#### U.S. Security Chief Meets With Iran's Prime Minister

ALGIERS, Algeria (UPI) — In a bid to improve relations with Iran, national security adviser Zbigniew Brzezinski met with Iranian Prime Minister Mehdi Bazargan, the first encounter between high-ranking U.S. and Iranian officials since Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini took power in February, diplomatic sources said today.

The meeting took place Thursday, the sources said. Both Brezezinski and Bazargan are in Algiers for ceremonies marking the 25th anniversary of Algeria's

#### Iranian Ambush Kills 15

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - Kurdish insurgents have killed at least 15 Iranian army soldiers and wounded 50 others in an ambush near the town of Sardasht on the Iran-Iraq border, official sources said today. In west Iran, unidentified gunmen Thursday shot and killed Ayatollah Syed Mohammed Qazi Tabatabai, chief religious leader of Tabriz, the state radio reported.

#### 2 Dead in Lebanese Clash

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) — One of the Islamic world's most joyous holidays was rocked today by bloody clashes among Lebanon's rival political parties and armies that killed at least two people and wounded 12. Fighting raged for a second day from Beirut's shellpocked port to the ruins of the commercial district and from the southern suburbs to the mountains of Sennin as gunmen ignored the Moslem sacrificial feast of Al Adha.

#### Bolivia In State Of Siege

LA PAZ, Bolivia (UPI) — Bolivia's day-old military government dissolved the congress and declared a "stage of slege" early today, suspending the constitutional rights of the 5 million people of the South American nation. Six people were reported killed in demonstrations Thursday against the bloodless coup that ousted the 83day-old civilian government of President Walter Guevara

## School Board Seeks Option On Raising Taxes

Herald Staff Writer The school board wants the option of raising taxes above the limitation set by state law, but legislators did not give much encouragement Thursday that they will get what they want. School Superintendent William P. Layer and board member Pat Telson submitted a legislative package to the Seminole County legislative Delegation Thursday evening.

Included in the package was a request that a new state law be passed to allow school boards to levy up to \$2 per \$1,000 assessed aluation over and above the \$6.75 limit set by law. Mrs. Telson said this is needed especially by the 14 high growth rate counties in the state including Seminole. She said the money would be used exclusively for capital improvements such as new school construction. The option should not require a referendum of the people

Other items in the legislative package for 1980 included:

-Re-examination of the state funding for middle schools. The law provides for contracting with teachers for only five periods daily, while the schools have six daily periods in middle schools. -Changing the method whereby public education bond

### Windfall Guns Are Over-Loaded

The third-quarter earnings reports from the oil industry are a political windfall for President Carter and others urging Congress to impose a new tax on oil company profits. The headlines are peloading the guns in a shooting gallery in which Big Oil is the sitting duck.

So the House has backed away from its earlier

yote for immediate decontrol of gasoline prices, and the Senate Finance Committee has given its final blessing to a windfall profits tax which would extract \$142 billion from the oil industry over the next decade.

The trouble is, where the big multinational oil companies are concerned, most of the spectacular profits now being reported are coming from over-seas operations. When Mr. Carter proposed his windfall profits tax last spring, the main target was the earnings to be realized from the phasing out of price controls on oil produced in the United States, a factor not yet having a major impact on profits. Even some members of Congress who go along with the windfall tax on domestic profits are leery of trying to impose it on profits derived abroad. The 1979 increases apparently can be traced to price hikes dictated by the OPEC cartel, to fluctuations on the international currency market and to events such as the change in the British tax law which produced a \$200-million windfall for Exxon alone.

But in Mr. Carter's rhetorical war against Big Oil such profits are "unearned" and "unfair to the American people" and thus a goodly share of them should be taxed away for public benefit. The fact is that 50 to 60 cents of every new dollar the oil companies take in is already being siphoned off to the government in various taxes. In today's political climate an oil executive who


would propose spending any of these profits to sequire department stores or a circus would be locked in a closet. The only investment oil companies can make without a public outery is in energy exploration and production, if not oil and gas then alternate fuels. What this year's profits should create then, is a windfall of exploratory wells, refineries, pilot plants for new fuel processes.

The companies should have no trouble spending the money. The cost of drilling oil wells has risen from \$17.56 per foot in 1969 to \$48 per foot today. Generally, nine out of 10 exploratory wells are dry holes. Offshore wells, currently the focus of exploration, are far more costly than those drilled on dry land. Exxon recently spent \$75 million drilling three dry holes off New Jersey. Standard of California spends between \$100 million and \$150 million each for its offshore platforms, and \$1 million a mile for underwater pipelines to bring oil

In 1977, according to a Chase-Manhattan Bank study, the 27 leading oil companies had a net income of \$14.4 billion. In the same year they put \$28 billion into exploratory and production wells, refineries, pipelines and other energy facilities. They have been borrowing heavily to make these investments, nearly tripling their long-term debt in

"All of this makes us wonder where the Carter administration sees the "excess" profits it wants to tax. What is easier to see is the bonanza in taxes which the government is already due to collect from this year's oil company earnings and those projected for the future as oil prices rise.

The staff of the Senate Finance Committee has estimated that without a windfall profits tax the government will collect \$173.5 billion in adfinance the entet grandices energy program Mr. Carter envisions — grants for mass transit, government-sponsored synthetic fuel plants and aid to the needy to pay for heating all. 





Q. Why do seeds that I plant in my vegetable garden often fail to come A. Unless you saved your own seed or kept seed from

Fungus diseases in the soil may be rotting the seeds before they sprout or the soil may be too wet or dry for good germination. Also be sure you are not planting the seeds too deeply. The Health Systems Agency (HSA) is the federally funded agency responsible for the planning of health services, facilities and manpower for the residents of the four counties.

The Health Systems Plan calls for cooperation among hospitals or conversion of unused beds, particularly in the areas of obstetrics and pediatrics, to use as general medical-surgical beds or

Services, CAT Scanners, Megavoltage Radiation Therapy, Obstetrical Services, Services to Migrant and Seasonal Farm Workers, End Stage Renal Disease, Primary Care, Immunizable

Diseases, Nutrition, and Psychiatric Bed Needs. The Health Systems Plan is reviewed and revisions recommended annually by the members of the Regional Plan Development Committee, Sub-Area Councils, and the Regional Board of Directors, working closely with interested health care provider and consumer groups. Many problems are addressed for the purpose of restraining increasing health costs.

Many of the topics chosen for revision this year were selected because of their direct relation to national guidelines for health planning and their applicability to this region Complete copies of the proposed revisions are available for public inspection locally at the county commission office in the
