FALLACY OF CURRENCY INFLATION
BY WALTER LITTMAN

The discussion about currency and prices would be much less confusing if the advocates of various policies would say clearly what they mean. For, as the argument is now running, the public is left to believe that there is a radical or heroic school which wishes to raise prices by monetary means and a conservative or orthodox school, which does not wish to raise prices. The impression is untrue. If we take the word "conservative" in its original sense, it means a man who is actually here today a billion dollars less currency today, when we say at the bottom of the debt, which is going to be expanded ten or twelve times. Since no one will treat the money, no one will lend the money to the government or to any one else. He knows he will never get it back. The result is that the government can no longer borrow to cover its deficit. It must therefore, issue more money. The more it issues the more worthless does the money become.
