PARIS (UPI) - NATO'I IS foreign ministers shelved for the moment the French-American dispute over defense policy and adopted a four-point agenda for next spring's summit meeting with Russia. Disarmament led the list.

A NATO spokesman said the ministers picked the items they thought should head the program for the East-West talks-disarmament, Germany and the linked Berlin problem, East-West relations generally and aid to underdeveloped countries. The ministers, with Secretary of

Juvenile Assistance Monumental Effort

A group of Seminole County citizens has formed an im rtant organization to assist needy juveniles who might be exposed to trouble or run afoul of the law. County Judge Wilson Alexander originated the idea o non-profit organizations here to assist such youngsters.

Some youths have no families, or are from broken homes, and become delinquent in some way through lack of advice, information and guidance, the judge said. Its charter says that the organization will try to develop better understanding of the problems of needy juveniles

by the public, to encourage the correction, training and education and placement of needy juveniles within the terri-torial limits of Seminole County; to assist financially and therwise the correction and rehabilitation of needy juveniles where no other means of assistance is available.

Judge Alexander, Hugh Carlton, Herald Heckenbach, Jim Singletary, Robert Johnson, the Rev. Ernest Bolick and Kenneth McIntosh deserve the community's highest comnendation for taking the initiative in forming this group. They represent some of the agencies most directly involved with juveniles and undoubtedly will provide far-sighted leadership.

Membership will be open to "interested persons who wish to donate their time and money to needy youngsters," Judge Alexander said.
