Sept. 11 events planned for Seminole County

Sept. 11, 2002, will mark the first anniversary of the destruction of the World Trade Center buildings in New York City, with 2,823 casualties, and the aircraft crashes at the Pentagon in Washington, D.C. and Pennsylvania.

In consideration of the anniversary, a number of events have been planned:

- The city of Lake Mary will hold a September 11th Remembrance gathering. The event starts at 10 a.m. at the flagpole in the city hall parking lot. City officials and members of the clergy will participate.

- A special ceremony remembering September 11, 2001 will be held Sept. 11 beginning at 7 p.m., at First Baptist Church of Sanford, 519 Park Avenue. There will be present and former Sanford city officials, music, guest speakers, a candle lighting ceremony and other events. Plan to attend as we join together in remembering those men and women who lost their lives that day as well as members of the Armed Forces.

- Brethren Reaching out will hold a 911 Ceremony by Youth, in memory of the fallen firemen and law enforcement officers. The event will mark recognition by our youth of local firemen, law enforcement and volunteers.

- It is scheduled to begin at 3:30 p.m., at Seminole Gardens Apartments, 1600 West 5th Street in Sanford, Unit No. 20.

- The community is invited to a special 9-11 memorial prayer service sponsored by New Creation Lutheran Church and Upsala Community Presbyterian Church, Wednesday, Sept. 11 at 7 p.m. at the Upsala Community Church, and the intersection of Highway 46-A and Upsala Road in Sanford. The service will include special music and visual remembrances of the tragedy.

Prisoner found dead in jail cell

SANFORD — A prisoner awaiting trial for the murder of his wife was found dead, in an apparent suicide, in his Seminole County jail cell Sunday morning.

Deputies found Charles E. Cowart alone in his cell about 11:20 a.m. Sunday while other prisoners, including his cellmate, were attending church services. Attempts to

revive Cowart were unsuccessful.

Cowart was being held in a regular cell at John E. Polk Correctional Facility and was not under a suicide watch at the time of the incident. Officials said Cowart used a bed sheet to hang himself from the electrical conduit attached to the ceiling of his cell.

A grand jury indicted Cowart for first-degree murder on Jan. 17, nearly a month after his wife was murdered.

Deputies from the Seminole County Sheriff's Office were called Dec. 18 to 534 Windy Creek Place in the Sabal Creek subdivision off Wekiva Springs Road. When deputies arrived, Cowart, 52, was on the phone and pacing the house while his 36-year-old wife, Cathy Ann Cowart, lay dead on the floor, said Steve Olson, sheriff's office spokesman.

"Basically what happened is the husband

called his wife's sister saying something to the effect that he has killed his wife," Olson said at the time of the incident. "She then called us."

Olson said the killing appeared to be the result of a dispute that was "simmering within the household" for some time. The Volusia County Medical examiner determined Cathy Cowart had been strangled.

The couple had two young children, a 6-year-old daughter and an 8-year-old son. Both were attending school when their mother's murder occurred. The children are

Growing museum receives OK to add 35 parking spaces

SANFORD — There will be additional parking spaces soon at the Seminole County Museum. The request was made last week during the Seminole County Commission meeting.

Suzi Goldman of the Library and Leisure Services Department made the presentation, pointing out that when the museum expansion project master plan was approved by the commission in October 2001, the parking lot area south of the old Infirmary Building was not immediately accepted.

At that time, the commissioners called for a parking capacity study, which was completed by Traffic Engineering in March of this year. The conclusion was that while "adequate on-site parking is available for routine and event type use," parking areas for the Administrative Services office building, Extension auditorium and office, and the existing Museum structure do not meet the minimum number of parking spaces required by the city of Sanford.

Traffic Engineering had originally determined the deficit

would be 20 spaces. Now however, with the building project underway and the additional exhibit building planned for the future, it is estimated that the overall deficit would be 35 spaces.

Extension Services Manager Barbara Hughes had reported that parking continues to be a challenge for the

Extension Services office and auditorium, which reports an average monthly attendance of 2,500. The average monthly attendance of the Museum of Seminole County History is 334. She added that the museum also shares space with the Wellness Center, Training Center, and volunteer meetings such as 4-H, Family and Community Education volunteers

and Lakewatch.

"The museum has been the poor step-child of the county for many years," said Commissioner Randy Morris.

"Now, with the major expansion under way, I think it's time we got more involved."

