

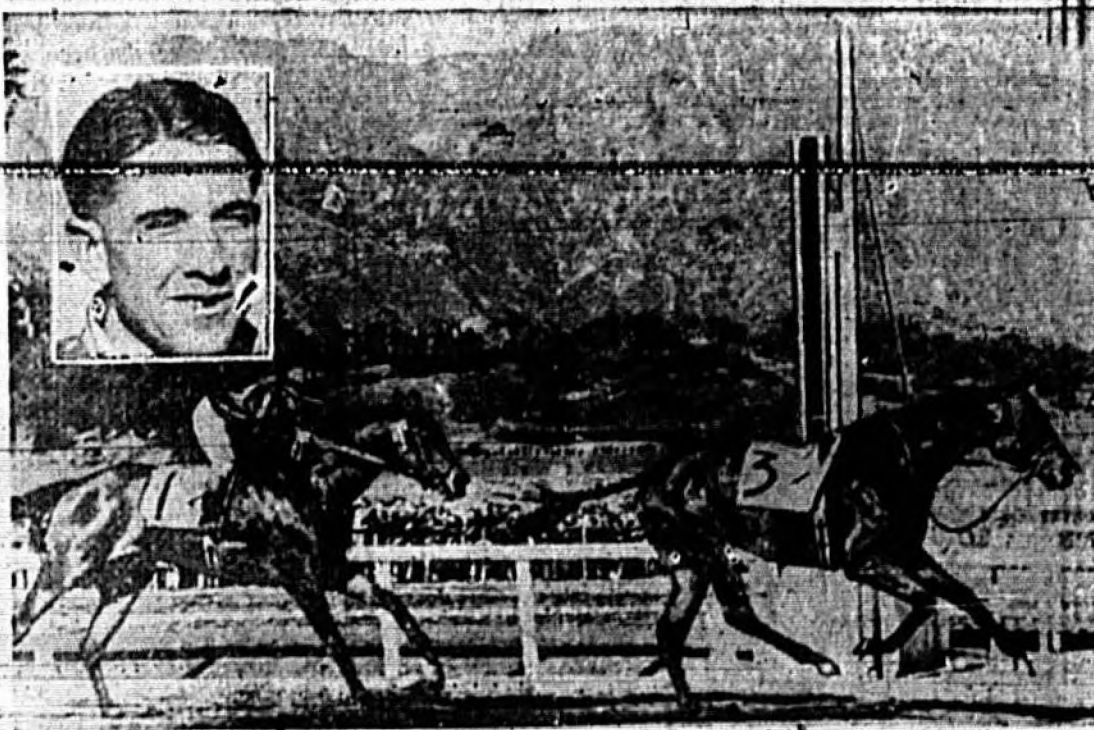
Trautman Assumes Duty As Detroit General Manager

George Trautman took over his duties today as General Manager of the Detroit Tigers. In his first public statement, he said that Steve O'Neil, the Tiger Manager, would run the team on the field. Declared Trautman: "I believe my duties should end at the edge of the playing field. The rest is up to Steve."

Attlee Speaks At Opening Of UNO Meeting

Says Atomic Power Must Be Controlled To Prevent Ruin And Annihilation

LONDON, Jan. 10, (AP)—In a spirit of grave and sober dedication, Britain's Prime Minister Attlee has opened the first session of the United Nations General Assembly. To the delegates assembled from all quarters of the globe, Attlee set forth the nature of the task for which the new world organization has been called into being.

The British premier said: "The coming of the atomic bomb was only the last of a series of warnings to mankind that, unless the powers of destruction could be controlled, immense ruin and almost annihilation would be the lot of most of the human race."

Attlee then reminded the delegates of past mistakes from which lessons must be learned. He said that the support of the masses of people throughout the world, Attlee said: "They must understand that we are building a defense for the common people."

Turning to the police powers of the new organization, Attlee said that the force is necessary part of a civilized community. The greater the social security and contentment of the population, the less important is the police force, he declared.

