

KEY WEST, Fla. (UPI) - Two lobster boats returned to Key West Monday from Cuba with 40 Cubans aboard and South Florida Cuban exiles scrambled to find more vessels to bring asylum seekers from Havana's Peruvian Embassy. Radio Havana in a broadcast monitored in Miami today quoted the Cuban Communist Party newspaper Granma as saying 11 more boats would leave Cuba today with an additional 300 Cubans aboard. The broadcast said the Fidel Castro government had lifted its sea barriers to the sealift and is encouraging boats from Florida to come and pick up some of the thousands of asylum seekers huddled on Havana's Peruvian Embassy grounds.

Tito's Bleeding Lessens

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (UPI) — President Josip Broz Tito was reported in exceptionally grave condition today but his doctors said they had managed to lessen the 87-year-old leader's internal bleeding. "The general health condition of President Tito is somewhat better than the preceding days, but it is still exceptionally grave," the official daily medical bulletin said. "The bleeding is considerably less. "Intensive medical measures continue," it said.

This country is asking our allies for help in boycotting the Olympics and embargoing Iran. The good news is that the Olympic boycott looks bright. We commend the members of the U.S. Olympic Committee who formed the majority recently voting against U. S. participation in the Moscow Olympics.

We do not minimize the spirit of self-sacrifice that was involved in the decision. Sure, American farmers had to make the same kind of sacrifice when the president ordered an end to grain sales to Russia. So did manufacturers of highly technical equipment when sales of such equipment to the USSR was banned. So did NBC, when the network was prohibited from sending its

equipment to Moscow to televise the Olympics. But in none of these previous sacrifices were the sacrificing parties asked to volunteer for the public is already dissatisfied with its sacrifice. The Iranian embargo is a different matter. The programs. economic stakes are high, not only in the loss of the greatly diminished Iranian oil exports but also the threat to substantial investments made in Iran by Japan and the nations of Western Europe. And, on the other hand, what is involved is not the invasion of a neighboring nation by the communist superpower whose geopolitical ambitions threaten the peace of the world, but instead the irrational act of a chaotic revolutionary regime which has reduced Iran to a state of ararchy. The taking of the American hostages is seen as a feeble gesture by a group of ineffective fanatics,

not as a threat to the free world. We cannot realistically expect our allies to sacrifice their economic interests in Iran to help us rescue the 50 hostages and restore our national pride. But we must ask for such help, if for no other reason that to lay the foundation for later unilateral action by ourselves.

A naval blockade of the Persian Gulf could be carried out without firing a shot. It would effectively impose an embargo. If our allies are properly prepared and friendly nations on the Persian Gulf are fully consulted in advance, a blockade would not harm our relations with any other nation. Indeed, a decision to blockade could restore the respect of the world for this country's power and will to use it in defense of our own legitimate self-interest.

Our position of world leadership imposes upon us a heavy responsibility in the conduct of foreign affairs. There are times for patience and restraint. But our allies also understand that there come times when the leader must show selfconfidence and strength.

Florida House Passes Conversion Bill

By DONNA ESTES Herald Staff Writer

"If they (the Legislature) think they've got a sleeping dog, they had better not pick him." With these words, Jerry Collins, owner of the Sanford-Orlando Kennel Club warned legislators today he will challenge the legality of the bill passed by the Florida House today to allow the Seminole Harness Raceway to become a dog of the public if this is constitutionally right."

A clause in that bill designed to discourage legal action, would eliminate pari-mutuel wagering statewide in the event of a successful court challenge.

"I will take the act to court even if it means wiping out the pari-mutuel industry in Florida," Collins said. "I built dog racing from the ways of the Capone gang to what it is today. Anytime the Legislature can handle a bill like this ... anytime

they can go back to the old ways of doing things, it is not fair to the public," he said. Collins is upset about the combining of the Seminole County

bill with a Dade County act to convert a dog track to a jai alai "What's good for Dade County is not good for Seminole County," Collins said. "I'm going to determine for the benefit

Collins also said he had been given the word of dog track owners statewide that they would band together to keep the Dade County and Seminole County acts separated. "If the courts say this is constitutionally right, I will sell my race track interests. I do not want to be associated with a bunch of guys like this," said Collins, who has owned and operated the dog track in Longwood for the past 25 years.

Collins said he attended the pari-mutuel subcommittee

Thursday afternoon. The Seminole County and Dade County combined bill was prepared Thursday norning and presented to the committee Thursday afternoon. Collins said he attempted to speak against the bill in the committee, but was not permitted to. During the full com-

mittee on Regulated Industries, a gag rule was imposed, again denying him the opportunity to speak. Collins said. Collins said he feared the two bills would be tied together. Collins said he authored the bill which passed in the 1940s forbidding dog racing facilities from being closer than 100 miles to one another. And, he added, this new proposed law violates that principle. State Rep. Robert Hattaway, D-Altamonte Springs, who is
