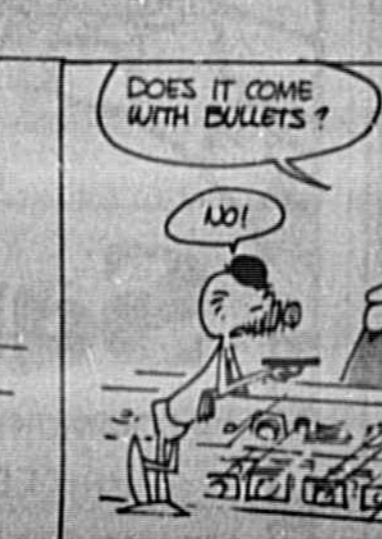

Mrs. Dean Parrish, accused in robbery, slaying shot from his .357 magnum service revolver before crumpling to the floor in the crowded food store.



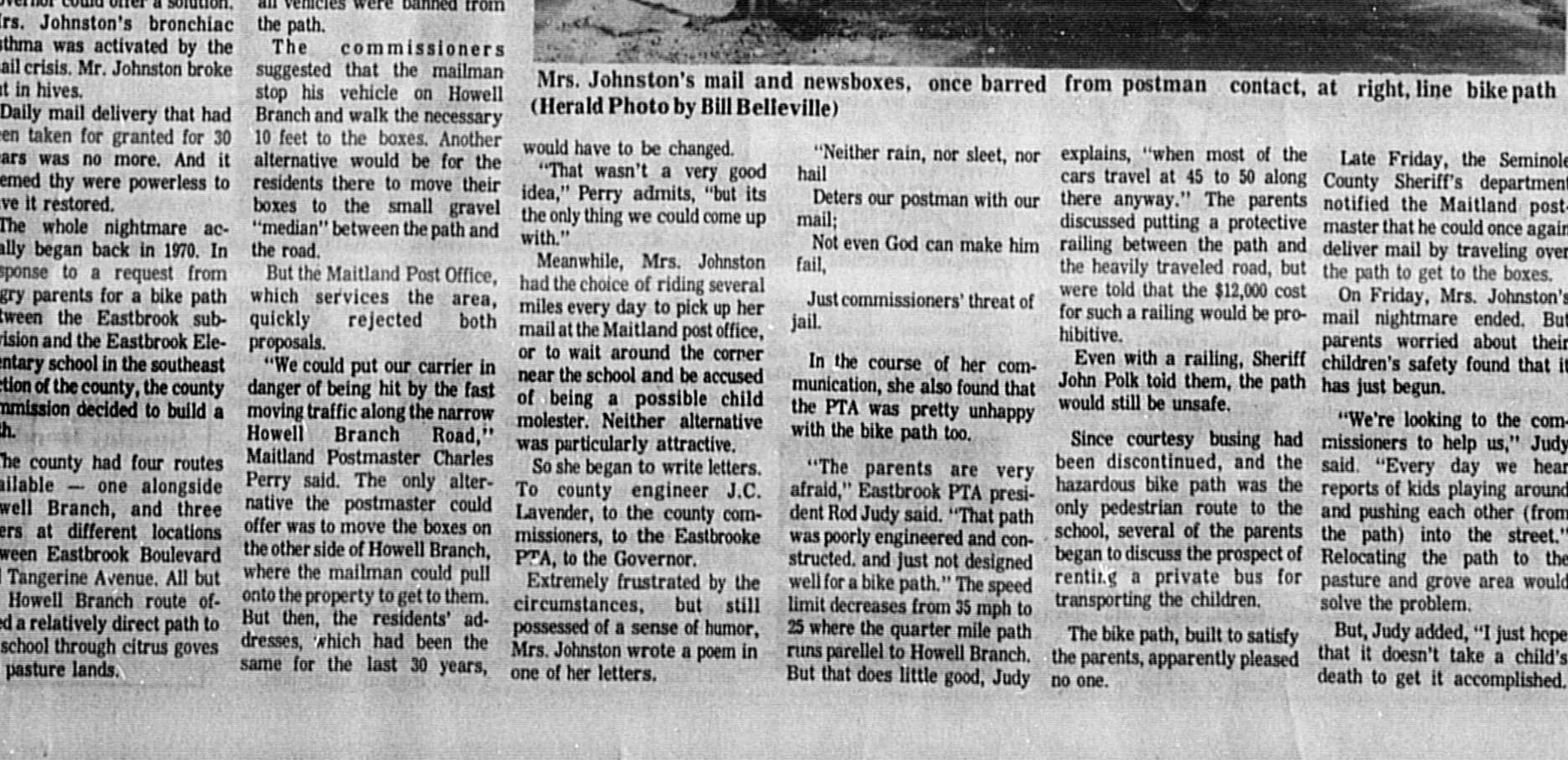

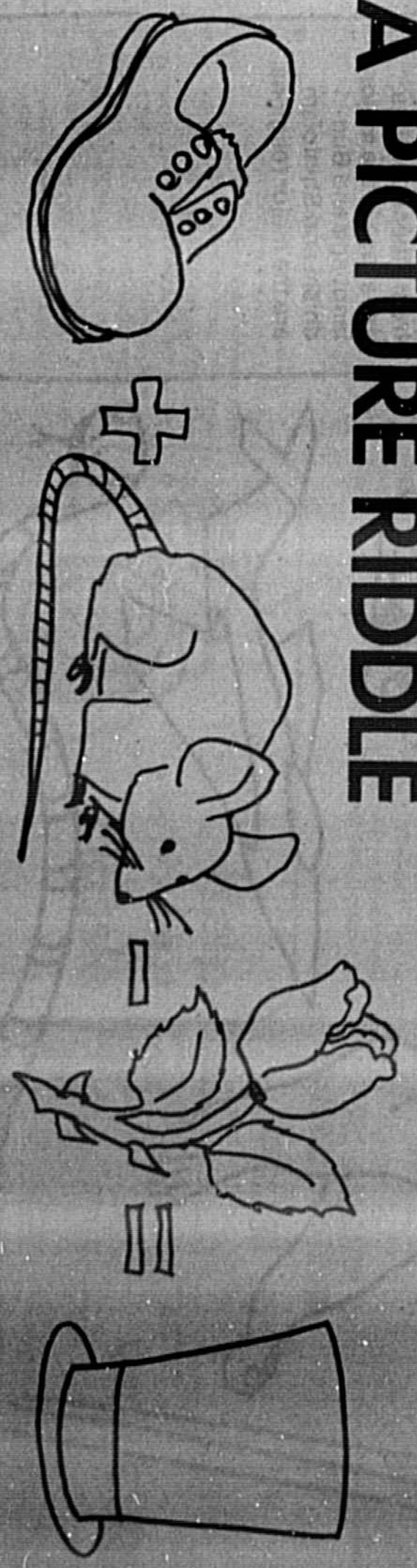


BABIRUSA
