-State Attorney Says Grand Jury 'Conscience Of Community'-

Herring Denies His Office Totally Influences Jury

Democrats in Seminole County, State Attorney Abbott Herring scoffs at the concept that his office had total influence over the grand jury that indicted top ranking

For that matter Herring is quick to point out that a state attorney only guides and directs and offers legal advice to a grand jury, and it is the jury's responsibility to determine if charges are warranted. In essence Herring says the grand jury is the "conscience of the community" and that if jurors find

'probable cause" that violations of the law have occurred ndictments are likely to follow. Herring also points out that "if a grand jury finds

probable cause, jurors are not going to be dictated to by

In an interview Herring explored the concept of the grand jury and responded to charges that his office conducted a "witch hunt" in its direction of a grand jury which issued charges of violation of the Sunshine Law against County Commission Chairman Michael Hattaway, Commissioner Harry Kwiatkowski and County

A grand jury is composed of members of a community. The jury sifts through evidence and guided by the state attorney makes the final decision whether or not to

The state attorney monitors the proceedings and

presents evidence to jurors. But, Herring says it is the grand jurors who make the final decision - not the state

"You know," Herring said, "when a grand jury makes a decision it is not necessarily the decision in all cases that during grand jury proceedings.

monitored by Herring's assistant, William Staley. The Pratt Committee says Herring has "misused and abused" the powers of his office. And Freeman threatens to take the issue into the federal courts to seek redress against the state attorency for what Freeman calls

Kwiatkowski called charges issued by the grand jury the result of an "incompetent state attorney." Kwiatkowski's attorney, Newman Brock, says Herring's track record speaks for itself. Brock said Herring has filed charges against 21 public officials. None of the charges stuck, Brock said. In fact, Brock

After Judge Wallace Hall last week dismissed the grand jury charges against the trio, Herring refiled almost identical charges based on evidence unearthed



Ford Says Economy Better, **Except For Unemployment**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Although unemployment remains high, almost everything else in the economy is starting to look good and Americans may be entitled to another major tax cut in 1979, President Ford said today. "The underlying fact shout our economy is that it is steadily growing healthier. My policies for 1976 are intended to keep us on that upward path," Ford said in his annual economic report to Congress. He also said, "Regrettably, a full recovery of the economy will take

Despite the prospect of job gains this year, Ford's surely remain distressingly high.... "Even under the best of circumstances the return to full employment cannot realistically be accomplished this year or next."

Employment Outlook Dim

WASHINGTON (AP) - Unemployment can be reduced to below 5 per cent again but only after inflation and government spending have been brought under control. the chairman of President Ford's Council of Economic Advisers says.

Chairman Alan Greenspan said Sunday the jobless rate, which was 8.3 per cent in December, can "get lower than 5 per cent." But he said "it will clearly not be this year and very likely not in 1977."

Greenspan and President Ford were scheduled to release Ford's 1976 economic report today. The report is sent to Congress annually on the nation's economic performance in the past year and the prospect for the

Hearst Lawyers Seek Rulings

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - With the scheduled start of defense attorneys sought rulings today on five pretrial motions, including one claiming the newspaper heiress was brainwashed and another seeking dismissal of the charges against her.

U.S. District Court Judge Oliver J. Carter was scheduled to consider the defense motions, as well as two motions filed by the prosecution, at a hearing today. Defense attorneys are also seeking to bar as evidence some samples of Miss Hearst's handwriting, prevent testimony from her jailers and fellow inmates and suppress a "log" of Miss Hearst's activities the defense says was kept by a deputy sheriff at San Mateo County Jail.

Pentagon Eyeing Veterans

WASHINGTON (AP) - Pentagon officials are eyeing growing pool of peacetime Army veterans as a possible source of trained military manpower in any emergency

They calculate that, unless some new system developed for tapping this pool, the Army would find itself about 250,000 men short of its urgent needs in the first months of a rapidly developing, intense war in Europe. Although Pentagon officials are not dismissing the possibility of a long war, they appear most concerned about the Army's ability to mobilize enough trained men quickly in event of a sudden, massive Soviet attack on Western Europe.

WORLD IN BRIEF

Officers Launch Program For Lebanon Cease-Fire

BEIRUT, Lebanca (AP) - Syrian, Lebanese and Palestinian army officers launched a 36-hour program today to separate the Moslem and Christian combatants in Lebanon's civil war.

Truce teams toured a sixmile front line bisecting Bairut, ordering militias on both sides to pull back. Using bullhorns, they announced that the leaders of the Christian and Moslem private armies had agreed that military equipment could be moved in to remove all street barricades.

