictions

Remember that water restrictions for central Florida allows residential watering only two days a week, and not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Odd addresses may water Wednesdays and Saturdays; even addresses or no address

on Thursdays and Sundays. New landscapes may be watered on any day between 4 p.m. and 10 a.m. during the first 30 days after planting. Planting new landscaping is discouraged.

Management Practices For Turf

Irrigate turf only after it starts to wilt. Signs of wilting include footprints that remain in the grass long after being made and a large proportion of grass leaf blades remain folded over the mid-vein during the hottest hours of the

Raise the cutting height of turf. Although taller grass uses slightly more waster than

shorter grass, a higher culting height promotes deeper rooting and maintains turf quality longer.

Mow less frequently. Mowing stresses the grass plant by increasing respiration and reducing root growth.

Although mowing less often, never remove more than 1/3 the length of the blade to prevent too much stress on the grass. Use a sharp blade when mowing. A sharp mower blade produces a cleaner cut that heals more quickly and loses less water than a cut made by a dull blade.

Management For Bedding Plants, Shrubs and Trees

Add mulch to beds to further reduce evaporation from soil and to moderate soil, temperature, reducing stress on roots. Mulch depth should be 3 to 4 inches after setting.

If possible don't use over-head sprinklers for shrub and flower beds; hand water, flood irrigate, or use trickle irriga-

Greater water loss can occur

with overhead irrigation because of evaporation and wind drift. Irrigate trees and shrubs only after they start to

Drooping leaves and a change in leaf color can be used to determine when to water the plants.

Many trees and shrubs can survive drought without irrigation providing they are well prior to the drought. Move container plants into shaded areas so their water needs will be reduced.

Rodman Reservoir and Lake Kissimmee

This week we will look at Rodman Reservoir and Lake Kissimmee on our tour of the Top 10 bass fishing lakes in Florida according to the Florida Fish and Wildlife

RODMAN RESERVOIR

Rodman Reservoir, east of Gainesville and south of Palatka, covers 9,500 acres of prime largemouth bass habitat. Since its creation in



Rodman Reservoir has been known for trophy largemouth bass. The state's largest bass of 2000, 15 pounds and 17 pounds, came from the reservoir during March. Much of the largemouth

base fishery's success is due to abundant habitat in the form of stumps and aquatic vegetation and periodic drawdowns. Strong year classes of largemouth bass are produced following drawdowns, which allow a higher percentage of fish to

higher percentage of fish to reach trophy sizes.

Largemouth bass are most active during the cooler months. Anglers targeting trophy largemouth bass use golden shiners, either floated under a cork or free-

Most big bass are caught in the pool area, known as the "stump fields," along the river channel. However, many trophy base come from the area between Cypress Bayou and Kenwood Landing, including Orange Springs. Successful anglers use artifi-cial baits, such as deep-diving and lipless crank baits, spinner balts and soft plas-

Access to Rodman is available at several locations. Among the most popular are Eureka east and west off C.R. 316, Rodman Recreational Area west of S.R. 19 and Orange Springs Recreational Area, Cypress Bayou (Paynes Landing) and Kenwood Landing off S.R. 315.

LAKE KISSIMMEE Lake Kissimmee has a national reputation for high quality bass fishing. The 34,948-acre lake is between Lake Wales and Yoehaw Junction in central Florida.

In 1996, the FWC revitalized 24 miles of shoreline, resulting in increased numbers of largemouth bass in the lake. Base spawned in 1997 and 1998 are beginning show up in the lake. These fish will provide excellent action with many reaching 10 pounds within the next four or five years.

Currently, trophy fish and high catch rates are reported regularly from guides, fish camps and tournament anglers. Bass tournament winners routinely catch a five-fish bag limit weighing 18 to 25 pounds.

Expansive stands of vege-tation (maidencane, bulrush, knotgrass) account for excellent catches of bass. Slowtrolling golden shiners and flipping plastic baits along, and within, the vegetation are proven techniques, especially during the winter and spring. During the summer and fall, bass are caught offshore with rattling crankbaits, jerkbaits and See Outdoors, Page 3B








Welch tops Mini Stock Challenge at Orlando Speedworld

BITHLO - Frank Welch of N. Ft. Myers took advantage of Robbie Yoakam's bad luck, then put his name in the record book as the first winner in the newly-formed Florida Mini Stock Challenge Series Friday night at Orlando Speedworld.

This Friday night (May 11) Orlando Speedworld will be holding a regular night of FASCAR action with heats and features in the Super Late Models, Modified, Sportsman, Mini-Stock Super Stock & Strictly Stock divisions.

