Schools Detend 'Choice' Policy

Finding A Way

In 1948 governors of the South got together and set up the Southern Regional Education Board. The hope was that each state could have better colleges and universities with sharing efforts of neighboring states.

One of the distinctive parts of the plan was an exchange of students seeking special studies. to avoid the waste of establishing colleges for all subjects in all states. For instance, Alabama send some of its boys to the University of Tennessee to study dentistry, and Tennessee sends some of its boys to Auburn to learn veterinary medicine.

The 1969 report shows much more interest in getting ahead of the national rate of growth in educational accomplishment than in looking backward. But it has some figures that show fast change for the better.

- The 1950 enrollments in universities, colleges and junior colleges of the 15 states numbered about 565,000. It now is more than 1.700.000.

- It was 19 per cent of the South's college age youth. Now it is 38 per cent. - The South's production of doctoral degrees was 566 in 1950. It is 4,900 this year. - It was only 9 per cent of the nation's doctorates, compared with 19 per cent in 1969.

Statistics are only part of any accounting, but these show substantial results for a kind of effort only 20 years old. - Memphis (Tenn.)

Federal guidelines knocked out a surplus food commodity program for Seminole County back about 1962, it was recalled today by former County Commission Chairman James P. Avery Jr. The Herald queried Avery after receiving reports that a contract had been signed between the federal and county governments to supply surplus foods for the needy in the county.

"Agreement was reached to inaugurate the program," Avery said, "and the County Commission leased the old railroad loading platform for a warehouse." (He was referring to the old railroad building on the north side of First Street at Myrtle Avenue.) Avery continued: "The county spent \$1,200 to

put up partitions and otherwise get the building in shape to handle the food program. Then some smart Alec bureaucrat came in from Washington and laid down guidelines how 'they' would handle the program. 'They' were going to open it up so that everyone in Seminole County would have been eligible to draw free food.

"The county tried to reason . . . and finally called it quits. We sub-let the railroad building to Chase and Company and recovered all the money the county had spent to put it in shape."




