Campaign Methods

Anyone who had expected Senator Holland to resort to mud-slinging in the gubernatorial run-off campaign must have been disappointed Thursday morning when he addressed a large crowd in downtown Sanford. He made only the most complimentary references to the Volusia county candidate and whenever he mentioned him at all it was as "The gentleman who is opposing me."

For the most part Holland confined his remarks to an analysis of the previous election returns by which he showed pretty conclusively that he is now the favorite of a large majority of the voters. He led his present opponent in 52 counties out of 67 in Florida and piled up the biggest vote that has ever been secured by any gubernatorial candidate in a first primary, gaining a lead over his opponent of nearly 25,000 votes.

However, he urged his supporters not to be over-confident or take his election for granted and fail to go to the polls on election day. He discussed several phases of the citrus legislation and, referring to the war in Europe, urged national preparedness as the best means of keeping out of war. As one who has a son of military age himself, he promised to do all he could as governor to help keep this country out of it.

His steadfast refusal to belittle his opponent is quite in contrast to the methods which are being used against him. Comparing Holland to Hitler in pamphlets widely distributed was one of the poorest examples of political strategy we have seen in a long time. This and similar attacks made by Whitehair and his spokesmen over the radio are ill-disguised acts born of desperation which would not be rivaled by them under ordinary circumstances.

It stands to reason that if such methods are persisted in by the opposition, Holland sooner or later will be forced to retaliate. He has plenty of courage and is a good fighter. And the ammunition is by no means lacking. It would seem possible to conduct a gubernatorial campaign in Florida on a high plane. May be it isn't. But at any rate, Holland has made the effort.

Fairness To Candidates

Taking the view that a partisan policy in regard to county and local races stirs animosities without justification, the Ledger and Star-Telegram has refrained from sponsoring candidates during the current campaign and will continue such a policy except in instances where it appears that a candidate flagrantly unworthy of the office is about to be elected.

When two candidates for the same office are of approximately the same caliber, it is pointless to favor one over the other. To heap praise upon one local candidate and ignore his equally qualified opponent or vilify him stimulates factionalism which obscures the real issues.

Readers are at first amused and then bored when a newspaper indulges in a general tirade against local candidates. There is no reasonable ground for attacking a qualified local candidate unless the issue is one of more than ordinary import and a principle is in danger of being violated.

If it is an established fact that a candidate is a reprehensible individual without scruples or ability, a newspaper may, with good reason, espouse the candidacy of his opponent—if the opponent isn't equally reprehensible. Otherwise, editorial espousal merely stirs and encourages the equivalent of a dog fight.

The Ledger and Star-Telegram is the largest newspaper in Polk county and is seeking to serve the entire county with increasing thoroughness. Many columns have been published about candidates during the present campaign to give readers an insight into the qualifications of each. Fair treatment has been attempted in every instance and relationships with the candidates have been most cordial.—Lakeland Ledger

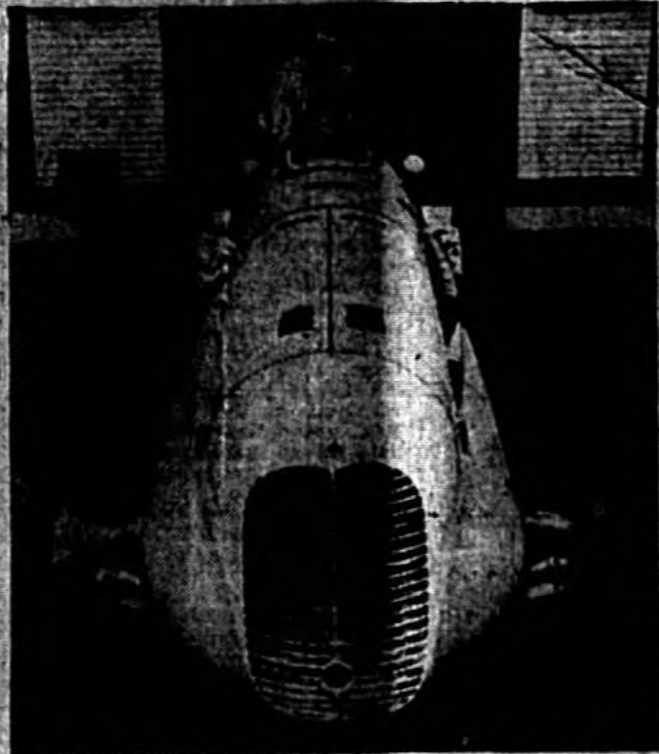

U.S. To Launch Most Powerful Warship June 1

PHILADELPHIA, May 17.—(AP)—The 83,000-ton Washington, first U. S. battleship launched since 1921, will slide down the Navy Yard ways June 1—the most powerful ship of war in the American fleet.

The North Carolina, sister ship of the Washington, is to be launched at the Brooklyn Navy Yard June 15.

Rear Admiral A. E. Watson, Philadelphia Navy Yard Commandant, said today the launching was more than a month ahead of schedule, with the entire construction program speeded "in keeping with the desire of the President" of the United States to expedite naval construction.

More than 16,000 men are employed at the Navy Yard and navy aircraft. That is 5,000 more than peak employment during the World War.

Admiral Watson disclosed that work already is under way on construction of the super-battleship New Jersey, one of two planned to displace 45,000 tons.

The hull of the giant New Jersey is expected to be laid by Navy Day, October 27.