With that, Morris moved to approve the 35 additional parking spaces, to be built during the present construction.

The matter passed unanimously.

Meador joins race for Longwood commission

LONGWOOD — The race for District 1, City Commissioner in the City of Longwood now has two candidates. In addition to incumbent John Maingot, Larry Meador is now officially on the ballot.

Persons seeking to qualify for election have two options. One is to pay a \$288.30 qualifying fee. The other is to submit signed petitions from one percent of the qualified Longwood voters to the Supervisor of Elections requesting his name be placed on the upcoming Nov. 5 ballot.

Meador chose the latter and submitted 96 petitions. Of the 96, the Supervisor of Elections certified 83 of them. In order to qualify,

Meador had to submit a minimum of 72 valid signatures by noon on August 15, which he did. The signatures were verified on Aug. 20.

Meador, a public relations graduate of the University of Florida, is now gathering resources to aid in the campaign and is seeking volunteer support from persons in the Longwood area.

In the other two commission seat races, incumbent Dan Anders submitted his qualifying papers to seek re-election to District 2, and Butch Bundy has submitted qualifying papers to seek re-election in District 4.

"We've had a number of other forms taken out," said Longwood City Clerk Jeri Zambri, "but at the present time, no others have been returned."

Jefferson kicks off theater's third season

Helen Stairs Theatre's third season kicks off Saturday with an appearance by America's third president.

"Twilight at Monticello," will transport audience members back to the early 1800s for an evening with Thomas Jefferson, the man who defined American independence.

The play presents Jefferson during the later years of his life, offering firsthand recollections of the people, events and ideas that shaped the country's early years. Most of the words in the script are Jefferson's own, although the playwright has sculpted and fashioned them into a lively paced discussion of topics ranging from slavery to dentistry.

Taking on the role of Mr. Jefferson is J.D. Sutton, whose highly acclaimed one-man show has received rave reviews from critics

throughout Central Florida. The play's unique structure includes a question and answer period, which is a true exercise in improvisation, as Sutton conducts a "talkback" in his 18th-century alter ego.

The performance of "Twilight at Monticello" is scheduled for 8 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 7, in the Helen Stairs Theatre. Tickets are still available, and prices include \$30 for VIP, \$25 for Orchestra and \$20 for balcony.

Saturday's performance is the first of 10 events scheduled for the 2002-2003 entertainment season at Sanford's historic theater. From September until May, an array of local, national and international performers will appear at the downtown venue as part of the entertainment series.

"We've got quite a success story here," Theater Development Director Ron Rose said. "As one of the only historical theaters in Central Florida, we've got an exceptional season this year. It's going to be spectacular."

With an additional two performances from last year, highlights for this season include appearances by Mickey Rooney and Jan Chamberlin

Alligators be leery: Sunday marked beginning of 2002 hunting season

Sunday, Sept. 1 marked the beginning of the 2002 Florida Alligator Hunting Season.

This year, more than 1,500 alligator hunters will have the opportunity to take two alligators each from specific harvest sites around the state.

The hunters were selected in a daily random selection process that began last May. Florida residents who were selected were required

to purchase a permit for \$270 to hunt for the state's most famous reptile. Cost for out-of-state hunters was \$1,020, but none of the eight who applied were selected.

In all, approximately 3,000 people applied for the license this year. The season will last until October 8.

Licensed hunters may have one or more people assist them during the hunt, but assistants are required to purchase a \$50 non-transferable agent's license.

Licensed agents may not hunt independently of their licensed hunter.

Trappers may use snatch hooks, snares, gigs or harpoons to take alligators, and bows and arrows or crossbows may be used in the projectile is attached to a restraining line. Firearms may not be used.

Three areas have been specified in Seminole County; Lake Harney where 49 permits have been issued, Lake Jesup with 15 permitted hunters, and Lake Monroe,

where five licenses have been issued.

As little as 40 years ago, alligators were deemed to be in short supply as a result of widespread poaching. Since then, intensive management and aggressive protection have allowed alligators to state one of the most prolific comebacks in the history of wildlife conservation. Alligators now reside in almost every body of water in the state including many urban retention ponds and drainage ditches.

With the abundance of alligators and no natural predators to control them, Florida's gator population has now reached the point where the available habitat cannot support more gators.

