

'Vicious' Dog Faces Death After Attacks

By DAVID M. RAZLER

The fate of a 4-year-old German shepherd called vicious by the Seminole County Animal Control Board will be decided this week by County Judge Alan Dickey The board has declared "Rolf" too dangerous to be allowed

to live and has asked Dickey to order the dog killed. Richard Russell, Rolf's owner, contends he has a perfectly normal healthy animal and that the board decided the dog's fate without reviewing all the evidence. He will ask the animal be released from the county animal shelter and turned over to

The controversy began June 29, when Rolf got loose of Russell's property on Chapman Road, two miles south of

The dog bit Margarita Little, who had driven over to Russell's home to drop off his son, who had been playing with Mrs. Little's grandchild at her home. Mrs. Little's skin was broken by one of the bites, and, according to Animal Control Board head Diane Whers, the dog

continued to try to attack the woman even while his owner held Mrs. Little went to the state attorney's office and made a formal complaint asking the control board to step in. Under county law, the control board, made up of two county department representitives, a veterinarian, and five citizens.

has the power to evaluate and suggest the fate of animals which are neglected by their owners or feared dangerous. A county judge makes the final ruling in all cases. Russell claims he has a normal dog who simply broke loose from his chain and attempted to protect him from a stranger. After listening to Russell, Mrs. Little and other witnesses who came to the control board hearing to testify about the dog's behavior, the board members decided this was not the case. They asked Judge Dickey to order the dog destroyed. Mrs. Albers said this was only the second time in six years the board'had made such a request. "He's an unstable dog,"

she said, claiming records state Rolf has bitten at least one other person — a child who needed stitches in both legs to close bites. The dog attacks without provocation or warning, she said, calling his behavior abnormal. She said several of Russell's neighbors had come to the hearing to tell how Rolf had killed their ducks, chickens and

rabbits while he ran at large during evening bours. Russell said Rolf does indeed run loose between sundown and sunrise, but the dog remains on guard, close to his home. He said the witnesses had never seen his dog kill any animal, but just blamed him as the only dog in the neighborhood they feel could be responsible.

Mr. Albers said the dog had been spotted and recognized on several occasions, and had even chased people riding horses in Both say the dog has been picked up once by animal control

officers who found him running loose. 'Although Russell has offered to take the animal to an Orlando kennel for obedience and guard dog training, Mrs. Albers said the board, citing a variety of factors, does not think

"Any place else, this dog would have been put down in the blink of an eye" she said, saying the board attempted to come up with other possible solutions. She laid the blame for Rolf's behavior at least partially on his owner, who kept the dog chained by the collar and a second chain attached to a belt around the dog's waist. The dog had

only six feet of chain, she said. In both cases when Rolf bit people, the dog was accidentally released, Mrs. Albers said. The first time, a neighbor's young child had released the dog while playing with Russell's children, she said.

Francis said the problem with Rolf and most local dog owners is simply that both dogs and owners lack training. The best method to cure a problem dog like Rolf is to train the dog in obedience, then train the owner how to care for the

He did not believe there would be a problem saving Rolf and turning him into a properly behaved animal, he said. Francis said the board members, most of whom have done child's shoes, something she said does not account for deep some work with dogs, either owning or breeding them, according to Albers, lack the training to understand an animal's

Such seems to be the prospect with a recent proposal made to the Sanford City Commission in an effort to bring about supposedly better political representation for all sections of the city.

Thus, a dangerous revamping of municipal government as we know it today in Sanford may be in the works and it should be thoroughly researched before any such changes are given any serious consideration.

The city commission has been asked by Rev. Amos Jones, executive director of Seminole Community Action, to take steps to provide better representation for all segments of the community

He asked that a group of citizens from the city's west side meet with the commission to discuss their recommendations for change.

The changes sought include, according to Jones, increasing the city commission to seven members, with four commissioners elected from newly-created districts, and three, along with the mayor, elected at large; a committee be appointed to draft district boundaries; the appointment of one or more blacks to the city's civil

The types of municipal government available to American cities today are varied and complex. The reasons a mayor-aldermanic system versus a city manager-commission system works better in one city over another are many.