The Washington and North Carolina are being built with beams of 100 feet and speeds of 25 to 30 knots. They will carry 1450 officers and men each, have a 5000 mile cruising range and mount nine 16-inch guns in three turrets.

Final work equipping the 83,000-ton Washington will be completed after she slips into the Delaware River. She will be ready to join the fleet by December, 1941.

The Washington is the sixth United States warship of that name. The first, an 8-gun, was sunk by the British in Lake Champlain in 1716. The fifth was never completed. Planned after the World War as the fleet's main battle ship, it was taken to the sea when 70 per cent complete and sunk off Hampton Roads in 1923 by shellfire from the battleship Texas. That was in compliance with the Washington arms limitation treaty.

One of the new Washingtons is launching will be Miss Virginia Marshall of Spokane, Wash. She is the great-granddaughter of Chief Justice John Marshall.

Cheering Is Not Only Way To Show Reaction To Sports

NEW YORK, May 18.—(AP)—Whoever gets the idea that wild cheering is the only way to show appreciation of sports set a pace that is only just beginning to show, says Americans are enthusiastic sports fans. But, most of us ought to think more often of the rest of the audience and of the players. That would mean more fun for everybody.

But, summer sports remind us we should talk only at the right times—not, by any means, just when a golfer raises his club. And to think about staying in the right places—not to hide across a green during a tournament.

Likewise, spectators should know the elements of a game for their own sakes as well as for those of the players. No escort likes to have a girl ask obvious questions when a thrilling game is in progress. It's easy enough to go to a library and read up on the main points in advance—so you won't have to ask "Why do you call it that?" at the end of the fourth inning, for example.

Most men hate to have their girls join in blood 'n thunder yelling at prize fights or in wild jumping and terrific trading against umpires or athletes.

Men who have women beside them who have women beside them, avoid the sports events but in a way that doesn't attract attention. They don't like, either, to have you wear long feathers or fall flowers that interfere with the view for people behind you.

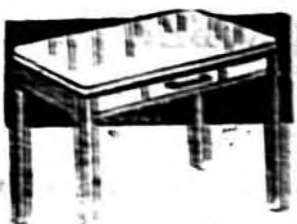

Aides Are Ready To Enter Port Of Narvik

STOCKHOLM, May 18.—(AP)—Aland and Norwegian troops were expected last night about ready to enter Narvik, far-north Norway, one part which has been besieged by the Allies since shortly after German troops captured it some 10 months ago.

News from the Narvik sector said French "Sea Devils" (Alouette troops) were pending immediately against continued German pressure in connection with the Narvik sector.

The London, the British and the U.S. Navy have continued their seasonal advance in the Narvik area and have captured the north shore of the Gulf of Bothnia, German troops with the exception of the Narvik sector.

The British, American and German troops are now in the Narvik area and are expected to enter the port of Narvik in the next few days.

City Liens In Murphy Lands Are Held Valid

TALLAHASSEE, May 18.—(AP)—Sale of thousands of parcels of Murphy lands was confirmed yesterday by a Supreme Court ruling that municipal tax liens against them still are good.

Triumph of the internal improvement fund planned a meeting last week in Tallahassee to effect not only on lands already sold but on the vast number of city lots to which the State holds title.

Although the court never had said so in plain English, the opinion of most officials was that the Supreme Court ruling that all lands now owned by the State were sold out June 9, 1935, on tax-foreclosure lands on which certificates were not returned during the first phase of the Murphy law.

The justices joined Justice J. E. McCall in the view that municipal liens are of equal dignity with State liens "and were not destroyed by the vesting of the lands in the State, and the right of redemption was preserved."

Chief Justice Glass, J. J. Tamm and Justice J. E. McCall were dissenting in the opinion, which said that all liens contract and other obligations were extinguished when the State took title.

The ruling came on a request by the City of Tallahassee to have the State take title to the lands which it had sold to private individuals under the Murphy law.

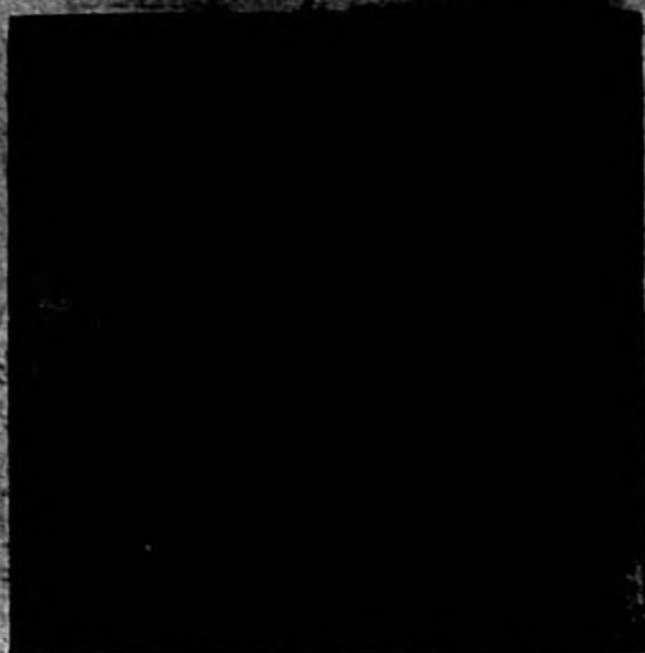
