PARIS (UPI) - The United States pushed ahead today with its plans to equip its European allies with intermediate range ballistic missiles despite the recent successful firing of the intercontinental missile Atlas.

Informed sources told newsmen at the end of the two-day secret meeting of the NATO military chiefs of staff Thursday that de-Allas made Europen IRBM's less vital than a year ago but still important to Western defense. They said it might be two years

before the Atlas becomes opera-To meeting of the military leaders of the 15 NATO nations was a prelude to the annual NATO foreign, defense and finance ministers conference opening here

Tuesday. U.S. Defense Secretary Neil II. McElroy was flying here from Rome, where he discussed U.S. Italian missile plans with Pre-mier Fariani and President Gronchi. One report said the first shippment of U. S. Jupiter intermediate range missiles was expected to arrive in Italy in the next few months.

Progress in getting the inter-mediate missiles set up in Europe was slow, however. Only Britain and Italy have agreed to accept them and France still is negotiating over them.
