

PLAINS, Ga. - Jimmy Carter is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent. Lordy, how reverent. He is a farmer, a scientist, a sailor, a nuclear

physicist, a businessman, a writer and a former governor. His wife says she loves him so much even his picture turns her on. His children say he's the best daddy in the cosmos. And his neighbors believe he can spin gold from straw. Why, then have half the reporters in the Western World come here to where the kudzu meets the honeysuckle, where the water runs west to the Chattahoochee, to search for bad bones from the man's past?

Watergate, maybe. Everyone alive is suspect these days. But more than this, the hunt for Carter's flaw can only be explained by the experience of contact with the man. Those who have followed him on his remarkable trek to the Democratic nomination, and who are not on his payroll or wearing his political sticker, are often

After some perfunctory remarks about the goodness of God, Carter seized a personal opportunity, "How many of you have mothers and fathers and grandmothers and grandfathers and neighbors and friends?" He asked the squirming group. "Well, if you ask all those people to vote for me," smile, "I could get elected," big smile, "and if I get elected you can

come see me in the White House!" At best it was political low ball. Sunday school is dull enough for the tots without it turning into a stump revival. Besides, if he is elected, and the kids did come to the White House, they would stand in line, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2, and be watched by the sentries like everyone else. Fred Harris, the only other candidate to issue White House invitations during the primaries, said in the end: "I don't know what

I'd have done if I'd won and they all came." Admittedly, overanxiousness is hardly a political flaw. And as Eric Hoffer says it: "Charlatanism to some degree is indispensable in a leader." And yet many wonder. Even the candidate's sister-in-law, Sybil Carter, says: "Jimmy is so determined I'm a little afraid of

Schools' Father-Son Events **Outlawed By Officials**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Federal officials have decided that public schools may no longer sponsor father-son or mother-daughter events because they violate new rules against sex discrimination.

That's the word quietly passed to school administrators in Scottsdale, Ariz., last week, more than five months after the officials asked if such activities were still lawful under regulations approved by President Ford last

In a letter cleared through Washington channels, John E. Palomina of the San Francisco regional Office for Civil Rights wrote to the officials telling them that "functions such as father-son or mother-daughter breakfasts would be subjecting students to separate treatment and would not be permitted."

And that decision applies, said a spokesman at Washington headquarters, even if the school offers separate events with equal facilities for both sexes

Two Escapees Captured

BUFFALO, N.Y. (AP) - Two convicts who walked away from a minimum security prison in North Carolina have been apprehended by Buffalo police after a sevenweek spree that included a trip to Florida. Brian Epply, 39, and Billy Capel, 37, both of Charlotte, N.C. were held as fugitives and were to be arraigned today, police said.

They were captured Monday after police received a tip from Capel's niece that the fugitives might be here and might visit her apartment.

Weekend Traffic Toll: 460

CHICAGO (AP) - Traffic deaths on the nation's highways during the Bicentennial weekend totaled 460. falling short of the prediction by the National Safety

The safety council, noting a greater tendency by drivers to break the 55-mile-per-hour speed limit, had forecast that as many as 630 persons would die during the four-day weekend that began at 6 p.m. Friday and ended at mid-

night Monday in each time zone. The safety council said more automobiles than usual would be on the highways for 200th birthday of the nation. It estimated that motorists would travel 17.3 billion miles

during the four days, compared with 16 billion miles last

Airliner Lands,

Hijacker Surrenders

PALMA DE MAJORCA, Balearic Islands (AP) - A Libyan airliner hijacked on a flight within Libya today landed here with 86 persons aboard and the hijacker surrendered, airport sources said.

The hijacker, identified only as a man opposed to the Libyan regime of Col. Mommar Khadafy, gave up to airport police and turned over two toy pistols and two knives to the chief of the airport, the sources said. They said nobody was injured and the passengers were being looked after by airport authorities.

