The DeBarry Public Affairs Committee at its monthly meeting Saturday agreed on policies on incorporation for DeBarry. The Committee will work with the DeBarry business group in studies and discussion of incorporation in relation to what will best serve the interest of the entire community. It and when incorporation is needed all of DeBarry should be included. In order that all DeBarry citizens can be informed and have a basis for decision the PAC will encourage bringing knowledgeable people to speak at community meetings on legal aspects, tax angles, costs, advantages and disadvantages of incorporation. Committee chairman Earl Merrill emphasized that the PAC is not supporting or taking a position on incorporation for DeBarry at this point. Whether incorporation is right for DeBarry must wait until we learn how DeBarry's needs will be served under the new County government and until the citizens can decide on the basis of all the facts involved. A conference of three PAC members with Rep. James Swenny was reported on. Rep. Swenny and State Sen. Welborne Daniels had assured that their position would be in keeping with the wishes of DeBarry citizens.



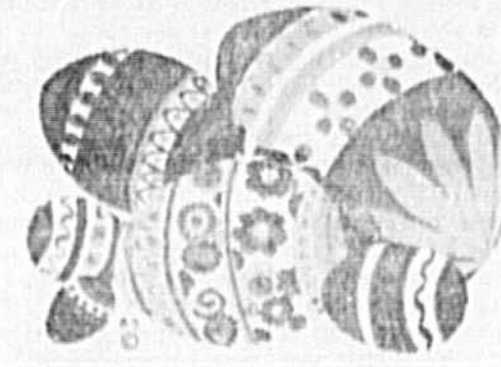

Smokeless Proposal Is Made

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A proposal that airlines, trains and buses be required to provide non-smoking passengers with an area protected from tobacco fumes of smoking passengers has been endorsed by the U.S. surgeon general. Dr. Jesse L. Steinfeld said in a letter made public Monday by Rep. W. C. Young, R-Tx, that the Public Health Service now is "developing an assessment" of the effects of other peoples' smoking on nonsmokers. Steinfeld said he "strongly" that we should seek to accomplish the protection of nonsmokers through legislation.

Uncleared Drugs To Be Reviewed

MEAD WASHINGTON (UPI) — Against industry opposition, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is seeking to review thousands of drugs that were placed on the market without any government clearance. Contrary to the general impression that all medicines are checked by the government for safety and effectiveness, the FDA acknowledged it is not aware of all drugs now being marketed and cannot knowingly estimate their number. "Drug manufacturers have flouted the law," Dr. Henry E. Simmons, director of the FDA bureau of drugs, told UPI in an interview. "Thousands of drugs are out there without NDAs." NDA stands for New Drug Application, the procedure supposedly followed in gaining FDA clearance for introduction of a new drug or continued use of an older one for which proof of effectiveness is required under a 1962 law. Prior to 1962, proof of safety was required but not of effectiveness. Many drugs, of course, are submitted to FDA for pre-marketing clearance. But Simmons said manufacturers frequently skip the process when the drug is identical to, or similar to, an existing product, or when a Drug's ingredients have been cleared individually in the past.

This trend has alarmed FDA scientists, Simmons said, because of medical studies showing that even a slight change in a drug's formula or manufacturing process sometimes alters its effect on patients. ## Health Departments Alerted To Poisons

By STAN BENJAMIN Associated Press Writer WASHINGTON (AP) — State health departments are being alerted to an Interior Department report showing unacceptable levels of poisonous metals in more than 50 public water sources. Interior released Tuesday results of a nationwide spot check showing dangerously high levels of arsenic or cadmium in 12 waterways used to supply public water systems. These substances are not removed by ordinary water treatment. The department's Geological Survey, which performed the water sampling last fall, reported undesirable arsenic concentrations in more than 40 other public water sources. Equally high levels of these and other toxic metals—lead, mercury and zinc—were found in more than a hundred water samples taken downstream from municipal-industrial complexes, and even in a few samples from areas remote from human activity. The survey said high levels of these metals were not widespread although the data "indicate potential problems in a few areas." Public water sources were reported to contain unsafe levels of arsenic or cadmium at 12 locations in North Carolina, Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Louisiana, Missouri and Pennsylvania.

## Pollution Battle Continues