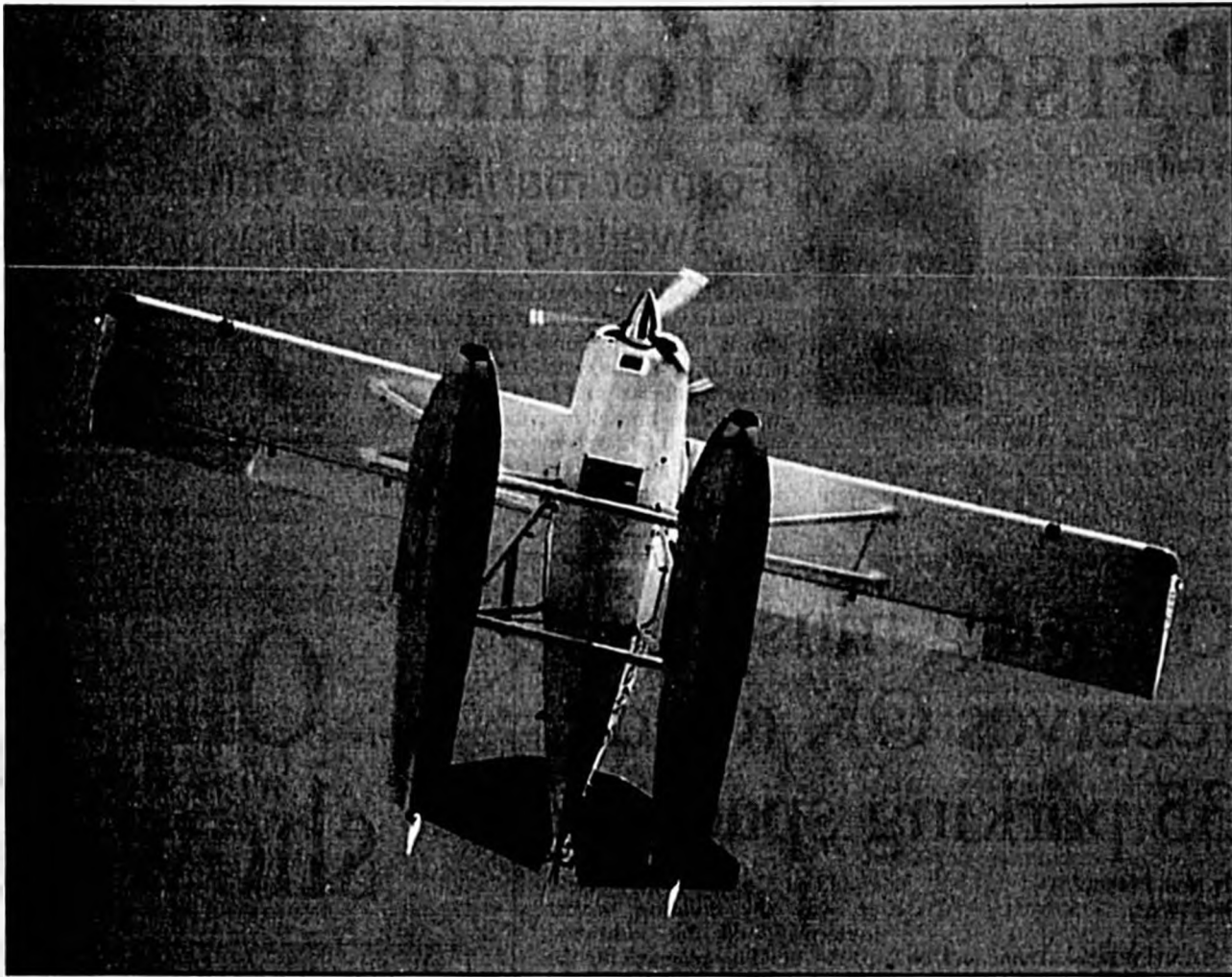

People urged to stay away from flooded areas

The rains have been falling very heavily in Central Florida, and with the peak of the Atlantic Hurricane Season and rainy season now before us, there will be no let-up.

One of the biggest problems motorists and homeowners are experiencing is street flooding. Last month, a number of streets in Sanford had to be closed

briefly because of standing water. Some of the areas still have barricades in place to keep people from hitting washed-out areas along the roadside.

Portions of Deltona have had some of the most serious flooding problems and city officials are creating special drainage runs to retention ponds, some even at a considerable distance from the flooding.

Last week, the Oviedo Police Department was forced to close

several areas; Lockwood Boulevard south of Mitchell Hammock, CR-419 on the east side of Oviedo between Willingham Road and Twin Rivers Blvd. and portions of Riverside Subdivision.