A police spokesman reported Moslem militiamen kidnaped a Syrian and a Lebanese officer in the downtown business district but freed them after 15 minutes. In the Moslem half of the capital, steel-helmeted troops of the Palestine Liberation Army stood guard at hotels, shops, money changers' stalls and street markets that reopened for the first time in two months

Angolan Overtures Reported

LUSAKA, Zambia (AP) - A British correspondent reported from the capital of the Angolan Popular Movement (MPLA) today that the Soviet-backed faction is making "discreet" overtures to the United States. Nicholas Ashford of The Times of London reported from Luanda that the MPLA's desire to improve relations with Washington was shown by the treatment accorded Mark Moran, an adviser to Sen. John V. Tunney, D-Calif., who met almost every MPLA civil and military leader except resident Agostinho Neto during a visit last week to

Ashford said Moran told him he got "the distinct impression that the MPLA would like to have better relations with the United States - and the MPLA is not demanding U.S. recognition as a price."

Italian Election Possible

ROME (AP) - The possibility of a national election in Italy this spring or summer with sizable Communist gains increased today following the refusal of the Republican party to join the Christian Democrats in another minority coalition government.

Premier-designate Aldo Moro, who headed the Christian Democratic-Republican cabinet that resigned 19 days ago, reported to President Giovanni Leone Sunday night that he had been unable to line up allies to give the Christian Democrats a majority in the Chamber of Deputies.

the Lake Butler institution, a spokeswoman for the Florida Corrections Department says. Spokeswoman Suzi Wilson said Sunday the prisoner was killed by shotgun blasts from guards on watchtowers during the Saturday night escape attempt. She said the guard apparently died of a heart attack during the incident.

Mrs. Wilson said officers in two towers spotted the two inmates climbing over the fence at the administration building of the Reception and Medical Center facility shortly after dark. The guards opened fire.

Novelist Sees Little Change

DUNEDIN (AP) — Erskin Caldwell, whose novels reflecting views of life in the rural South shocked America in the 1930s, says Tobacco Road has been paved and gone to town but little else has changed.

Angola And The Mercenaries

There have been widespread reports in recent weeks that American mercenaries were being recruited to fight in Angola.

President Ford has denied that the government is directly responsible for the recruitment or the training of such mercenaries, but has not denied that American government funds may be paying indirectly for the recruitment and training by unofficial private agencies.

Taxpayer money should not be spent for this purpose, either directly or indirectly. It is a risky business, not only for the mercenaries themselves, but for the sponsors. Our government should not be involved in any way.

The government has no right to tell Americans they can't go to Angola to fight as mercenaries if they want. But the government should be taking a leadership role in an effort to exclude all foreign soldiers from Angola.

It is encouraging that the State Department is pressuring South Africa to remove its troops. Then, through the Organization of African Unity pressure should be put upon Cuba to remove its troops and upon the Soviet Union to stop supplying the Luanda government with arms.

Sending in mercenaries and modern weapons from the United States to counter the Communist harebrainedness he created with his scheme to intervention is likely to result in escalation of the send every American a check for \$1,000 even conflict. More Africans will die. More destruction after he became his party's nominee and no will be done. That is certain.

Whether escalating the intervention will keep the Russians from prevailing depends on them. It is most likely merely to spur them to greater efforts.

In any event, the outcome is uncertain. As clients of any superpower, the Africans are likely to be unreliable allies. The memory of their domination by European colonists is too recent for them to accept happily any kind of new im-

We should strive mightly to bring peace to Angola, so the Angolans can decide their future for themselves. We should not be escalating their present torment and increasing their future problems by sending in arms and soldiers of for-

Unintimidated

Nevertheless he is understandably reluctant to concede

advantages to lawless elements who respect no rights, including the right to live. Kelley should be assured that the necessary authorizations will be expedited to permit the use of all his tools

This all came about because of a decrease in the number of persons collecting unemployment compensation, according to the Florida Department of Commerce. The cutback came earlier this month when the

number of persons collecting regular state and state-federal extended benefits had averaged less than six per cent of the total insured work force for the preceding 13 weeks. As it stands now, the maximum number of weeks

that benefits are available under state unemployment compensation is 26. Those who have exhausted their eligibility for state benefits may be eligible for another 13 weeks under the state-federal extension and, now, another 13 weeks under a Federal Supplemental Benefits program that is affected by the law.

Under the law, the Federal Supplemental Benefits extension was cut from a maximum of 26 weeks to 13 weeks, thus the reduction in number of weeks the compensation will be paid to anyone. So, if you were figuring on getting those benefits for 65 weeks, you'd best look at the new law. Better yet, check with the state employment service to see exactly how long you may keep getting those





"Part of the excitement of tournament bass fishing," said American Bass Fisherman Dewey Yopp," is being paired with great fishermen, perhaps even a world champion. Seeing them in action, learning their techniques is well worth the entry fee.

