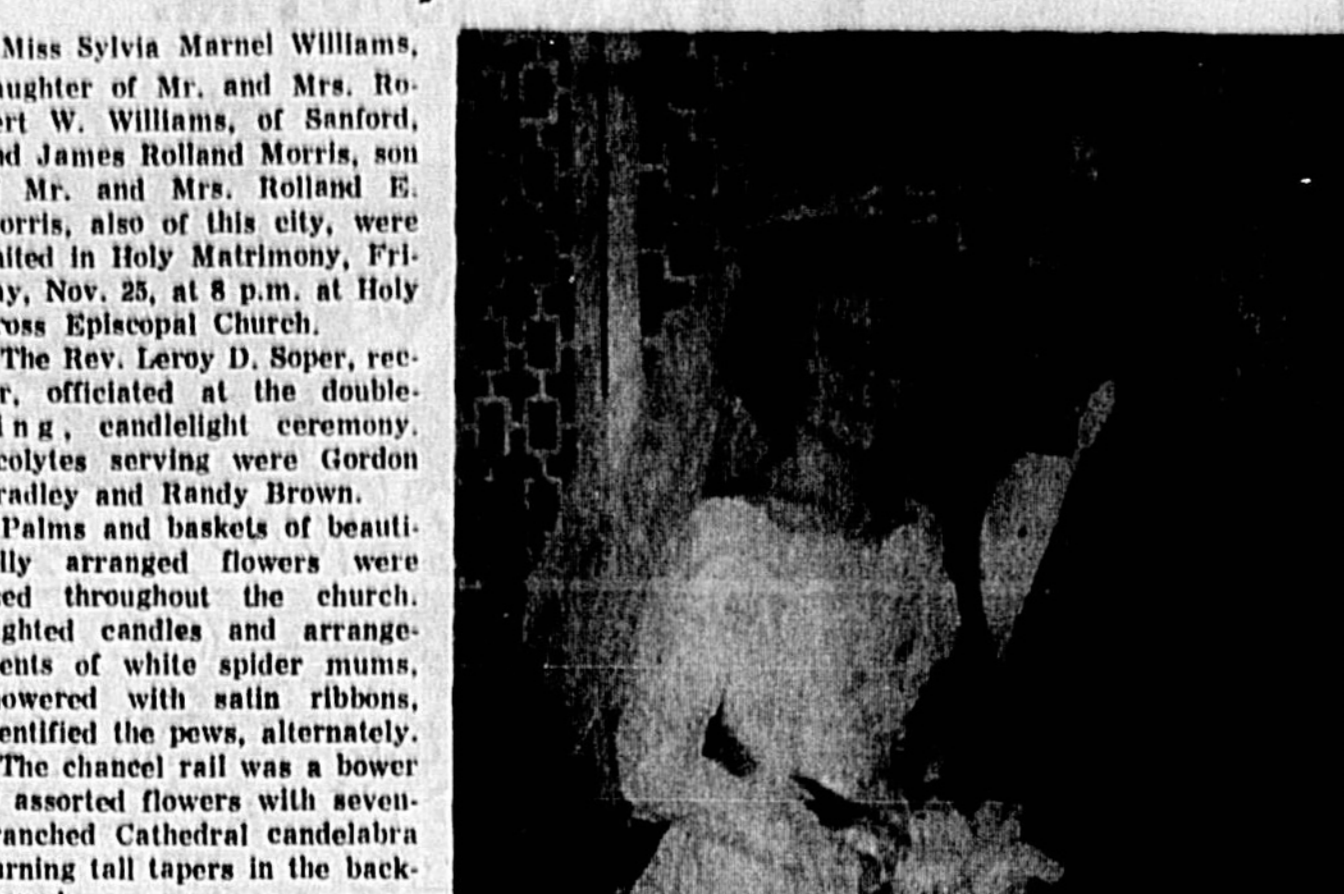

Young Tykes High On Santa's List Of Gifts

News Item: North Pole. Christmas, 1966 — S. Claus, the world's most experienced Christmas packer, has some words of advice for the mothers of the youngest tykes on his list.