Raid May Boost Bitterness

NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) - The Israeli commando raid Sunday on Uganda's Entebbe Airport is expected to intensify the bitterness between neighboring Uganda and

Ugandan President Idi Amin accused Kenya of complicity in the rescue of Israelis held hostage by Palestinian and German hijackers. Kenya denied the charge. But the three Israeli planes did stop at Nairobi airport after the rescue, for treatment of the wounded. And there were reports that at least one of the planes landed here en route o Uganda and that advance Israeli agents were operating

Amin is bound to step up his war of words against Kenya, informed sources say.

Hero's Funeral Scheduled

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) - Israel gives a hero's funeral today to American-born Lt. Col. Yonatan Netanyahu, the only Israeli commando killed in the rescue of more than 100 hostages held by Palestinian terrorists at Uganda's Entebbe Airport.

Two of the three Israeli civilians killed in the gun battle aturday night were buried Monday with military honors. Speaking at one of the funerals, Israel's chief military haplain, Brig. Mordechai Piron, said the 2,400-mile, three-plane commando raid "was a magnificent, courageous operation, but it is the fate of this nation that every joy and delight be mixed with pain and mourning."





Specter Haunts South Africa

The eruption of rioting in South Africa and the inevitable bloodshed in the police response is a blow both to the government of Prime Minister John Vorster and to the hope that solutions short of violence can be found to the clash of white and black interests in Africa.

The impression, of course, is that Mr. Vorster is not going far enough fast enough to convince the black majority in his country that the racial separation policies of apartheid are one day going to end. The extent that rioting reflects a mass sentiment is always questionable, but the speed with which the disturbance at a school in Soweto spread to other areas leaves little doubt that the anti-government feeling among South African blacks is widespread and close to the surface.

There has been hope that Mr. Vorster was charting a course in domestic and foreign policy that would prevent such explosions. His support of majority rule in Rhodesia and Namibia, and his plan for self-government in black "homelands" within South Africa, could be taken as the signal of a leap forward in the white approach to black

The upraised fist seen in these riots symbolizes black power, but the power of numbers which 20 million black and colored South Africans would wield over four million whites under a system of majority rule does not necessarily spell political justice. The white Afrikaners have roots in South Africa going back to the 17th Century, while much of the black population is the result of more recent immigration from the north.


Puzzling Policy

Ever since the U.S. Navy announced plans to upgrade its facility on the island of Diego Garcia, Prime Minister Indira Gandhi has been calling for some kind of "demilitarization" of the Indian Ocean. Americans have been quick to point out that it is the increasing operations of the new Soviet navy east of Suez that underscores the need to give our Navy a better operating capability in those waters. If the Indian Ocean were to come under dominance of the Russians it would pose a threat to international sea traffic, especially oil tankers from the Persian

We would have thought that the Soviet-Cuban adventure in Angola and the obvious Russian interest in gaining a toehold in Southern Africa might change Mrs. Gandhi's perspective. Quite the contrary. Still ignoring the outline of an emerging Soviet strategy, she has just climaxed her visit to Moscow with a joint communique decrying the establishment of "foreign military bases" in the Indian Ocean, an obvious reference to our plans for Diego Garcia.

Apparently the agreements which have opened Indian ports to Soviet warships do not constitute a "foreign" influence in Mrs. Gandhi's book. Nor the Soviet presence in Somalia and Madagascar on the east coast of Africa. Nor the port facilities used by the Russian navy at Singapore. If Mrs. Gandhi regards the Soviet flag as a native symbol in the Indian Ocean, and the U.S. flag as a foreign intrusion, the gap of understanding between our county and country and hers is greater than we

It's nice to know a democracy has survived for 200 years. Although some say no one should criticize this country, I disagree. There's nothing wrong with criticism, whether it's directed toward a nation or toward one person. How can a nation improve itself if no one criticizes its efforts?