Most of these areas were soon reopened as soon as the water receded, but with more rains coming (It's raining as this is being written), we can expect more and more street flooding.

Law enforcement officers are urging people to stay away from flooded streets. Driving over standing water is dangerous, they say, because it is often impossible to see the edge of the roadway, potholes which may have developed, hazards which may have floated out into the road, and of course, the possibility of getting one's vehicle flooded out because of the water hitting the engine, causing it to stall in the roadway.

Nothing stops Anderson from participating in favorite pastime

Rain, heavy winds or sunbathing alligators don't stop Belinda Anderson from enjoying the hobby she loves.

Three days a week, Anderson can be spotted among the avid fishermen along the banks of Lake Monroe. From 8 a.m. until 5 p.m., she's casting her line in hopes of making the catch of the day.

"Actually, I fish just to pass the time," Anderson said. "I just love the sport, and I can't think of anything I'd rather do."

The Sanford resident is at her "fishing hole" at the lake during her days off as a security officer for a local business. Every day spent fishing is a successful day for Anderson — even when she only takes home one or two fish.

"Sometimes, they don't bite, but fishing is a good way to find some relaxation," Anderson said. "There's never been a day where I haven't caught something, though. I always catch at least one or two. But, on a really good day, I can catch between nine and 10 fish."

"However, I do have to take home something each time I come out here."

Anderson has been fishing since she was 12 years old. Her aunt decided to treat her to a day of fishing, which turned into a two-decade-old hobby.

"After a day of fishing with my Auntie, a started dreaming about it," Anderson said. "That was it. I haven't stopped fishing since then."

At 32, Anderson has no plans of stopping. "I think I'll do this until I can't do it anymore."

Fishing at Lake Monroe isn't just about the fish, however. A camaraderie has formed among the many fishermen who are routinely found fishing by the lake.

"Basically, everybody knows everybody else," Anderson said. "I've met a lot of people. And, people will even stop and ask to see what I've caught."

As for all the fish Anderson catches during her days at the lake, they either end up in the frying pan or the freezer. Fish, of course, is one of her favorite foods.

"I'd rather catch them than eat them, and I give some of the fish I catch to friends and family," she said. "But, when I fix them for dinner, my favorite way to eat fish is first clean them, then season them, put them in some cornmeal and then fry them."

For people thinking about taking up the sport, Anderson has a few words of advice.

"You have to have patience," she said. "And, you've got to make sure the worm is hanging off the hook. If it's not, the fish won't be attracted to the bait and you won't catch anything."

UCF comes up shy at Penn State

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. — UCF got a lift from freshman kicker Matt Prater who booted three first-half field goals, but Penn State was able to put up 17 unanswered points in the second half to send the Golden Knights to a 27-24 season-opening loss at Beaver Stadium Saturday afternoon.

Prater capped UCF's opening drive of the season, a 13-play, 71-yard march that consumed 5:51 off the clock, with a 26-yard field goal to put the Golden Knights up 3-0. The drive was kept alive with two critical third down conversions.

The Nittany Lions answered right back with a 7-play, 74-yard effort of their own, which was concluded with tailback Larry Johnson's 23-yard scamper into the end zone for a 7-3 PSU lead. Both teams would rely on their kickers for the remainder of the first half, as Nittany Lion kicker Robbie Gould would connect on 1-of-2 attempts, giving PSU 10-first half points. UCF added six points, all off the foot of Prater, including a 53-yard boot with 1:09 remaining. PSU carried a 10-9 advantage into halftime.

The first break of the second

half went to PSU as UCF quarterback Ryan Schneider fumbled the snap from center setting up the Nittany Lions deep in Golden Knight territory at the start of the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions capitalized with a 34-yard field goal by Gould extending their lead to 13-9.

The Nittany Lions forced the Golden Knights to punt on their next possession, and just 2 minutes and 51 seconds later quarterback Zack Mills hit Bryant Johnson from 21 yards out to push the lead to 20-9.

UCF, looking to gain momentum, was able to convert a third and 22 from the PSU 40, when Schneider completed a 45-yard pass to Jimmy Fryzel setting up a first-and-10 at the Nittany Lion 15-yard-line.

The drive stalled and set up a 34-yard field goal attempt by Prater. The subsequent kick was blocked and PSU took over. They would later score on an eight play, 61-yard drive when Paul Jefferson went in from eight yards out. The 17 unanswered points gave PSU a 27-9 advantage.