In an exclusive interview, Santa, as he is affectionately known here, said "Getting to Grandma's is a great deal easier today than it was in the days when everyone used a sleigh. In those days, Mama had to pack just as much for her baby as she did for the rest of the family combined."

A large supply of baby clothing, diapers and all that formula making and hotting equipment added up to almost a single-tail on itself. But Santa added, modern disposable products and up-to-date equipment have greatly reduced the packing on baby problem.

Santa's first suggestion is to eliminate everything you really don't need, and to take only a few days' supply of any items that can be purchased when you arrive.

For example, you may find that a car bed will serve nicely for both baby and traveling to baby en route. And unless you plan many trips out-of-doors in the blustery weather, the stroller is best left behind.

Other equipment that you can certainly do without is all the paraphernalia needed for mixing and sterilizing baby formula. With such a mother's helper, the disposable glass bottle pre-filled with formula, all you have to do at feeding time is twist off the cap and add a standard nipple and nipple collar. And because the unit needs no refrigeration, you won't have to warm it up.

Don't bother packing a large supply of diapers and baby clothes, either. Disposable diapers — available anywhere along the route — will solve that problem, and you can always put Grandma's laundry equipment into action to gift up the rest of baby's wear.

Santa also suggests that if you share a suitcase with baby, put his things on top. You'll find you have enough room to bring back all the gifts collected from Santa and Grandma. "Just one last suggestion," Santa said in closing. "Don't let Grandma leave me any snacks. I'm getting too well packed myself."

Christmas Tips For Teenagers

If your teen's allowance won't stretch enough to cover the gifts she wants to give for Christmas suggest she make some. Out of a clay concoction of baking soda, corn starch and water, plus a little imagination, she can turn out mad Mexican jewelry, wall plaques, jewelry boxes or what not appropriate for all the family and friends. Her monetary outlay will be less than a dollar — the cost of a clear shellac, a good strong glue, both available in the hardware store, ear-ring and pin backers, which are carried by most Five and Tens. The rest of the makings are listed in the house.

First thing to do is make the clay. Mix together well, in a soup-pan, 2 cups baking soda and 1 cup corn starch. Stir in 1 1/4 cups water. Mixture will be very stiff. Cook over medium heat stirring constantly for 10 minutes with cooking, and then in about 4 minutes suddenly thickens. Remove from heat immediately. Transfer hot clay to a plate cover with a damp cloth and let cool. Knead as you would dough and start modeling.

To make beads, model them into any shape, insert them on large-size, straightened — out paper clips... one clip for every three or four beads. The clip tunnel the holes for threading and make it easier to paint and shellac the beads later. Placed on a wire rack in a warm 350-degree (turned-off) oven, beads dry and harden in a half hour at which time they can be painted with solid colors with water color paints. One or two coats of shellac administered by dunking skewered beads directly into shellac bottle, gives them a glossy professional look. When beads are dry thread on a double strand of dental floss or good stout thread.

Bracelets and rings are even easier to make. Clay is rolled into a long cylinder, flattened, and the two ends pinched together. Fingers dipped in water help smooth out the connections. The same painting and shellacking procedures apply.

For plaques you'll need panels of wood picked up at the lumber yard on wooden plates available at hobby stores. For jewelry boxes, old wooden cigar boxes are perfect. These get painted before you add your modeled, painted and shellacked motifs which can be flowers, birds, fruit or whatnot. Be generous with the glue when you mount them.

The letters were turned over to the attorney and engineer for study.

