

tor would carry Florida by three to one. Newcomers to this part of the state and others who may not have been present yesterday may well wonder why all this enthusiasm for Senator Russell. What has he got that makes him so popular with Georgia and Florida Democrats? Why should we vote for him for President of the United States?

There are a number of good men in the Democratic Party, any one of whom is well qualified to Le . . esident of the United States. Among them might well be listed Senator Paul Douglas of Illinois who is also now on a tour of Florida but who has declined to run for President. Others include Governor Stevenson of Illinois, Senator Byrd of Virginia, and Governor Byrnes of South Carolina. There are no more able men in either party than these men, but they are not running.

The choice of the voters of Florida in the May 6th primary lies between Senator Russell and Senator Kefauver. There are two other names listed on the ballot, Charles E. Compton and Carroll S. Shaw, but who they are and why they are on the ballot we do not know. For all practical purposes the people of Florida must choose between Russell and Kefauver.

Senator Kefauver is a very fine man who no particular qualifications for the presidency whatever except that he would like very much to be president and is against crime. Well, everybody is against crime. Even President Truman says he is against crime. And we would not belittle the importance of being against crime. That is an essential attribute of a good candidate for the presidency. But that is not the only qualification. What else is he against?

The record shows that during the last two congressional sessions Kefauver voted in favor of Truman policies 38 times out of 42 chances, almost 100 percent. Because he slipped up on those other four chances, he is not President 55,000 adults of voting age in this age at that time, but only 577,643 served for Averill Harriman of New York. But Kefauver is Truman's second choice, and Kefauver's victory either in the Election. Would place the Florida primary or the November election, would place the public's stamp of approval on Trumanism at its worst.

The people of Florida are not going to do that and we don't believe the people of the United States will. If Kefauver is nominated by the Democratic Party, he will be defeated. So will any candidate hand-picked by President Truman. 




