

Another Meet Is Slated By Board Of Fish Estate

Another meeting will be held shortly by the board of trustees of the Fish Estate, Fred R. Wilson, who attended Friday's meeting of the board in DeLand, said today. Since a number of the trustees were unable to be present, Mr. Wilson added that prospects for Sanford's proposed hospital, which is provided for in the will of the late Bert Fish, are brighter than ever before.

He said that the board pledged every effort to secure the funds necessary to build the hospital. He added that the position of the trustees on this point was "quite emphatic".

In referring to the next meeting of the board, Mr. Wilson said he did not know the exact date but he expected that the trustees would meet before the dedication of the DeLand hospital on Sept. 28.

He said that there are several matters which the board had to handle before the hospital opened and that it was expected to open immediately after the dedication.

Building Permits Reach \$137,000,000 Here During July

Construction of new homes was the main building activity in Sanford during July, and accounted for \$111,500 of the \$137,000 building total of the month, according to J. T. Pope, building inspector.

Building permits during the last month showed an increase of \$20,565 over the \$110,473 figure of July, 1951. A total of 52 permits was issued and other than residential was for general repairs and alterations.

Ozier Weller Homes, Inc., received the largest number of home building permits. These included a \$14,000 three bed room, concrete block house under construction on Melroseville Avenue, three \$7,000 and one \$8,000 house in the Hol Air section, a \$7,000 house on Fairmont Avenue and an \$8,000 dwelling in the Highland Park area.

U. S. Liner Arrives In New York Hours Ahead Of Its Rival

NEW YORK — The superliner United States, trans-Atlantic speed record holder, docked today hours ahead of the British liner Queen Elizabeth on their first simultaneous crossing, but the skipper of the American ship insisted there was no race.

"The woman's race, we just raced away from her," said Commander Harry Manning, master of the United States.

The Queen Elizabeth left Cherbourg Thursday morning, about half an hour before the United States sailed from LeHavre. The next day, the United States overtook the British ship at Bishop's Rock, near the tip of Cornwall, England.

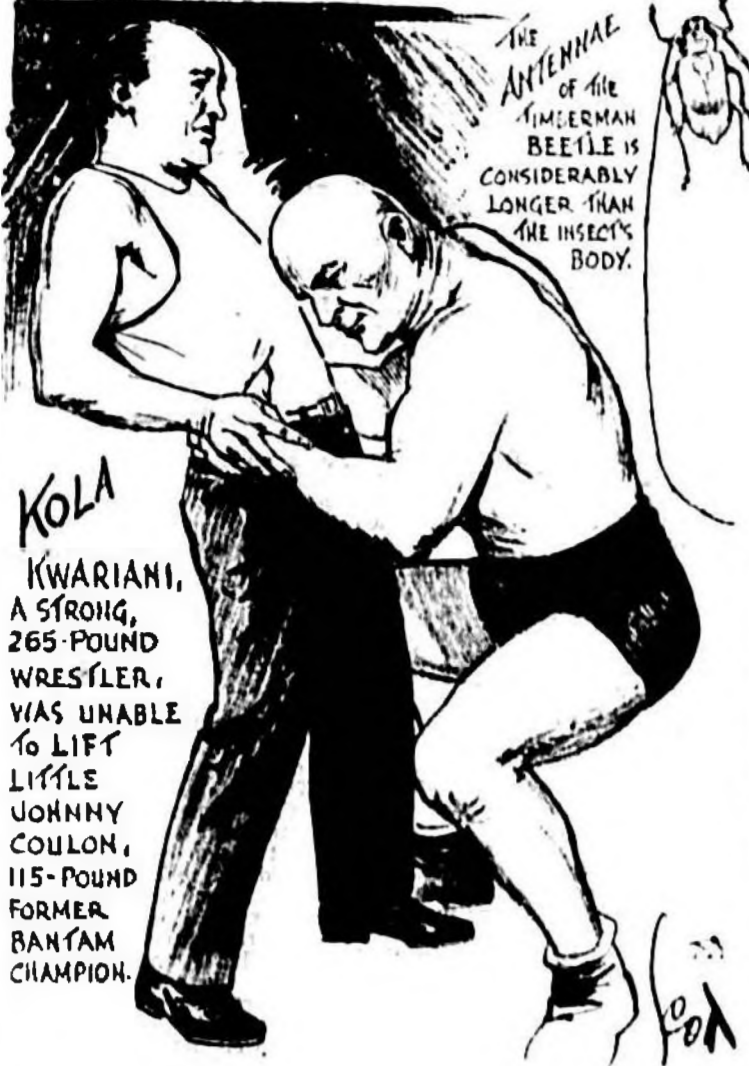