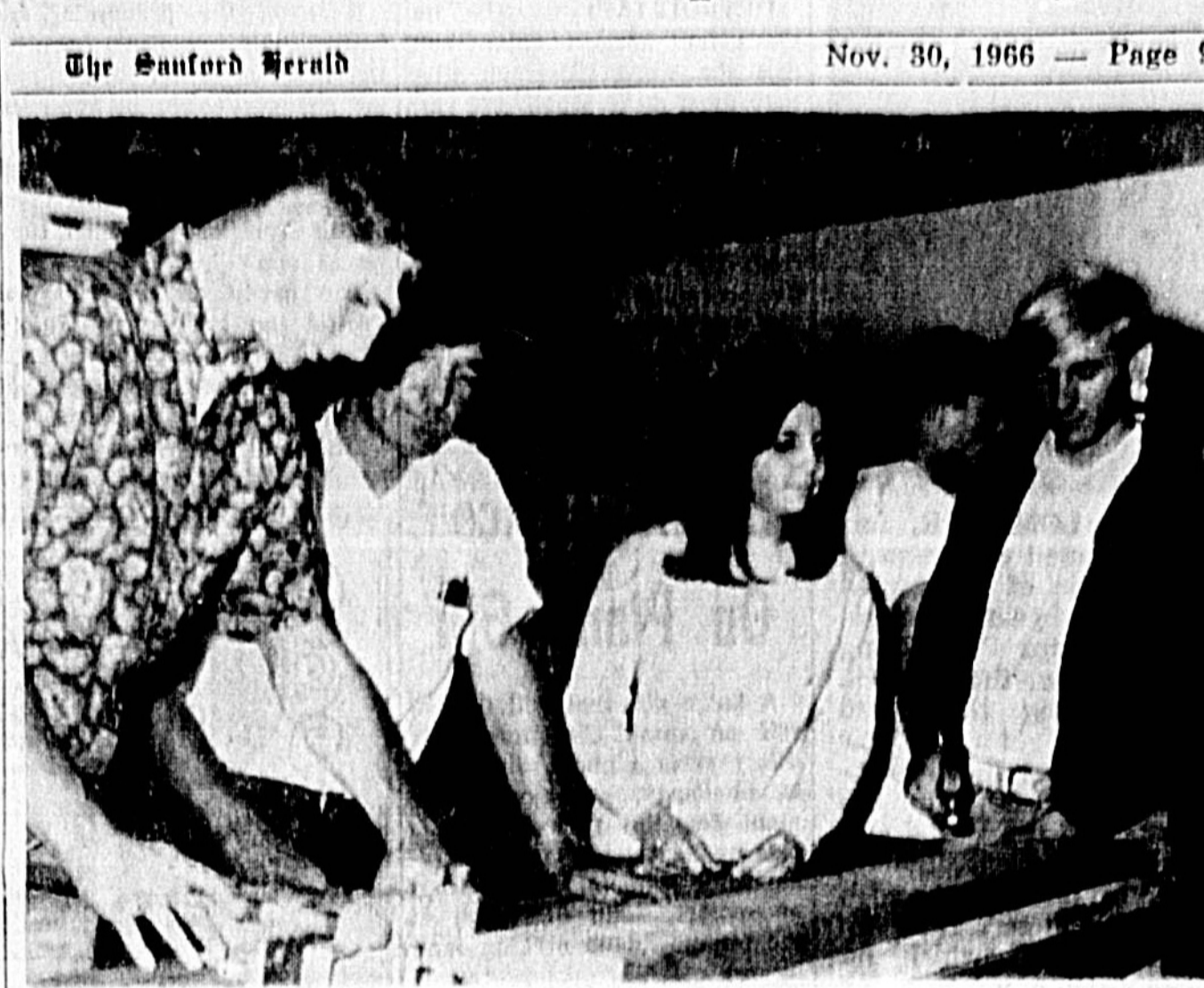
The attorney also read a letter from the Florida Dept. of Agriculture from excess fees with expenditure to total \$554.40.