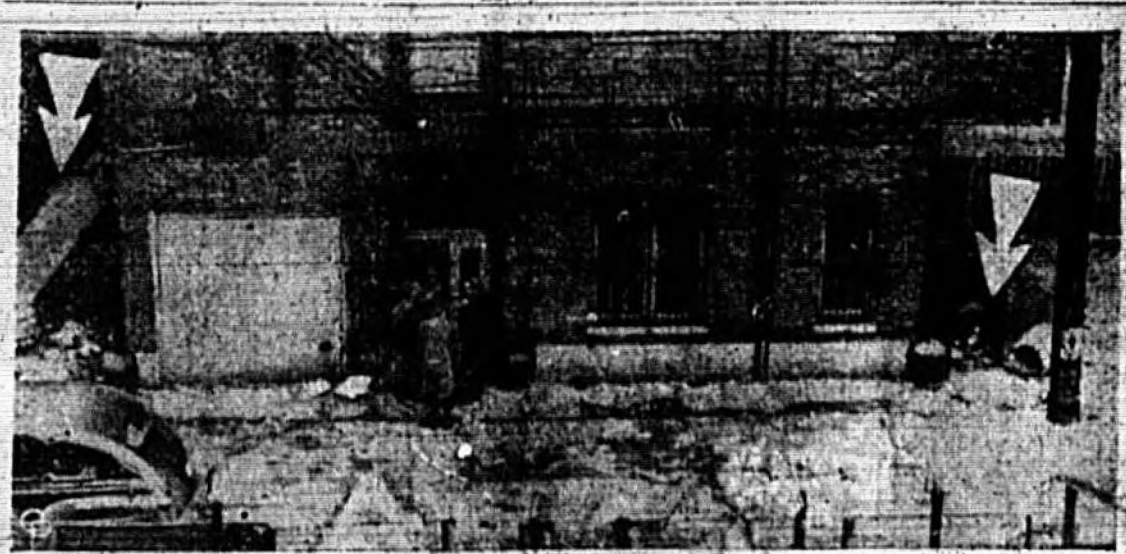

Demand For Farm Products Might Reach 1945 Levels

GAINESVILLE, Fla.—Demand for farm products is expected to be as high as in 1945, but farm prices and farmer's net incomes are expected to decline somewhat, says Dr. C. V. Noble, agricultural economist with the University of Florida Agricultural Extension Service, in a 1946 outlook report.

In spite of an expected decrease of 15 percent in industrial production, progress in reconstruction of industry, unemployment figures lower than at one time anticipated and continued good consumer purchasing power furnish an optimistic background for the 1946 agricultural outlook, he says.

Brief summaries of the national outlook, by communities, with suggestions applicable to Florida, follow:

Fruit crops—Prices are high relative to all agricultural products and are expected to drop.

National economists fear that Florida citrus will meet with marketing difficulties in the next two years.

Vegetables—Expected to be in good demand, with prices slightly lower than in 1945. The only vegetable crop expected to encounter marketing difficulties early in 1946 is potatoes, which will compete with a large carry-over of old potatoes.

Cotton—Demand continues good for both fine-cured and low-grade types, and production is expected to be at about the same level or slightly higher.

Peanuts—Average reductions in peanuts for harvest are suggested, in the interest of soil conservation. The government has announced a guarantee of 99 percent of the peanut parity price of next July for the 1946 crop.

Feed crops—Supplies of corn, oats, barley and sorghum grain per animal unit to be fed are slightly larger than last year; in fact, they are the largest on record for 20 years.

Increased production of feed crops by Florida farmers is recommended.

Beef cattle—Increased civilian demands are expected to offset reduced military demands for beef.

Hogs—Supplies of pork and lard have not been adequate to meet demands, and larger pig crops and liberal feeding are suggested for Florida farmers during 1946.

Dairy cattle—Total milk production and milk production per cow in 1945 was the highest on record. Since Florida is a deficit state, increased milk production, where possible, is suggested.