Twenty-one four-cylinder machines from around the state signed for the Mini Stock Challenge in with Lakeland's Lee Davis setting quick time at 15.818 sec. Davis didn't do well in the state of the stat the inversion draw as he pulled the 10 pill while rookie Josh Robinson drew the pole after qualify-

ing sixth quick.
When the green dropped for the start of the 50lapper, Robinson jumped past outside polesitter Donnie Lockard into the lead but sixth starting Robbie Yoakam was on the charge and took the point on lap six.

The caution flew for the first time on lap eight for a tangle involving Lockard and Mark

Gonzalez. Following the restart, Welch was on the move as he pressed Robinson for second as Yoakam steadily pulled away.

Tater Stalnaker's machine slowed to bring out the caution again on lap 16 as Welch was poised

to make a run at Yoakam after finally getting around Robinson. Yoakam was up to the task, but caution flew again on lap 22 for Rex Christensen's

From that point it was green flag racing with Yoakam having no problem holding off Welch and Davis who had methodically worked his way up to third.

Lockard's engine exploded in turn three with four laps to go bringing out the final caution flag. At this point, Yoakam apparently ran over something on the track and cut down a tire. He dropped back quickly on the restart, leaving a surprised Welch to fend off the extreme pressure of Davis to the checker.

Welch was able to keep his Ford F-150 bodied car out front to claim the win with Davis a very close second. Dade City's Matt Watts drove a steady race to get third while the rookie Robinson looked very good coming home fourth. Geoff Williams borrowed his mom Rae's Mustang and drove an excellent race to get fifth.

Rick Sirmans drove the Fascats Cattery
Pintaurus to sixth while Yoakam was able to hold
onto seventh despite having air in only three
tires. Mark Smith made the long tow from
Raeford, NC to claim eighth with Tim Clark and

Jason Rendell rounding out the top 10.

With the "Survivor" TV show wrapping up this week, B.J. McLeod and Jason Boyd took up where the TV show left off, surviving some wild action in their respective Super Late Model and Modified divisions.

McLeod took advantage of an early-race tangle etween leaders Eddie King and Michael

Williams to take the point and drive away to his second Super Late Model win of the year, padding his point lead as well.

McLeod survived a total of five caution flag periods during the 25 lap race that saw many of the cars in the field missing hoods, fenders, doors, or a combination thereof by the time the checker fall.

Eddie King came back from his early altercation to get place money despite finishing with a lot less sheet metal than he started with. Scott Reeves also had some damage from an earlier bumping incident but still drove to a third place finish followed by Rusty Ebersole and Russ Thomson.

George Murphy was sixth trailed by Robert Hight, Greg Brook, David Hart, and Kenny Crites. The walls took a pounding in the Modified feature. Just as caution came out for a three car tan-gle in lap two on the opening lap, leader Mark Emerson clobbered the frontstretch wall to end his

On the restart, Shain Held and Frank Polly tried to make a fourth groove out of turn two with Polly's car hitting the wall a ton destroying the entire right side of the machine. Fortunately Polly was not injured.

Jason Boyd found himself in the lead as the race finally got under way and it was no contest as he led all the way for his third win of the season.

Shain Held came home second in front of Darren Gould, Tom Root, and Terrible Ted Head.

After two Mini-Stock track championships, Kelly Jarrett moved on to the Sportsman class at mid-season last year. After a host of troubles, Jarrett finally put it all together to win his first feature in his new class in dominating fashion.

Six fish camps, one state park and three public boat ramps are available at Lake Kissimmee. Wade fishing is a popular method used by many anglers and access is provided at some of the fish camps and boat

SHUPE'S SCOOP

As usual, it has been very windy during March and April. It is hard for anglers to compete with the wind, particularly in a boat. The older that I become, the more selec-tive I become with wind velocity. I stay a home on the windy days, and save myself for the "good"

FISHING FORECAST River action is still good, with low water levels and cooler than normal air temperatures. The river south of Puzzle Lake is really hot for bass in the 1-5 pound range. Use smaller lures that resemble river minnows for

fast action. Sebastian Inlet has fair action with snook, trout, redfish, and flounder. Large live shrimp or finger mullet are the top baits. Trout are also active on the

grass flats just inside the Inlet. Captain lack at Port Canaveral reports that high seas have kept boats in port. Look for dolphin and king mackerel when seas subside. <u>Inside the Port</u>, expect flounder and sheepshead. Trout and redfish are improving in the Banana and Indian rivers

Ponce Inlet has been danger-ous with the big waves. Sheepshead, drum, redfish, jack crevalle, ladyfish, and bluefish are present in good numbers. Live or dead shrimp are the top balts. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.