UCF got on the board for the first time in the second half with just over three minutes

remaining when Alex Haynes went in from two yards out for UCF's first touchdown of the game. The Golden Knights added a two-point conversion to trail 27-17.

Schneider led the Knights down the field one more time, and in a hurry, driving UCF 80 yards in eight plays hitting Tavaris Capers for a touchdown bridging the gap to 27-24. PSU ran out the clock after recovering the onside kick.

Leading UCF offensively was Schneider, who finished the game hitting 32-of-46 passes for 345 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Doug Gabriel led UCF in receiving, hauling in 11 passes for 153 yards.

Penn State was led by quarterback Zack Mills, who finished the game with 194 yards connecting on 13 of 20 attempts. Larry Johnson was the leading ground gainer for the Nittany Lions finishing with 100 yards on 18 carries.

The Golden Knights will travel to Tempe, Ariz., next week to take on Arizona State, while Penn State will have an off week before taking on Nebraska.

Pan Am cuts flights in Sanford

SANFORD — Pan American Airways will substantially cut service in and out of Orlando Sanford International Airport beginning next week.

The cuts, which begin Sept. 14, are in response to declining demand throughout the airline industry, a Pan Am official said.

"You can't pick up a newspaper without reading about the troubles in the industry," said Dan Fortnam, vice president of market-

Airline will reduce flights and eliminate destinations, including Newark

ing for Pan Am. "People are not returning to air travel as quickly as we would have hoped.

"Airlines are in very hard times right now," Fortnam added. "We need to be able to respond quickly, and we're cutting frequency pretty seriously."

Fortnam provided few specifics, but said

Pan Am's cuts include trimming the frequency of some routes and eliminating others. For example, the airline's San Juan, Puerto Rico, to Sanford route, Pan Am's most popular flight, is offered twice daily six days a week. Service will be cut to twice a week.

"Puerto Rico absolutely is the best route

we have," Fortnam said. "However, it's very seasonal. September and October are the worst months in the airline industry, and this year it is even more so."

Flights out of Sanford to Newark, N.J., will be eliminated, at least for now, Fortnam said. Pan Am began offering daily flights to Newark, just outside of New York City, on June 28. Fortnam said the route was "a very sought after destination" and noted that demand was growing. However, the cost of

Station bond referendum will be on Nov. ballot

LAKE MARY — It's now up to the voters whether the city should build a new fire station.

City Commission Thursday approved a resolution providing for a bond referendum on the Nov. 5 ballot. Residents will be asked whether they support bond financing, not to exceed \$4 million, for construction of the new public safety facility.

"The bond issue is the funding mechanism to rebuild the fire station," Lake Mary Fire Chief Craig Haun said. "In considering the new station, what we are looking at is the current and future safety and security of the people in Lake Mary."

Discussion concerning a new fire station has circulated within city government for several years. In 2000, \$180,000 was allocated in the city's fiscal year budget to begin design studies for the new facility.

