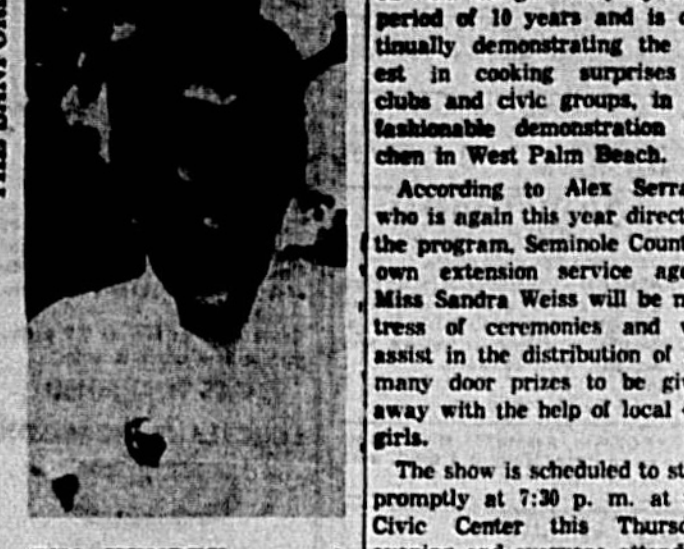
University Estates Going Up' On SR 46.

SMALL FRY PARTY LUNCH

CARAMEL POPCORN
 1/2 cup granulated sugar
 1/2 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
 1/2 cup butter or margarine
 2 1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk
 1/2 cup light corn syrup
 4 quarts popcorn

Into a heavy medium saucepan, pour all the ingredients and bring to a boil, stirring constantly, over medium heat. Add one small marshmallow (about 1/2 ounce) (see degrees). Four over popcorn and stir until evenly coated. Spread on cookie sheet to cool.

ONE OF the most satisfactory projects ever to go on in our kitchen is the making of watermelon pickles. Each summer we glow when we turn out a batch, count up the cost and find it's simply-bank money compared to what these pickles cost when bought.

But one word of caution. The recipe recommends thoroughly rinsing the watermelon rind after soaking in the lime water. Do not use a colander and a big water-filled bowl and rinse many times. Make sure that all free lime scales and is discarded with the rinsing water.

TWO-DAY WATERMELON PICKLE
 2 pounds prepared watermelon rind (about 1 1/2 quarts)
 4 teaspoons slaked lime (calcium hydroxide in small bottles at drugstores)
 1 1/2 tablespoons salt
 2 teaspoons ground ginger
 3/4 cups distilled white vinegar
 2 cups sugar
 8 sticks cinnamon (each about 3 inches long), broken into shorter pieces
 1 1/2 tablespoons whole allspice
 1/2 tablespoon whole cloves
 whole nutmeg (if too hard to cut, pound to crack)
 1 lemon (unpeeled, seeds removed and sliced 1/4 to 1/2 inch thick)
 Green food coloring

To prepare watermelon rind, trim off and discard green part of rind. Cut rind into 1-inch square pieces; measure and set aside.

Into a non-metallic bowl holding 1 quart cool water, stir 2 teaspoons of the slaked lime; add rind; stir in another quart of cool water. Let stand 1 hour; stir in remaining 2 teaspoons lime and let stand from 1 to 1 1/2 hours. Thoroughly rinse and drain rind to remove all free lime.

Into a large pot turn the rind, salt, ground ginger, 1 cup of the vinegar and enough water to cover. Boil gently until rind is tender—anywhere from 20 minutes to 1 hour, depending on thickness texture and variety of watermelon. Without draining, turn into a non-metallic bowl; cool; refrigerate overnight.

While rind is cooking, prepare apple solution. Into a small saucepan put the cinnamon, allspice, cloves and cracked nutmeg, add 1/2 cup of the vinegar and 1/2 cup water. Cover and heat to boiling; let barely simmer for 10 to 15 minutes. Remove from heat and allow to stand, covered for 1 hour; strain through cheesecloth-lined strainer; cover and refrigerate.

When ready to finish pickles, take a large pot turn the remaining 4 cups vinegar and the sugar; heat, stirring until sugar dissolves. Drain the refrigerated rind and add with enough water to cover. Boil gently until rind begins to look clear; add the apple solution and lemon; continue boiling gently until rind looks translucent. Remove from heat. Stir in enough green food coloring to make rind and syrup a pretty green.

Should syrup become too thick before pickle is ready for putting into jars, thin with equal parts of vinegar and water.

Prepare pint or half-pint fruit jars according to manufacturer's directions. Using a slotted spoon, pack jars with the boiling hot watermelon rind, but not to the very top. At once pour in boiling hot pickle syrup to within 1/4-inch from top, making sure syrup covers rind. Wipe off any spills on top or threads of jars. Put some lids on jars; screw heads tight.

Make about 3 pints. Allow to mellow for 3 or 4 weeks, stored in a dark place, before using.

BUTTERS-COTCH PECANS
 1/2 cup sugar
 1/4 cup dark corn syrup
 2 tablespoons light cream
 1 tablespoon water
 2 tablespoons butter
 1 1/2 cups (8-ounce can) pecans, broken

In a medium saucepan stir together the sugar, corn syrup, cream and water. Over medium heat bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Continue cooking, stirring occasionally, till temperature reaches 280 degrees on a candy thermometer or until a small amount of mixture dropped into very cold water forms a ball that is hard enough to hold its shape, yet retains elasticity. Add butter. Continue cooking, stirring constantly, until candy thermometer reads 280 degrees or until a small amount of mixture tested in cold water separates into threads that are hard but not brittle. Stir in pecans, coating evenly. At once spread out on a buttered cookie sheet. When cold, break apart. Makes about 1 pound.

2 large yellow beans cooked (see directions below)
 2 tablespoons butter
 2 tablespoons sugar
 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 1 pound snap beans cooked (see directions below)

Pare and core apples; cut each into 3 wedges; cut each wedge into 3 lengthwise slices. In a 10-inch skillet over moderate low heat, heat the butter; add apples; turn in the butter; cover tightly and steam (shaking skillet several times) for about 3 minutes. Turn apples over and steam again (shaking skillet several times) for 1 minute or until just cooked through. Gently mix sugar and lemon juice with apples, mix in beans. Reheat gently. Makes 6 servings.

Notes: To prepare beans, tip and scrub; leave whole. Boil, covered in 1 cup boiling water with 1/4 teaspoon salt until tender—crisp—12 to 15 minutes; drain. Lift cover from beans a few times during cooking to keep them green.

CORN CRACKERS
 1/2 cup sifted regular flour
 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
 1 teaspoon salt
 1/4 cup enriched white cornmeal
 1/4 cup buttermilk
 3 tablespoons salad (not olive oil)

In a bowl, sift together the flour, soda, salt and cornmeal. Add buttermilk and salad oil, stirring only until mixture is dampened—it will be crumbly. Using your hands, form it into a ball. Divide dough in half. Wrap in plastic wrap and let stand about 10 minutes to make dough easier to handle. Roll out on prepared pastry cloth until paper-thin. Don't worry about oil seeping out onto cloth. Cut with floured 3-inch round cutter. Place, an inch apart, on ungreased cookie sheets. Bake in a 400-degree oven until lightly browned—8 to 10 minutes. Makes about 4 dozen.