Let the criticism fly. We'll all be better for it. As a nation, America has survived 200 years. And a lot of those years were spent weathering some pretty

Criticism just made America stronger. It is the nation that cannot tolerate criticism that is in danger of collapse. Dictatorships tolerate no criticism. In Russian and in other Communist countries, dissent is stifled. Dissent is forced underground. It emerges in

some instances in the form of revolutions. revolutions that help no one and oftentimes end up doing harm to a lot of citizens and to a nation's As we enter the third 100 years, we can strive to

Dishonesty No Secret

Veto Override Could Bring Drop In Jobless Rate Here

A \$4-billion federal job-creating bill could lower Seminole County's unemployment rate - if Democrats in Congress can put together enough votes to override President Gerald Ford's veto of the public works bill.

Shelley Cox, county grant coordinator, said she is closely monitoring the bill's progress in Washington because she plans to submit proposals which would put Seminole residents to work on public works projects. The federal jobs bill is designed to create or preserve 400,000

jobs across the nation. Ford vetoed the bill Tuesday, saying it was inflationary, but the veto is drawing heavy opposition from congressional Democrats. The bill passed both the House and Senate with more and sewer lines, streets and other projects. than enough votes to override the President's rejection, and

Seventy per cent of the funds will be available to areas where unemployment exceeds the national average. To be eligible, a project must be capable of being un-

derway within 90 days of approval. The grant program is aimed toward reducing unemployment in the hard-pressed construction industry, by financing local facilities such as municipal offices, courthouses, libraries, water

The complaint protested the school board's adoption of a calendar for the 1976-77 school year before contract talks between the board and the SEA began. "Our main objective (in filing the complaint) was to have the calendar ruled a negotiable item," said SEA President Bill Moore. "We believe the board has now done

The school board originally maintained that setting the calendar was an administrative prerogative, not a negotiable item. Before the 1975-76 school year, the board had adopted the calendar prior to the start of negotiations. But it had bargained holidays, which are considered to be

working conditions and a negotiable item. The problem was compounded this year when three non-instructional bargaining units were formed. The board said that it could not bargain the calendar with four separate organizations. However, the non-instructional groups waived their right to bargain the calendar, and the board's negotiating team proceeded to discuss holidays

with the teacher's group. Although talks on the calendar are tabled at present, Moore said the SEA was showing good faith by withdrawing its unfair labor practice complaint.

Reagan Criticizes Foes In Telecast

Aiming beyond his battle for the Republican party's presidential nomination, Ronald Reagan has asked the nation to vote for "values and not for labels next November." Jimmy Carter, meanwhile, has won the endorsement of Democrats at the National Governors Conference.

Reagan, who is slightly behind President Ford in delegates in heir race for the GOP nomination, made a pitch for the votes of Democrats in the general election in a speech televised nationwide Tuesday night. He criticized Carter, the all-but-certain Democratic nominee,

saying, "There are those whose approach to government combines soothing rhetoric, pleasant smiles and reorganization Reagan did not name the Democratic contender, but aides confirmed that the former Georgia governor was his target.

Carter was the beneficiary of an impressive fence-mending

operation engineered by party chairman Robert Strauss at the governors' conference in Hershey, Pa. The presidential candidate won an almost-unanimous endorsement from Democrats there - including some old adversaries - then promised to give them influence in a Carter

Carter also disclosed that Sen. Walter F. Mondale of Minnesota is on his list of potential running mates. He said he will meet with Mondale on Thursday, presumably at Carter's home in Plains, Ga. He has already met with Sen. Edmund S. Muskie of Maine. House Republican leader John Rhodes said, meantime, he would like to see Reagan run for vice president under Ford. He said it would be the "best way, by far, to unite the party." Rhodes said he believes Ford will win the presidential nomination, but he added, "I don't quite know why." He predicted that BICENTENNIA! fewer then 10 delegate votes would separate Ford and Reagan at

the Republican convention in August. Ford now has 1,004 delegates to Reagan's 976, according to an Associated Press survey.