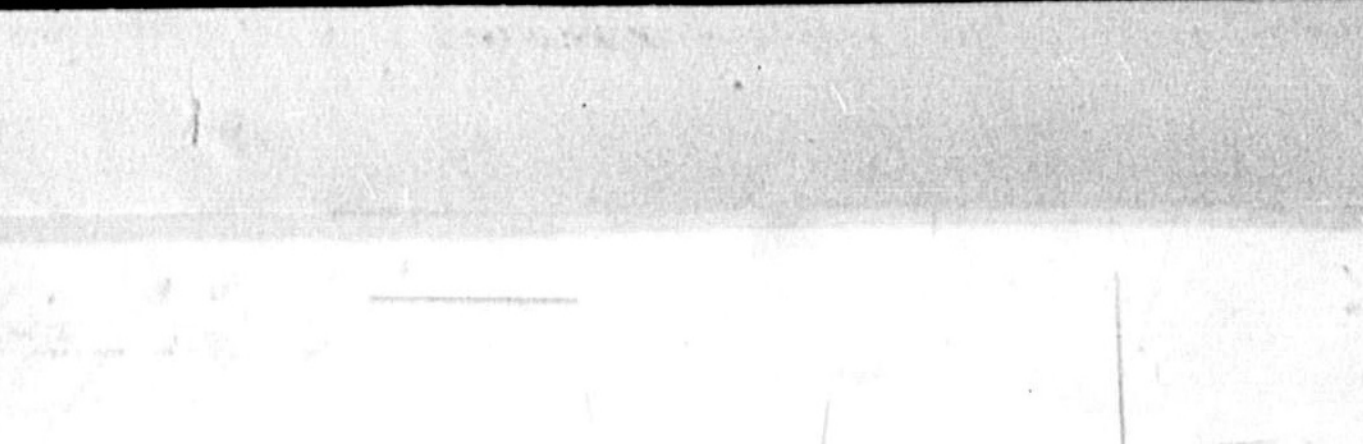

Viet Delta 'Ugly' To U.S. Planners

By PETER ARNETT SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — South Viet Nam's Mekong River delta looks like an Oriental picture postcard land. But to U.S. military planners, the lush delta is the ugliest part of Viet Nam, a place to be avoided unless there is no other choice.

There is no other choice now. The beautiful delta might well be the ugliest chapter of the Viet Nam war is written for the United States.

The problem in the Mekong Delta is that there are too many people, an estimated 7 million clustered along the myriad estuaries of the Mekong River that break out like veins across the countryside.

An aggressive American military stance among these millions might label the U.S. forces a colonialist army, a tag avoided up to now because American forces have been deployed where there are fewer people and more room to fight the war.

Three Holiday Truces Seen In War

SARONG, South Viet Nam (AP) — Scattered small fighting flickered across South Viet Nam today as the seven allied nations announced they would observe short truces at Christmas and New Year's and over the Vietnamese New Year in February.

While the relative lull in ground fighting carried through a fourth day, Vietnamese troops reported freeing 14 Vietnamese civilians from a Viet Cong prison camp in the Mekong Delta.

Vietnamese headquarters said the Viet Cong murdered four other civilians in the camp and that one of the liberated prisoners died of wounds after being freed.

U.S. headquarters reported a mistaken artillery shelling by a unit of the U.S. 1st Infantry Division killed three Vietnamese civilians and wounded 19 more.

A spokesman said an artillery battery fired nine 105mm shells into the town of Tan Uyen, 20 miles northeast of Saigon early today. The spokesman said it was a "very regrettable accident" caused by an error in computing firing data.

The same town was accidentally bombed last July 1 by three U.S. Air Force planes whose bombs killed five Vietnamese civilians and wounded 43. Tan Uyen, a town of several thousand persons, is just north of the Bien Hoa air base.

In the air war today, high-flying B52 bombers made two raids on suspected North Viet namese troop concentrations 17 miles northwest and 24 miles southwest of the U.S. Army Special Forces camp at Plei Dier.

North Viet Nam, restricting American pilots to 50 bombing missions Tuesday against targets in the Hanoi and Dien Bien Phu areas and in the southern panhandle. They reported heavy damage to a radar site 30 miles northwest of Hanoi.

Enemy ground force knocked down a small American observation plane 91 miles northeast of Saigon Tuesday and two U.S. servicemen aboard were killed, U.S. headquarters reported.

President's assistant George Christian said at the Texas White House that President Johnson participated in the decision and was notified in advance of the announcement.

During short Christmas and New Year ceasefires last year, both sides accused the other of violations. The 1965 Christmas truce produced a 37-day pause in the bombing of North Viet Nam, a lull which U.S. military men say the North Vietnamese used to rush reinforcements south.

A lengthy cessation of raids against the north is not considered likely this year, Pentagon chiefs are known to be opposed to it unless North Viet Nam makes an equivalent move to de-escalate the war. Hanoi has given no such indication.

