Congress Junks President's Economy Cuts For Farms

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House appropriations committee, warning of possible food shortages, is considering today a bill that would block President Johnson's proposed economy cuts in major farm programs.

"If such a policy as the administration advocates were followed for only a few years, the United States would have a food deficit country instead of one of abundance," the committee said in a report to the House.

The committee's action in junking Johnson's proposed agricultural savings indicated it might do the same next week on his proposed reduction in several popular education programs.

Johnson won a \$600 million economy program in the school drive in an appropriations committee submission this week, but members said they expected to vote against it.

The committee approved and sent to the House for action next week, a \$6.9 billion farm bill to finance farm price supports, agricultural research and related programs in the 12 months starting July 1.

This was \$127 million more than was appropriated for farm purposes this year, and the farm bill is \$112 million more than President Johnson requested.

But the net cuts reflected in the bill are \$112 million more than Johnson requested. The net cuts reflect money saved by cutting back on the farm bill, offset by hard dollar increases in program after program in the farm bill.

Johnson had proposed sharp reductions in farm research, insect control, soil conservation, rural electrification and school lunch programs and school milk programs could start the country down a disastrous road from abundance to scarcity.

More immediately, it warned the cuts would jeopardize farm income and thus the economy of the nation.

As for the committee's effecting cuts in the bill, one proposed \$75 million reduction from \$200 million to \$125 million — was in a land diversion program which pays farmers to take land out of production.

The committee noted that hunger, malnutrition and starvation around the world are on the increase. It cited "unbelievable" population increases, and said the outlook in that food shortage will continue to worsen.

"A majority of the committee feels that under present conditions policies of paying producers to take land out of production is at best un sound and has contributed to our certain basic commodities," the report said.

Senate Rejects Dirksen's Try To Upset Ruling

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Senate rejected Sen. Everett M. Dirksen's attempt to nullify the Supreme Court's ruling requiring state legislatures to be apportioned on population basis. The vote was 55 to 38. The Republican leader failed by seven votes to muster the 60 votes needed to pass an amendment which would have permitted the states to apportion on factors other than population.

The margin of Dirksen's defeat was the same as that by which the Senate rejected last Aug. 4 a similar, but more restrictive, amendment. Fifty-five senators — 27 Democrats and 28 Republicans — voted for the Dirksen amendment Wednesday. Voting against it were 35 Democrats and 13 Republicans.

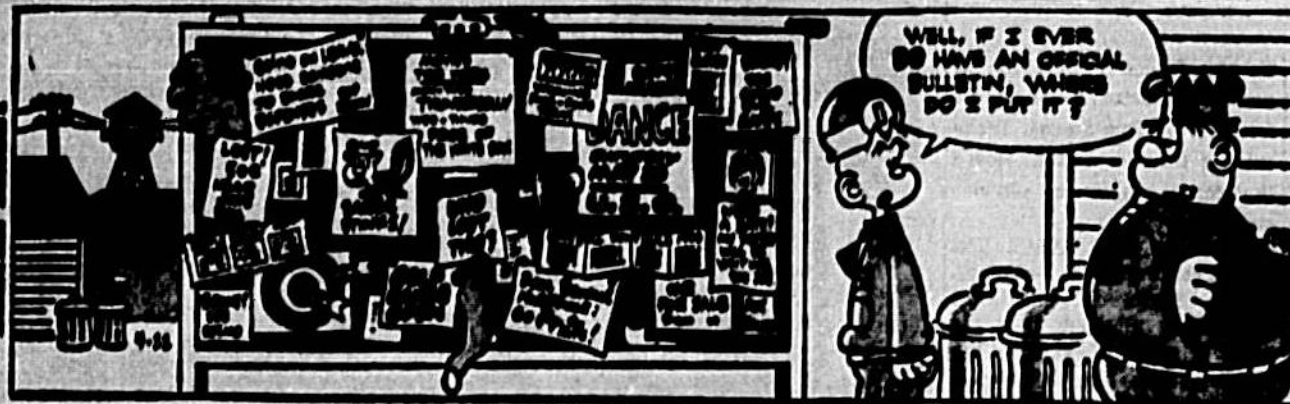