Sellers Of Drug Paraphernalia Fight New Law

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - Retailers of drug parphernalia say drugs themselves - not acompanying items like waterpipes, scales and other items - create drug abuse problems and that is where law enforcement should focus its

"Paraphernalia is to drug abuse what beer steins are to alcohol. The problem is to catch the alcoholics, not to put the beer stein manufacturers in jail," said Ted Tripp Jr., attorney for a group of head shops challenging Florida's drug antiparaphernalia law.

close down or get rid of a substantial part of their merchandise if the law is allowed to take effect Oct. 1. The new law makes it illegal to manufacture, advertise or sell pipes, scales, bowls, capsules and similar wares if it can be shown they are meant to be used with illegal drugs.

The group, called Florida Businessmen for Free Enterprise, urged U.S. District Judge William Stafford Thursday to give them at least preliminary relief from the law before Oct. 1. "We are talking about destruction of a \$20 million-\$30 million

"It makes it difficult if not impossible to determine which items you could sell or what you would go to jail for," he said. The law, for example, makes it a crime to manufacture scales that might be used in the handling of illegal drugs. "The fact is," said Tripp, "that a scale is a scale is a scale. Hamer, Mississippi-born sharecropper and timekeeper. Forced from her home when she registered to vote, she became an active fighter for civil rights. founded the Mississippi Democratic Freedom Party and co-founded the National Women's Political

She is a past chairman of the Seminole County Commission on the Status of Women, has worked with the Domestic Violence Task Force and is president of

causes and committees have been goal oriented since their early days in school, moving from high school and college into their chosen career. This is not the case with Mrs. Gordon. In fact, she is a fine example of a wife and homemaker who became "liberated." Thirteen years ago, the Gordons and their children left Wisconsin and moved to Central Florida. Her husband, Don drove down first with "only a coffee

table in his car," while Mrs. Gordon rode on a Greyhound bus with the six children. "It was not a fair bargain," she recalled. In those days she was a high school graduate, selftaught artist, and a mother of six who did not even have a driver's license. Getting out of the house meant

walking from the orange grove to the convenience store in Lake Mary. Attempts to learn to drive were not successful and the driving instructor she hired turned out to be "worse than my husband." Later, her 16-year-old daughter was able to succeed where others had failed and Mrs.

waited in the snow to register for classes. Others had difficulty registering during normal hours since they were trying to hold down a job as well. Each new student was teamed up with someone

familiar with the campus for a few days to help him find his way around and to help with questions. Mrs. Gordon returned home with her degree and started teaching art in one of the county's middle schools, but the 1971-72 school year was a disaster, she said. Her husband was laid off from work, and later that year he had to have open heart surgery.

"My husband was not exactly thrilled with me going o school," she said, "but it was different when he was laid off. He became totally bored cleaning the sink and the house and he saw the value of an educated and trained woman."

Stressful situations like that causes many marriages to break up. "Marriage is not a 50-50 proposition," Mrs. Gordon said. "You can't say, 'You wash the dishes this week and I'll sweep the floor.' You must remain flexible. What is fair? I don't know. You have to live with the hassles. Marriage is not perfect. It's not 50-50. You must be prepared to change or the deal is off ... there is a need for growth in all people, men and women ... one partner changes and the other one doesn't, or can't accept the change, or refuses to handle it, and the relationship breaks." After that year Mrs. Gordon left her job teaching art

since she and the administrators disagreed on priorities and the amount of money they were willing to spend on art education. "Creative thinking," she feels, "is just as important as logical thinking ... it takes logical and creative ability together, to make a total

The woman who had doubts about entering college, the woman who thought she might be "too dumb to get a bachelor's degree," went on to get her master's and

her doctorate. In 1974 she joined the staff at SCC. While she admits women's rights have improved over the years, there is still the feeling that it is a man's world. She recalls after having three daughters they had a son. It was as if having girls was not quite good enough. Many of their friends congratulated them for having a son at last. And today, she said, most ouples say they would prefer to have a son first and

Even with the vast number of women in today's work force, 80 percent are in what Mrs. Gordon calls pink collar jobs. Low paying jobs that men would not take.

On a percentage basis, women occupy a much smaller number of management positions than men.

Though Mrs. Gordon has fought, and continues to fight, for the rights of women, she is not a spearwaving Amazon doing battle against men. She is a small woman but one who possesses a lot of energy, a sharp mind, and a ready sense of humor.

On the wall of her office at SCC is a picture of a bird in flight. In red paint its legend appears to have been changed from a masculine to the feminine and reads: "A bird carsoar because ahe takes herself lightly."
