#### NATO: Release Hostages

The member nations followed the pattern of the Venice economic summit meeting by issuing a separate declaration condemning terrorism, especially against diplomats. But the NATO declaration surpassed the one issued

in Venice by specifically referring to Iran and the U.S. diplomatic personnel held there since Nov. 4.

### **Boards To Assist Cities**

Problems cities in Seminole County have had with enforcement of local ordinances in the courts may be solved by a new law passed during the recent session of the Florida

Sen. John Vogt, D-Cocoa Beach, whose district includes Seminole County, reported to the Sanford Kiwanis Club Wednesday that new law permits cities to appoint "code en-

Those boards will have the power to hear cases brought against individuals for violations of city ordinances, particularly zoning violations, Vogt said. Since elimination of the municipal court system several

years ago, cities have had difficulties getting their cases into the county court. The officer required to take the ordinance violations to court is in the state attorney's office. Douglas Cheshire, state attorney for Seminole and Brevard

counties, has said that his staff must handle serious crimes as priority items. He has said he does not have sufficient staff to also handle prosecutions for ordinance violations. Vogt also reported he was not successful in getting passed a law to permit the city of Casselberry to levy a tax on admissions to the newly converted dog track in the city. But, he

added, there is a good chance general legislation permitting all cities to levy this tax statewide will be passed in the 1981

"That way pari-mutuel facili ties can mean something to local government," Vogt said.

### Shooting Deaths Bring Long Sentences

Herald Staff Writer A Sanford man convicted of second-degree murder and another found guilty of manslaughter in unrelated cases have been sentenced to lengthy jail terms by Circuit Judge Volie

"I think it was purely cold-blooded. There's no excuse," said Williams as he sentenced James "Sonny" Swain to 20 years in prison for the Jan. 15 murder of his girlfriend's daughter. Swain, 51, of 73 Seminole Gardens Apartments, was convicted on March 13 of shooting Mary Williams, 21, of 14 Cowan Moughton Terrace.

Witnesses said Swain, armed with a shotgun, chased Williams from his apartment, then leveled it at her. "I don't killing her instantly.

Willie Lee Jones, 120 Drew Ave., Sanford was sentenced to 15 years in prison followed by 15 years on probation for the Jan. 20 grabbing a gun from under Miss Bordas' body. shooting death of LeRoy Richardson, 33, of 200 W. 16th St., Sanford, at the Deluxe Bar, Goldsboro.

Jones was convicted of manslaughter on March 19. Jones left the bar during a fight and returned almost immediately with a handgun. Richardson, an innocent bystander who had been sitting in a

#### 2nd Retarded Teen Rescued

RANGELEY, Maine (UPI) - They finally found Alan Patenaude sitting naked in Toothacher Brook, covering himself with mud to ward off swarms of large black flies.

His body was covered with insect bites and his eyes were badly swollen, but doctors said the severely retarded teen-ager was otherwise unharmed. Patenaude, 18, was found Wednesday morning, three days after he and a retarded friend wandered away from a camp site in dense, swampy wilderness in northwestern Maine.

His companion, Elaine Barnaby, 19, was found safe Tuesday hiding under a pile of leaves along the same brook where Patenaude was found. Like Patenaude, authorities said the girl was trying to escape the black flies, whose bites leave large red welts on the skin.

#### 'White House' Child Dead

### Senate Republicans Back Reagan's Plan

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Senate Republicans say they plan to attach Ronald Reagan's tax-cut proposal to every possible bill until it is passed or until Americans realize the Democrats are denying them tax relief. A bill to raise the government's debt limit - their first target - was scheduled to reach the floor sometime today. Thirty-

seven of the Senate's 41 Republicans are sponsoring the tax-cut Reagan Wednesday called for a \$20 billion federal tax cut effective next January - including a 10 percent across-theboard reduction in personal income tax rates and a new tax

depreciation schedule to stimulate business. "I believe the situation is desperate enough to the point that I'm saying to Congress: 'Do it now,'" Reagan said at a news conference in Los Angeles. A three-year, 30-percent across-the-board cut in income tax rates has been a keystone of Reagan's presidential campaign.

The former California governor said this latest tax-cut proposal, which he estimated would cost the federal Treasury about \$20 billion, is "just the first installment of an overall program to get the country back on its feet and moving again." After the 10 percent cut has been in effect for three years, he said, income tax rates should be indexed to keep taxpayers from being shoved into higher tax brackets when they receive

cost-of-living pay raises. At a news conference in Washington, former Treasury Undersecretary Charles Walker, who heads a Reagan task force on tax policy, said the 10 percent plan has a chance of getting through Congress this year, while a 30 percent tax cut

Senate Republicans said they would attach the proposal to every possible bill as an amendment until it is passed "or until Americans understand the same people who gave them double-digit inflation are now denying them tax relief." Democrats have said a tax cut that large would be irresponsible and would reignite inflation. However, administration officials, while ruling out a tax cut this year, have indicated they are preparing for one next year.

### **Self-Interest** For Free Trade

Import curbs on Japanese automakers might give the United Auto Workers some temporary help. But they would certainly lead to reprisals and damage our trade relations over the long run.

