

## What happened to gender relations?

I came across one of my early newspaper columns the other day. It was written during my freshman year in college. I titled it, "No more golden girls."

It was an allusion to my favorite character from American literature. Jay Cataby, who devoted much of his adult life to making himself worthy of the woman he loved, Daisy Buchanan,

To my young -- perhaps callow -- mind, this was the way romance worked. A man would fall in love with a woman -- his Golden Girl -- and make himself worthy of her love. After a courtship, they would get married and, hopefully, live happily ever after.

But once I got to college (still a virgin, as I disclosed in that early column). I was quickly disabused of those romantic notions. Women were not waiting for Gataby, Prince Charming or yours truly to come along and sweep them off their feet. They were taking matters into their own hands.

They were just as aggressive as men in the courtahip ritual: initiating contact with men they didn't know, asking men out on first dates, asking men to be their significant others, making the first sexual overtures.

To my young mind, this role reversal was quite disconcerting. But the campus feminists

raised my consciousness. What I was observing was senial equality in practice, they explained, and if I had a problem with that, then I must be some kind of sexist.

Smith, a Georgetown University law student at the time, had been on holiday in West Palm Beach. Fla. He met a woman in a bar, They


drank the night away. She went back to his place after hours (instead of going home). They had sex.

The next morning, Patricia Bowman decided she wasn't such a sexually liberated woman after all. She was overpowered by Smith, she charged. Though she willingly climbed into bed with him, willingly made out with him, she didn't intend to go "all the way" with him. And he should have known that.

Though Bowman did not prevail in court, she did strike a blow for the sisterhood. Men are paranoid now that if a one-night stand goes awry -- if an unclothed woman suddenly has misgivings about sex or has morning-after recrusinations -- he could face rape charges.

And even if a man has had an ongoing relationship with a woman, he could find himself on the wrong side of the law. Like poor Mary Albert. He had been seeing a woman for 10 years and suddenly she turned on him. charging him with sexual assault, besmirehing his good name and reputation.

This is the present state of gender relations in America. There are some feminists who view this is as progress for women, but this is one former romantic who finds it lamentable.

## Canada, bland but breaking?

TORONTO -- And you thought America had one nice, peaceful neighbor to our north. Wrong. How about THREE, or FOUR?! Canada may be bland, but it may be breaking. That's the buzz here after the recent parliamentary elections. The words you hear are "regionalization," "separation," "splitting apart" and "Balkanization."

"Balkanization."
What you don't hear much about in Canada, or in America, is whether what's going on here is good or bad for the United States. Relevant or irrelevant? Funny. Here we are, two neighboring transcontinental, democratic, bioceanic nations, and we're not paying attention.

Consider the Northern Balkans. The majority (82 percent) of the population of the province of Quebec is French-speaking ("Francophone"). The majority party is the Bloc Quebecois (BQ), which seeks to form a new French-speaking nation. The BQ won 44 seats in the new parliament, carrying 59 percent of the Quebec "ridings." The BQ holds no seats outside of Quebec.

In late 1995 a referendum for Quebec secession drew a 49.4 percent "oui" vote, with over 60 percent of the Francophones voting to go. English-speakers from Quebec continue to migrate, disheartened by linguistic nationalism, which can be both petty and draconian. There will be another referendum within a couple of years, which may well pass.

Will Quebec split? A big player ta Reform

Will Quebec split? A big player is Reform Party leader, Preston Manning. Reform won 60 sests this time, up from 52, capturing second place. All its seats come from Western Can-

Manning campaigned on 'tough love' for Quebec. Says Manning: Stop rewarding crybaby blackmail from the Quebecois; stop their special privileges for "a distinct society" within Canada; treat all provinces equally; if Quebec wants to leave -- "au revoir." This stick-it-to-em sentiment had previously bubbled mostly beneath the formal political rhetoric. But Reform's second-place finish makes it the official opposition party, giving Manning a bully pulpit. If he rubs it in, he may push Quebec to leave Canada. Alternatively, the tough-love strategy may inform the Quebecois that there is price to pay for nag, nag, nag.

The ruling Liberals claim they are the only

truing Liberais claim they are the only truly nationwide party. They did win some seats most everywhere. But 66 percent came from the super-large province of Ontario, where they won 101 of 103 ridings. The Liberals now have 155 seats in the 301-seat new parliament, a perilous majority, down from 175. They got only 38 percent of the popular

in addition, Canada's Atlantic Maritime provinces voted for none-of-the-above, splitting

their votes between two small parties: the socialist New Democratic Party and the wet Progressive Conservatives. Good or bad for America?

Canada is a nice country; we have a nice border. In a world full of tribalism and terror, this status quo is fine. But it's not our call. The Canadians will deal with their own problems.

If Canada splits up, we should be wary but not worried. It's true, fracturing nations can become ugly places and bad neighbors. Recall that Americans killed 600,000 other Americans in our spasm of regional separatism, the Civil War. Still, it's remote. No one in Canada wants to invade Quebec. "Au revoir" is a long way from "Charge!"

If Quebec secedes, some of the nine other Canadian provinces may become American states. Secession could leave the Maritimes geographically isolated. The province of Alberta might jump. British Columbia would provide an American land bridge between Alaska and the Lower 48. It all sounds strange. We remember from our maps and history books where and why Canada is. But we forget that history and cartography keep on happening.

Would this be good for America? A country composed of Canada and the United States would be the largest in the world. God isn't making any more land. If America is already the world's only superpower, the new nation of strong, free, prosperous people would be a super-duper one.

DEAR CONCERNED: Your uncern le valid. Your wife's inability to control her temper can have lasting effects on your son's self-esteem. Children form their sense of worth from messages (verbal and nonverbal) their parents give them. When a parent tells a child he's an idiot, stupid or an ass, that is how he will per-ceive himself. On some level he will blame himself for the abuse. Unless something is done now to break this cycle, as your son grows up he may be unable to shrug off the guilt and sense of insdequacy his mother is placing on his shoulders.

The label for what your wife is duing is "verbal abuse." It may take psychological counseling for her to learn to cope with her temper in a more appropriate manner. I urge her to seek it.




Pre-empts are meant to make life difficult for the opponents. In the second position, though, you have already got past one opponent, and it is likely partner has a good hand. So, I think you should have a respectable suit. South's heart holding is a minimum (not that the Young Turks will agree). It isn't apparent to me why East doubled four hearts. After winning trick four with dummy's club ace, Forquet made the critical play: He ruffed a club in hand. There followed a heart to dummy's ace, the heart nine, another club ruff. a diamond to dummy's queen, a third club ruff, and a diamond to the ace. If

was trick 12 with the lead in the dummy. Forquet had the K-J of hearts and East the Q.B. Leading either of dummy's cards allowed Forquet to win the last two tricks. Yes, if East switches to a diamond at

trick four, things are trickier. Forquet would have to ruff dummy's last spade (with the heart seven), playing for the likely 4-0 heart break (or West's having the singleton three or six).

To pull off the trump coup, Forquet had to reduce his trump length to the same as East's. When you may have to do this, start ruffing as quickly as possible. Here, no trick five ruff, no 10th trick.