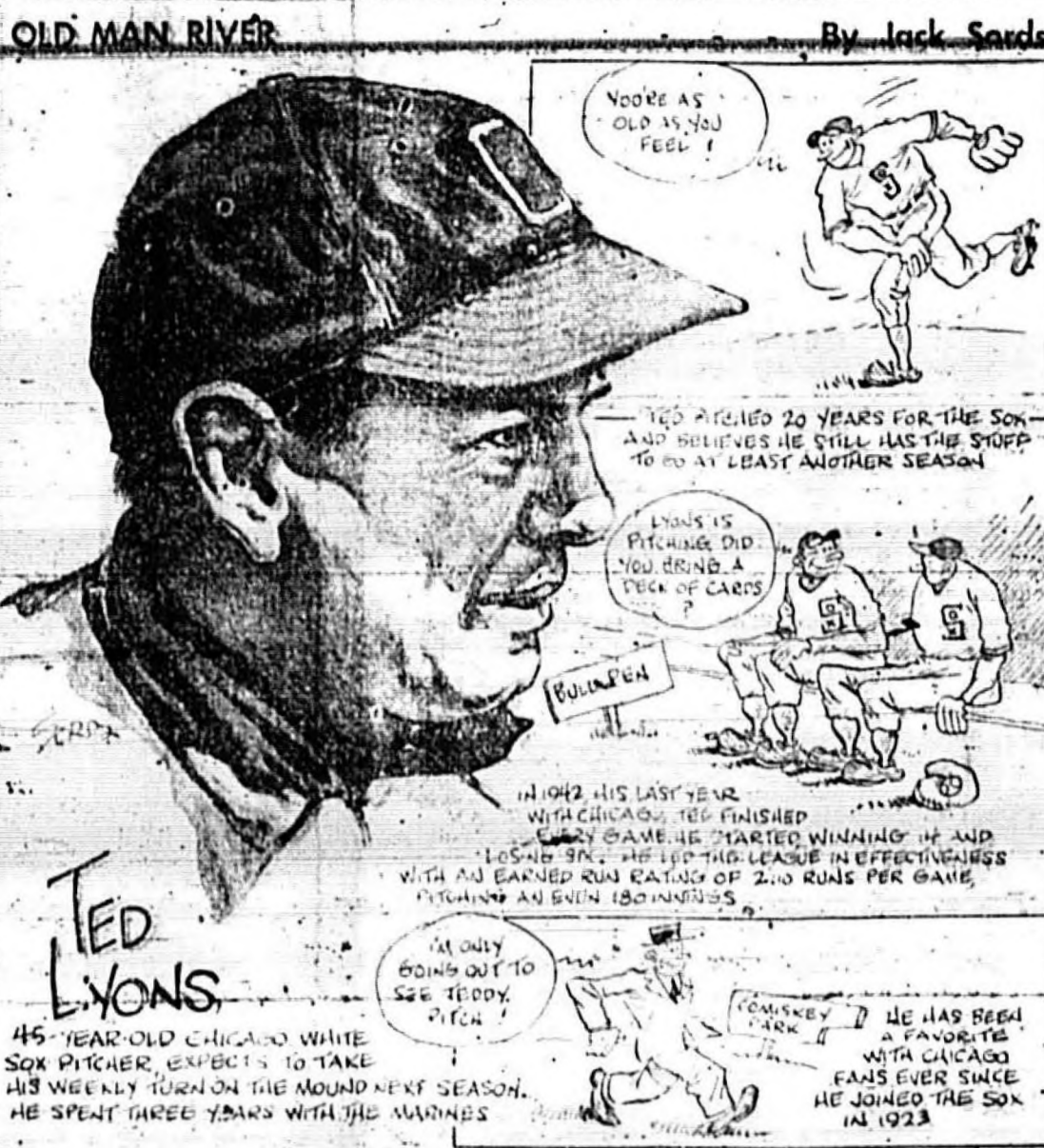