The truce periods announced by Saigon are from 7 a.m. Dec. 25 to 7 a.m. Dec. 30; for the same hours from 31 to Jan. 2, from 7 a.m. Feb. 8 to 7 a.m. Feb. 12.

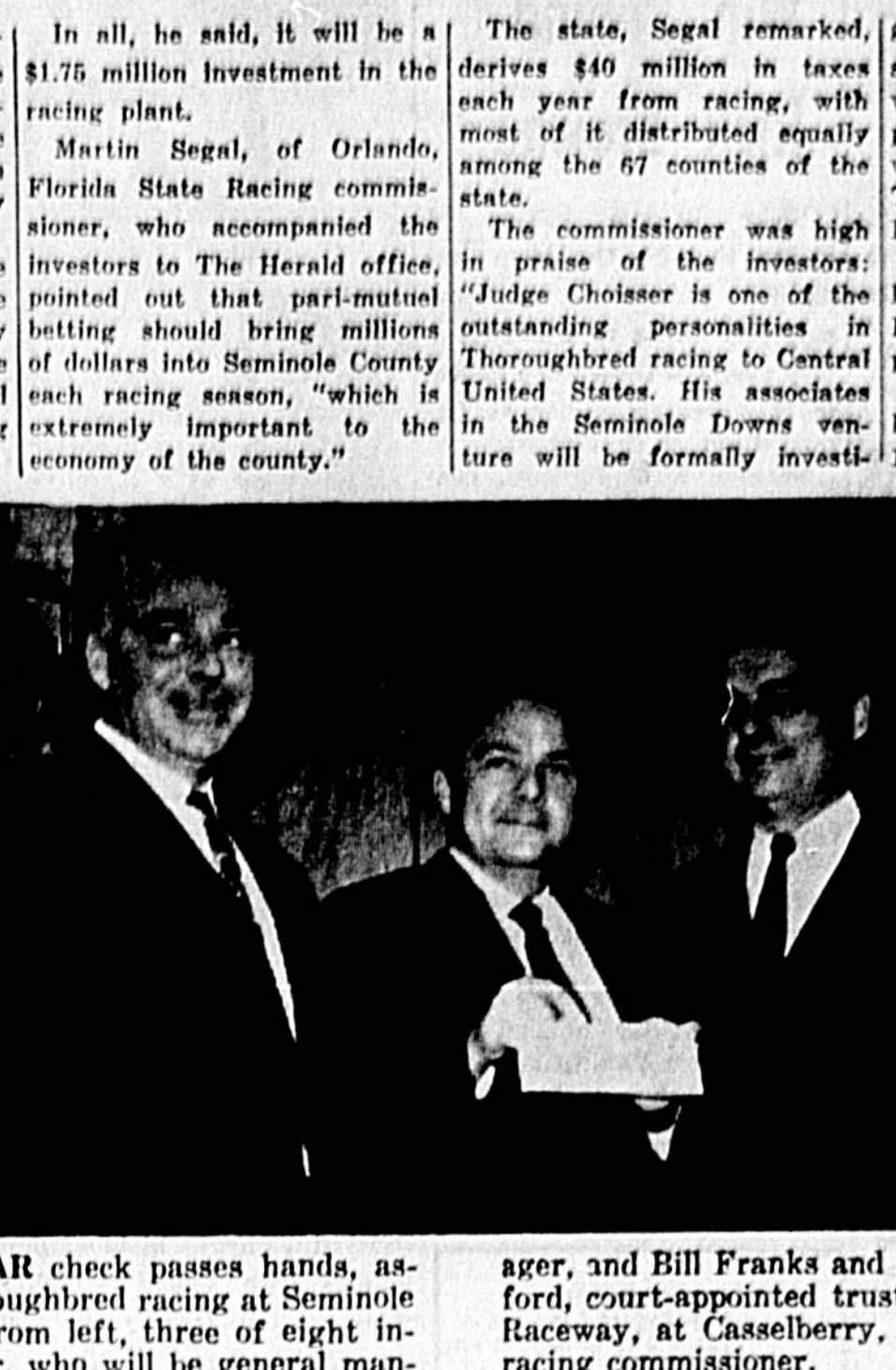