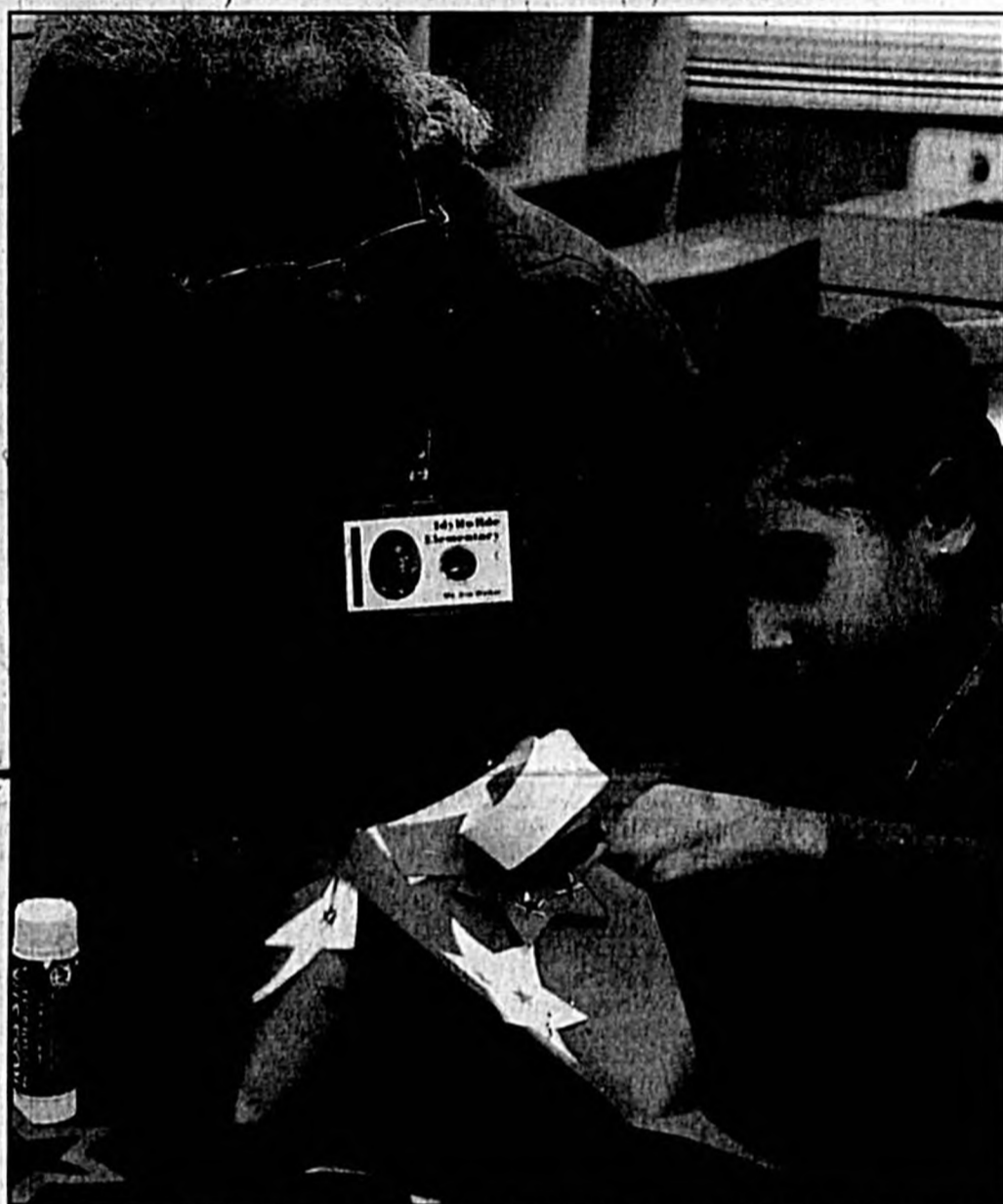
"We obviously need a new fire station," Lake Mary Mayor Thom Greene said. "The old fire station is totally insufficient for the growing needs of our fire department. The structure is not up to current code. It is a metal building that has outlived its usefulness, and it is not capable of handling what our department needs."

Preliminary design proposals include a 20,000 square-foot facility that will house administration, building and safety staff and emergency response equipment crews. Plans include demolishing the department's current facility on Rinehart Road and constructing a new building on the site. Temporary facilities will house emergency crews while the new station is under construction.

The city has until Friday to submit the resolution to the

Operation busts nearly two dozen drug dealers

Nearly two dozen alleged drug dealers were arrested Thursday during a pre-dawn operation that resulted in federal and state drug charges.

Thursday's arrests were the result of a four-month investigation by the Seminole County Sheriff's Office and the Drug Enforcement Agency.

Members of the DEA Mobile Enforcement Team (MET) along with detectives and officers of the Seminole County Sheriff's office began working undercover in late May, making purchases of "crack" cocaine, concentrating their efforts in Altamonte Springs, Casselberry, Oviedo, Midway and Sanford.

During the operation, several loosely knit crack cocaine trafficking organizations were identified and investigated. On Thursday, local and federal agents fanned out throughout Seminole County in the pre-dawn hours to arrest dozens of defendants wanted on both state and federal drug charges.

"This partnership with DEA, the U.S. Attorney's office and State Attorney's office will have a major impact on those who choose to peddle crack cocaine in our community," Eslinger said. "These dealers are looking at several years in either state or federal prisons thanks to this team effort."

All of those arrested Thursday on federal charges face up to 20 years in federal prison, and several are facing a minimum of five

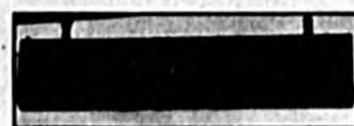
State, local officials gather to unveil Ronald Reagan Boulevard street sign