The UAW appealed recently to the International Trade Commission to order restrictions on imports of Japanese-made cars and trucks into the United States. The auto workers' union wants a high tariff on imported cars and quotas based on 1975 or 1976 levels.

With nearly 300,000 of 1.5 million members of the union laid off because of a sharp drop in domestic car and truck sales, their concern about imports is understandable

But the steps they advocate could cost the rest of us dearly.

Our trade with Japan is a three-cornered trade. We have a favorable balance of trade with Australia, which has a favorable balance of trade with Japan, which has a favorable balance of trade with us. We cannot disrupt our trade with Japan without disrupting our trade with other nations also.

If it were not for the heavy cost of importing oil, this country would have a favorable balance of trade with other nations. Erecting tariff fences could and probably would hurt us more than it would hurt any other nation.

A look at the distribution of international trade along our Pacific Coast is instructive. In the first quarter of this year imports exceeded exports by \$1 billion but more of the deficit was contributed by our trade with Canada, Indonesia and Taiwan than by our trade with Japan. That is, the deficit in our trade with each of these countries was greater than the deficit in our trade with Japan. On the West Coast, Japan is our biggest trading partner, importing and exporting by far more than any other nation. We had better move cautiously before we disrupt such an important trading relationship.

It was 50 years ago that President Hoover signed into law the Hawley-Smoot tariff bill, an infamous measure that provoked 25 other countries to establish retaliatory tariffs and the world plunged into the Great Depression.

Today U.S. industries and their workers face fiercer competition than ever before from European, Japanese and Third World manufacturers. But we are confident that they can cope with such competition, provided that government and labor unions join with business in a new partnership aimed at improving produc-

The world has changed in half a century and become more international, more interdependent, economically and politically. We cannot go back to high tariff barriers. They were disastrous then. They are unthinkable now.


### The Energy Bond

The United States, mostly adrift on the energy seas since Richard Nixon's call for "energy independence" in 1973, may yet be freed of the shackles installed by the oil-producing nations. But the credit will go to our energy captors, not to any positive U.S. actions to break the bonds.

Price increases initiated by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries have brought the market price of oil to about \$36 per barrel.

And, according to Dan Lundberg, that is in the range of production costs of the so-called alternative energy sources such as oil shale, tar sands, liquified and gasified coal and fuels from organic material. The publisher of the analytical Lundberg Letter said such parity has been the OPEC goal — anything less, he says, is tantamount to exploitation of OPEC's finite resources.

Lundberg has emphasized that the OPEC switch from a "floor" price to a "ceiling" price is indicative of the change in policy.

WASHINGTON (NEA) - The awful truth has been revealed about Rep. John B. Anderson's presidential campaign: It's in danger of disintegration because it's being held together with the political equivalent of paper clips and chewing gum.

The supposedly sophisticated organization is headed by a candidate whose many strengths include neither knowledge of, nor interest in, efficient campaign management and a temperamental political consultant whose reputation for success at the polls has been considerably overrated. Anderson's serious organizations

problems have surfaced as a result of a personality clash between two New York City residents, both actively involved in the campaign - philanthropist Stewart R. Mott and campaign manager David L. Garth. Their intense personal feud, dating back to early April, was resolved in mid-June when Anderson publicly renounced as unauthorized meddling Mott's elaborate efforts to provide voluntary assistance and guidance to the

"However well-intentioned, Mott's activities have proved disruptive," the congressman said in calling upon Mott "to cease and desist his unauthorized in-

volvement in my campaign." Mott indeed can be vexatious, but in the case of the Anderson campaign he provided the candidate with a pair of carefully crafted memoranda that detailed scores of critical organizational problems demanding

Inept budgetary planning, inadequate outreach to middle-class voters, ineffective use of public-opinion surveys and inefficient management of the campaign organization were among the critical issues cited by Mott. "Hundreds of thousands of people are now eager to help you. Offers of volunteer help

abound," Mott said in one memo to Anderson. "But the campaign's central management still is ill-equipped to capitalize on this outpouring of interest." Several Anderson political aides, each of

whom requested anonymity, confirmed independently that the disorganization within the campaign committee has, on occasion,

The most sensitive portion of Mott's memo, however, was his suggestion that other professional consultants be retained by the campaign to supplement the work of Garth, described by Mott as a "prima donna" who 'quits twice a week."

Garth "turns off people, doesn't listen well (and is) arrogant about his perceptions," said Mott, arguing that Garth "knows state campaigns but (is) new to national





#### Government Seeks Reversal Of Judge's Boat Ruling

MIAMI (UPI) - Government prosecutors return to a federal judge's courtroom today to seek a suspension of his order releasing 31 shrimp boats seized during government efforts to halt to the Cuban sealift until they have a chance to appeal.

U.S. District Judge Sidney Aronovitz Wednesday said government seizure of the boats caused the boatowners "irreparable harm" by denying them their livelihood and possibly denying their rights to due

The 31 boats owned by 19 interests were among 900 seized since President Carter decided May 14 to forbid boats to take part in the Cuba-to-Key West sealift that