"A novice will learn more in six days of fishing with pros than in a lifetime of solo fishing. And added to that, is the possibility of hitting the jackpot with the largest single

Yopp stressed safety factors insisted upon by American Bass Fisherman, Inc. Every boat has to be inspected, registered, and Coast Guard approved. Every fisherman must wear a life support vest, zippered up when he leaves the dock. In addition, the boat must be equipped with a "kill switch" fastened to the operator to cut off the motor in case he falls or is thrown from the craft by hitting an obstruction.

The Sanford contest will have an "ooze out" start rather than a racing start. With the large number of entries, anglers will be broken down into three flights. As each team eases from the harbor to a check-out

boat manned by a tournament official, the official checks them off, rechecks safety equipment and gives them a

The next time the official sees the teams is when they check in at the end of the day.

Conservation is also a must in tournaments conducted by the ABF. The boat leaves the check-in point and proceeds to the weigh in station where each man places his catch in a plastic bag filled with water from his live well. This is to prevent any sudden temperature change which might affect the fish. They are weighed and returned to the water alive. "Every gimmick known is used to preserve the fish

population," Yopp stated, "and our record is 95 per cent living bass put back to grow and fight again." Those hooked too deeply to survive are donated to charitable organizations.

When asked what he thought the effect of the present low water level in the St. Johns River would have on fishing he replied, "In this case it will help as the water

The Camellia Japonica was introduced to the American gardens nearly two centuries ago. It was originally grown in China, Japan and Korea, where it grows up to 30 feet tall. It was named for a Moravian but pretty when blooming. It is not unusual to see plants 12 to 15 feet high with a spread of 10 feet.

Some time before 1839, the camellia was taken to England and France, and in time to America. Camellias were kept pruned and not left to grow naturally and all varieties which were not formal doubles were discarded In 1935 there were some new varieties developed semi-doubles and singles in various colors. Camellias grow particularly well in the Carolinas and some plants must be several hundred years old. The varieties are old

Camellias are easy to grow in Florida. They should be planted in an acid soil. Use nalf peat and half top soil in the mix when preparing the flower bed. The hole should be twice the size of the ball of the plant, both in width and depth. Spread the soil mixture evenly around the plant. Camellias prefer partial shade but some will grow in full sun. Never try to grow them in full shade. Good drainage is necessary as they hate wet feet - never plant

Pine straw and oak leaves make a good mulch - oak leaves are acid in reaction which is good. Fertilize with a regular azalea and camellia fertilizer which has an acid reaction. Feed the plants in April and June as later applications will cause growth that may prevent heavy bloom. Water well especially during the blooming period and when bloom buds are set. If they dry out too much

The insect pests which attack camellias include red scale, tea scale, snow scale. Spray with Volok oil with isotox, or Volok oil with Malathion. The pests usually are under the leaves, so check the underside of leaves frequently and spray before the leaves are badly infested. The scale insects are sucking insects and cause yellowish spots on the top of the leaves.

When buying plants, look them over carefully to check their good condition and if certain colors and varieties are desired, buy plants in bloom, otherwise you may not know what you have purchased.

Arthritis Has **Many Causes**

By Lawrence E. Lamb, M.D. DEAR DR. LAMB - I am interested in knowing how one contracts arthritis. Is this a hereditary disease? Is it caused by a low grade infection? How can one keep from getting this affliction?

DEAR READER - There are several types of arthritis. Rheumatoid arthritis is inflammatory arthritis and the exact cause of the inflammation is not known. It has never been established that it is caused by a known bacteria or

You can have gonococcal arthritis on the basis of gonorrhea, or tubercular arthritis from tuberculosis. Gouty arthritis is caused by the accumulation of a salt of uric acid. The overproduction

of uric acid in the body is an inherited tendency. Uric acid is a byproduct of normal cell regeneration which is a constant process in a healthy body. Osteoarthritis

degenerative arthritis is thought to be related to wear and tear factors and affects mostly the weight bearing joints in the body. As you can see from this

there is no good way to prevent all forms of arthritis, particularly when we don't know what causes some types such as rheumatoid arthritis. As a general rule the principles of good health will help. Avoiding obesity decreases wear and tear on joints. Controlling the level of uric acid with medicines when it is too high will help prevent gouty arthritis and of course prompt treatment of the various infections that may have arthritis as a complication



DEAR READER - I wish I could just solve your problem with a letter but it isn't that simple. You need to know exactly what is causing the dizzy spells. They are just a symptom, and they can be caused by a list of things as long as

Yes, you can have dizzy spells from involvement of the circulation related to high blood pressure. You can also have them from low blood pressure because not enough blood gets to the brain. They can be from severe anemia or from dieting, particularly from overdoing it with any number of unsound fad diets touted to the public. Dizziness can be caused by




